AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO BORROW \$40,000.00 TO PAY CURRENT EXPENSES OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1947.

A letter from Mr. John Zeller resigning his position as manager of the Willow Springs Golf Course was read, and Mayor Callaghan suggested that inasmuch as Mr. Zeller had done such a good job he be asked to continue his services. A motion was made by Com. Davis, seconded by Com. Hein that Mr. Zeller be asked to reconsider his resignation and remain.

A petition filed by Raymond Edwards, Attorney for Ed Steves & Sons requesting annexation of Lincolnshire Addition was granted upon recommendation of the Commissioner of Fire and Police, and then referred to the City Attorney for necessary annexation ordinance to be drawn.

Bids for the following were opened and read and referred to the Purchasing Agent for tabulation: Delivery and storage of gasoline, supply of gasoline, to furnish sewer pipe and fittings, to furnish cement and brick, and to furnish paving material.
