

OCTOBER 17, 1946

Mayor Mauermann introduced the following ordinance, which was passed and approved by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein and Steffler; Nay, Anderson (absent).

APPRO. NO. 390

AN ORDINANCE (4160)

APPROPRIATING \$64.50 OUT OF 1945 GENERAL FUND, AUDITING DEPT., TO PAY BLUE & BLUE, PRINTERS, FOR 500 STATEMENTS OF BONDED INDEBTEDNESS AS OF MAY 31, 1946.

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Bids to furnish centrifugal pump and hose for Sewer Maintenance Dept. and combination wash register and adding machine for Riverside Golf Course were opened and publicly read and referred to the Purchasing Agent.

Bids for binding assessment sheets and tax receipts were opened and publicly read. Comm. Callaghan moved that the binding of tax receipts be divided among National Printing and Stationery Co., Standard Printing Co. and Clegg Co., and the binding of assessment sheets be divided among Paul Anderson Co., Alamo Printing Co. and Maverick-Clarke Litho Co. After a second by Comm. Hein, the motion was carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein and Steffler; Nay, Anderson (absent), and the ordinances ordered drawn.

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Pursuant to motion duly made and carried, the meeting was recessed until 11:00 o'clock, A.M., on Friday, October 18, 1946, for the consideration of the bids for the purchase of the bonds.

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PURSUANT TO THE RECESS of the meeting of October 17, the Council reconvened in the Council Chamber on October 18 for the following meeting:

San Antonio, Texas

October 18, 1946

The Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, Texas, met in recessed regular session at the regular meeting place of the board in the City Hall in the City of San Antonio at 11:00 o'clock, A.M., on Friday, October 18, 1946. Call of the roll showed the following results:

PRESENT: Mayor Mauermann and Commissioners Hein, Steffler and Anderson; Absent: Callaghan. There were also present Frank W. Brady, City Clerk, and T. D. Cobbs, City Attorney.

After the meeting had been duly called to order, and the roll called with the above result, the Mayor asked the City Clerk to present to the Commissioners the tabulation which had been made of the bids received for the purchase of \$5,700,000 bonds of the City. The tabulation was then presented to the Commissioners and after due consideration it was determined that the highest bid was the bid of Phelps, Fenn & Co. and Rauscher, Pierce & Company and Associates, offering to pay for said bonds par and accrued interest to the date of delivery, said bonds to bear the rates of interest specified in the ordinance hereinafter set out.

Thereupon the following ordinance, accepting the proposal of the high bidder, was introduced in writing by Mayor Mauermann and was read in full.

ACCEPTING THE PROPOSAL OF PHELPS, FENN & COMPANY AND RAUSCHER, PIERCE & COMPANY AND ASSOCIATES, TO PURCHASE \$5,700,000.00 CITY OF SAN ANTONIO PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT BONDS.

It was thereupon moved by Commissioner Anderson and seconded by Commissioner Hein that the ordinance as read be adopted, and after due discussion the motion was voted upon and carried by the following vote: Ayes, Mauermann, Hein, Steffler and Anderson; Nay, Callaghan (absent).

The ordinance was thereupon declared adopted, was approved and signed in open meeting by the Mayor and was ordered recorded. The ordinance is recorded in Ordinance Book "O", Pages 293 and 294.

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Former Mayor Maury Maverick, a visitor in the city, was a guest of the Council and remained as a spectator throughout the meeting.

APPROPRIATING \$736.50 OUT OF PARK REVENUE BOND 1945 FUND FOR PAYROLL.

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Mr. J. L. Dickson, State Highway Engineer in charge of the Inter-Regional Highway, gave a complete and detailed outline to the Council of the Inter-Regional Highway project, with the aid of numerous maps and drawings posted around the Council Chamber. In reply to a question from Comm. Anderson, he estimated the "harassing proceedings" (quotes of Comm.

Anderson) of the bond opponents had caused an added burden to the City of at least \$500,000 just on the immediate portion of the project.

Mayor Mauermann asked Dickson if it was not true that the highway plans are available in Dickson's office in the Frost Bldg., the offices of the Planning Board, and the office of the City Engineer, with a man on duty at all times to explain the plans and answer questions of anyone interested. Dickson replied in the affirmative and stated further that he would be happy to be present and make the explanations himself whenever such was desired by any interested party.

Dickson said he was ready to let the contracts on the highway work just as fast as the City can provide the right-of-way. He said the Inter-Regional Highway project would not solve all the City's traffic problems, but was the first step toward this goal.

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City Purchasing Agent Siebrecht asked Council authorization to sell surplus materials at the Airport. He said this was desired by Gen. Paul Wilkins, Airport Director.

The Mayor stated the surplus materials should first be made available to any City departments which may need any of the materials. He suggested the Purchasing Agent and the Inventory Clerk make a list of the materials available and let the interested departments check their needs against this list. He said he would like for all departments to remember that these materials were given free to them by his department and reciprocate when one of his departments needs help. He asked Comm. Steffler if he would help by fixing the roads at the airports.

Comm. Steffler replied that he would do this work.

The Mayor said he thought the Council should adopt a rule that if any department finds that the Inventory Clerk has listed surplus property in another department which is needed in their department, the Inventory Clerk would be authorized to transfer such property to the department needing it.

Comm. Anderson moved that the Airport Director and the Purchasing Agent be authorized to advertise for sale the surplus property at the airport. After a second by Comm. Hein, the motion was carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Hein, Steffler and Anderson; Nay, Callaghan (absent).

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Pursuant to motion duly made and carried, the meeting was adjourned Friday, October 18, 1946.
