

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 14TH, A.D.1921, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Lambert, Rieden, Wright.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

Petition of property owners on Layer Street and McKinney Place requesting that the names of these streets be changed to Woodlawn Avenue, was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements.

A petition of Mr Lowry, requesting permit to cut the curb at Romana and Dallas Streets for drive-in filling station, previously presented to the Commissioners, was referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police: Bexar Steam Laundry, for permit to install fuel oil tank. Feliciano Acosta, for special building permit.

A proposition from J.H.Covington, County Commissioner, relative to the topping of the Gonzales Road inside the City limits, was read and referred to City Engineer.

The City Purchasing Agent recommended that the bids previously received for supplying the City with 300 cords of wood; also for furnishing sheets and pillow cases for use at City jail, be rejected. The recommendation was adopted by the Commissioners.

The City Purchasing Agent recommended that the bid of the Peden Iron & Steel Co. to furnish the City with six scrapers and six fmesnos be accepted. Adopted.

Commissioner Lambert filed with the Commissioners written charges against John B. Banks, Market Master, and Mr Banks was thereupon suspended from his position as Market Master pending the hearing of the charges against him, which hearing was fixed for Thursday, November 17th, 1921, at 3 p.m.

Commissioner Wright made the following recommendations, which were adopted: Saratoga Cafe, for permit to erect electric sign, granted. Ramon Arratis, for permit to erect tent at Vine and Vargas Streets, granted. Fred V. Small, for special building permit, granted. For arc light, at intersection at Laurel and Atlanta Streets. Prudential Hotel, for permit to erect electric sign on roof, granted. V. Abren, for permit to erect tent, Flores and Lubbock Streets, granted.

The petition of Jose Mantecon for permit to erect a tent at San Jacinto and Guadalupe Streets was granted by the Commissioners.

Commissioner Rieden introduced the following resolutions, which were read and adopted:

Accepting the paving on Craig Place, from Belknap to San Pedro, and from San Pedro to North Flores Street, by the Uvalde Company.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City of San Antonio does hereby accept the paving constructed on Craig Place, as per contract with the Uvalde Company dated, between Belknap and San Pedro, Mar. 17, 1920, and between San Pedro and North Flores May 20, 1921, with no omissions, as per certificate of the City Engineer, dated Nov. 14, 1921, and filed with the Board of Commissioners on November 14, 1921.

Commissioner Rieden submitted tabulation of bids for paving made by the City Engineer on the following named streets, with the recommendation of the Engineer that all bids be rejected on account of excessive price. The recommendation of the Engineer was adopted by unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

- Lamar Street, from Austin Street to New Braunfels Avenue.
- East Crockett Street, from Alamo Plaza to Losoya Street.
- West Ashby Place, from N. Flores to Blanco Road.
- Dallas Street, from Brooklyn Ave. to Jones Avenue.

The following resolution was introduced by Commissioner Rieden, and read and adopted:
RESOLUTION.

Authorizing the City Clerk to receive new bids for the paving of Dallas Street and Lamar Street.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City Clerk be and he is hereby authorized to receive new bids for the paving of Dallas Street, from Brooklyn Avenue to Jones Avenue, and Lamar Street, from Pine Street to New Braunfels Avenue, subject to all the provisions of the "Improvement Ordinance" of the City with reference to the original bids, and shall conform to any changes made in said plans and specifications, of which bidders shall advise themselves. All paving to be laid on gravel or macadam foundation.

- 1/2"-1"-1.1/2" cold rolled Uvalde Rock Asphalt.
- 2" hot Uvalde Rock Asphalt.
- 1.1/2"-2" Bitulithic pavement, using trap rock or gravel.

The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Bids to be received in the office of the City Clerk until 4 P.M. November _____ 1921.
