BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

That an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS WHO OWN TAXABLE PROPERTY IN SAID CITY AND WHO HAVE DULY RENDERED THE SAME FOR TAXATION, A PROPOSITION TO BORROW MONEY ON THE CREDIT OF THE CITY AND TO ISSUE BONDS OF THE CITY FOR PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR THE CITY AND TO LEVY TAXES TO PAY THE INTEREST AND PROVIDE A SINKING FUND TO PAY THE BONDS, AS FOLLOWS:- A-49: STATE OR STATE-AID HIGHWAYS AND STREET AND BRIDGE BONDS, \$3,850,000.00," Passed and Approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on November 10th, 1949, be and the same is hereby amended so that it shall hereafter read as follows:

1. That an election is ordered hereby to be held in the various precincts in the City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 8th day of December, A.D.1949, and the Mayor is directed to issue his Proclamation calling said election, at which election a certain proposition to borrow money on the credit of the City of San Antonio and to issue bonds for permanent public improvements within the City of San Antonio and the levy of taxes sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, shall be submitted to the qualified voters who own taxable property in the City of San Antonio and who have duly rendered the same for taxation as provided in Article VI, Section 3-a of the Constitution of Texas; the purpose for which said bonds are desired and the money expended and the permanent public improvements to be constructed are distinctly specified herein, as follows, to-wit:-

A-49: State or State-Aid Highways; and Street and Bridge Bonds, \$3,850,000.00.

2. Shall the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money in the amount of \$3,850,000.00 for permanent improvements on the credit of said City and to issue bonds of the said City therefor as follows:

a. \$3,575,000.00 to acquire property for the right-of-way for State-Aid and Constructed Urban Expressways, Highways, Streets, Avenues, Boulevards and Grade Separations; also for access ways and approach streets thereto in said City, including the construction of approach streets, detours, and appurtenances thereto being more particularly described as follows:

- (a) Urban Expressway from Herff Street south to Nogalitos Street at Cass Street, and
- (b) Urban Expressway from Camaron Street connection easterly to the East City Limits, and
- (c) Trafficway connecting U.S.181 (So. Presa) and U.S.281 (Roosevelt Ave) with the Expressway by a northwesterly extension of Hicks Avenue to the South Side Artery (Probandt St.) at Gugert St., and
- (d) Relocate Trafficway now known as U.S.87 from Probandt Street and So. Alamo Street southeasterly to City Limits, and
- (e) Grade Separation at West Commerce Street and/or Buena Vista Street at Missouri Pacific Railroad tracks.

b. \$275,000.00 to build 4 (four) Bridges at the following locations: (including necessary relocation of channels)

- (a) Fifth Street over San Antonio River
- (b) Seventh Street over San Antonio River
- (c) South Side Artery over San Pedro Creek
- (d) South Side Artery over Concepcion Creek

all to improve traffic conditions, public convenience and safety in said City in an amount totalling \$3,850,000.00, each bond being of the denomination of \$1,000.00; said bonds to bear interest from date at a rate to be fixed by ordinance not to exceed 3 per cent per annum payable semi-annually; and be authorized to assess, levy and to collect taxes upon property in the said city, sufficient to pay the annual interest and to provide a sinking fund of at least 2 per cent to pay the bonds at maturity, said bonds to mature within a period of 20 years, payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable from 1 to 20 years inclusive.

3. The manner of holding the election shall be governed by the laws regulating such elections, made and provided; and only qualified electors who own taxable property in the City of San Antonio who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall vote, and electors shall vote in the election precinct of their residence; and the ballot to be used in this election shall be an "Official Ballot" arranged in such a manner that the voter at said election may vote either for or against said proposition.

4. That at said election voters desiring to support Proposition A-49 to issue bonds as described therein, shall have printed upon their ballots the words "FOR the issuance of bonds and to borrow money in the amount of \$3,850,000.00 for permanent improvements on the credit of said City and to issue bonds of the said City therefor as follows:

a. \$3,575,000.00 to acquire property for the right-of-way for State-Aid and Constructed Urban Expressways, Highways, Streets, Avenues, Boulevards and Grade Separations; also for access ways and approach streets thereto in said City including the construction of approach streets, detours, and appurtenances thereto being more particularly described as follows:

- (d) South Side Artery over Concepcion Creek

And those opposed to said Proposition A-49 to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words: "AGAINST the issuance of bonds and to borrow money in the amount of \$3,850,000.00 for permanent improvements on the credit of said City and to issue bonds of the said City therefor as follows:

a. \$3,575,000.00 to acquire property for the right-of-way for State-Aid and Constructed Urban Expressways, Highways, Streets, Avenues, Boulevards and Grade Separations; also for access ways and approach streets thereto in said City including the construction of approach streets, detours, and appurtenances thereto being more particularly described as follows:

6. The Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio do determine hereby that voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes at this election, and that a voting machine shall be placed in the office of the City Clerk, and the City Clerk or any Assistant City Clerk is charged as the person with authority to hold such election; all in the manner made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on the subject.

7. That said election shall be held within the City of San Antonio, and in each and all of the various election precincts thereof, variously located in each of the several wards of said City, as said election precincts are now fixed and established; and said election herein ordered shall be held during the hours required by law and at the place in each such respective election precincts set opposite the number of each precinct, in the following table, to-wit:

8. A copy of this ordinance, signed by the Mayor of the City of San Antonio, shall constitute a proper order for said election and, with such additions thereto as may be deemed appropriate by the Mayor, shall be sufficient Proclamation and Notice of said election; and the Mayor is directed hereby to cause such Notice of said election to be given by posting a substantial copy of this Election Order in each of the election precincts of the City of San Antonio and at the City Hall of the City of San Antonio not less than 14 days before this election, and such Notice shall be published also on the same day in each of two successive weeks in the "COMMERCIAL RECORDER", a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of San Antonio, the date of the first publication to be not less than 14 days prior to the date set for said election. Except as herein provided, the manner of holding such election shall be governed by the laws governing general elections.

PROCLAMATION *and* NOTICE *of* ELECTION

To Be Held the 8th of December,
A. D. 1949

WHEREAS, at a meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio held in the Council Chamber at the City Hall, on the 17th day of November, 1949, the ordinance herein set out was duly and finally passed by said Board of Commissioners to take effect immediately and same has been duly approved by the Mayor, said ordinance being in words and figures as follows:

Be It Ordained by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio:-

- (a) Urban Expressway from Herff Street south to Nogalitos Street at Cass Street, and
- (b) Urban Expressway from Camaron Street connection easterly to the East City Limits, and
- (c) Trafficway connecting U.S. 181 (So. Presa) and U.S. 281 (Roosevelt Ave.) with the Expressway by a northwesterly extension of Hicks Avenue to the South Side Artery (Probandt St.) at Gugert St., and
- (d) Relocated Trafficway now known as U.S. 87 from Probandt Street and So. Alamo Street southeasterly to City Limits, and
- (e) Grade Separation at West Commerce Street and/or Buena Vista Street at Missouri Pacific Railroad tracks.

b. \$275,000.00 to build 4 (four) Bridges at the following locations: (including necessary relocation of channels)

- (a) Fifth Street over San Antonio River
- (b) Seventh Street over San Antonio River
- (c) South Side Artery over San Pedro Creek
- (d) South Side Artery over Concepcion Creek

all to improve traffic conditions, public convenience and safety in said City in an amount totalling \$3,850,000.00, each bond being of the denomination of \$1,000.00; said bonds to bear interest from date at a rate to be fixed by ordinance not to exceed 3 per cent per annum payable semi-annually; and be authorized to assess, levy and to collect taxes upon property in the said city, sufficient to pay the annual interest and to provide a sinking fund of at least 2 per cent to pay the bonds at maturity, said bonds to mature within a period of 20 years, payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable from 1 to 20 years inclusive.

3. The manner of holding the election shall be governed by the laws regulating such elections, made and provided; and only qualified electors who own taxable property in the City of San Antonio who have duly rendered the same for taxation, shall vote, and electors shall vote in the election precinct of their residence; and the ballot to be used in this election shall be an "Official Ballot" arranged in such a manner that the voter at said election may vote either for or against said proposition.

b. \$275,000.00 to build 4 (four) Bridges at the following locations: (including necessary relocation of channels)

(a) Fifth Street over San Antonio River

(b) Seventh Street over San Antonio River

(c) South Side Artery over San Pedro Creek

(d) South Side Artery over Concepcion Creek

all to improve traffic conditions, public convenience and safety in said City in an amount totalling \$3,850,000.00, each bond being of the denomination of \$1,000.00; said bonds to bear interest from date at a rate to be fixed by ordinance not to exceed 3 per cent per annum payable semi-annually; and the Board of Commissioners be authorized to assess, levy and to collect taxes upon property in the said City, sufficient to pay the annual interest and to provide a sinking fund of at least 2 per cent to pay the bonds at maturity; said bonds to mature within a period of 20 years, payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable from 1 to 20 years inclusive."

5. And those opposed to said Proposition A-49 to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words: "AGAINST the issuance of bonds and to borrow money in the amount of \$3,850,000.00 for permanent improvements on the credit of said City and to issue Bonds of the said City therefor as follows:

a. \$3,575,000.00 to acquire property for the right-of-way for State-Aid and Constructed Urban Expressways, Highways, Streets, Avenues, Boulevards and Grade Separations; also for access ways and approach streets thereto in said City including the construction of approach streets, detours, and appurtenances thereto being more particularly described as follows:

(a) Urban Expressway from Herff Street south to Nogalitos Street at Cass Street, and

(b) Urban Expressway from Camaron Street connection easterly to the East City Limits, and

(c) Trafficway connecting U.S. 181 (So. Presa) and U.S. 281 (Roosevelt Ave.) with the Expressway by a northwesterly extension of Hicks Avenue to the South Side Artery (Probandt St.) at Gugert St., and

(d) Relocated Trafficway now known as U.S. 87 from Probandt Street and So. Alamo Street southeasterly to City Limits, and

(e) Grade Separation at West Commerce Street and/or Buena Vista Street at Missouri Pacific Railroad tracks.

b. \$275,000.00 to build 4 (four) Bridges at the following locations: (including necessary relocation of channels)

(a) Fifth Street over San Antonio River

(b) Seventh Street over San Antonio River

(c) South Side Artery over San Pedro Creek

(d) South Side Artery over Concepcion Creek

all to improve traffic conditions, public convenience and safety in said City in an amount totalling \$3,850,000.00 each bond being of the denomination of \$1,000.00; said bonds to bear interest from date at a rate to be fixed by ordinance not to exceed 3 per cent per annum payable semi-annually; and the Board of Commissioners be authorized to assess, levy and to collect taxes upon property in the said city, sufficient to pay the annual interest and to provide a sinking fund of at least 2 per cent to pay the bonds at maturity, said bonds to mature within a period of 20 years, payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable from 1 to 20 years inclusive."

6. The Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio do determine hereby that voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes at this election, and that a voting machine shall be placed in the office of the City Clerk, and the City Clerk or any Assistant City Clerk is charged as the person with authority to hold such election; all in the manner made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on the subject.

7. That said election shall be held within the City of San Antonio, and in each and all of the various election precincts thereof, variously located in each of the several wards of said City, as said election precincts are now fixed and established; and said election herein ordered shall be held during the hours required by law and at the place in each such respective election precincts set opposite the number of each precinct, in the following table, to-wit:

All to improve traffic conditions, public convenience and safety in said City in an amount totalling \$3,850,000.00, each bond being of the denomination of \$1,000.00; said bonds to bear interest from date at a rate to be fixed by ordinance not to exceed 3 per cent per annum payable semi-annually; and the Board of Commissioners be authorized to assess, levy and to collect taxes upon property in the said City, sufficient to pay the annual interest and to provide a sinking fund of at least 2 per cent to pay the bonds at maturity; said bonds to mature within a period of 20 years, payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable from 1 to 20 years inclusive."

5. And those opposed to said Proposition A-49 to issue bonds shall have printed upon their ballots the words: "AGAINST the issuance of bonds and to borrow money in the amount of \$3,850,000.00 for permanent improvements on the credit of said City and to issue bonds of the said City therefor as follows:

a. \$3,575,000.00 to acquire property for the right-of-way for State-Aid and Constructed Urban Expressways, Highways, Streets, Avenues, Boulevards and Grade Separations; also for access ways and approach streets thereto in said City including the construction of approach streets, detours, and appurtenances thereto being more particularly described as follows:

- (a) Urban Expressway from Herff Street south to Nogalitos Street at Cass Street, and
- (b) Urban Expressway from Camaron Street connection easterly to the East City Limits, and

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:—

That an Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS WHO OWN TAXABLE PROPERTY IN SAID CITY AND WHO HAVE DULY RENDERED THE SAME FOR TAXATION, A PROPOSITION TO BORROW MONEY ON THE CREDIT OF THE CITY AND TO ISSUE BONDS OF THE CITY FOR PERMANENT PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IN AND FOR THE CITY AND TO LEVY TAXES TO PAY THE INTEREST AND PROVIDE A SINKING FUND TO PAY THE BONDS, AS FOLLOWS:— A-49: STATE OR STATE-AID HIGHWAYS AND STREET AND BRIDGE BONDS, \$3,850,000.00," Passed and Approved by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on November 10th, 1949, be and the same is hereby amended so that it shall hereafter read as follows:

1. That an election is ordered hereby to be held in the various precincts in the City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 8th day of December, A. D. 1949, and the Mayor is directed to issue his Proclamation calling said election, at which election a certain proposition to borrow money on the credit of the City of San Antonio and to issue bonds for permanent public improvements within the City of San Antonio and the levy of taxes sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, shall be submitted to the qualified voters who own taxable property in the City of San Antonio and who have duly rendered the same for taxation as provided in Article VI, Section 3-a of the Constitution of Texas; the purpose for which said bonds are desired and the money expended and the permanent public improvements to be constructed are distinctly specified herein, as follows, to-wit:—

A-49: State or State-Aid Highways and Street and Bridge Bonds, \$3,850,000.00

2. Shall the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio be authorized to borrow money in the amount of \$3,850,000.00 for permanent improvements on the credit of said City and to issue bonds of the said City therefor as follows:

a. \$3,575,000.00 to acquire property for the right-of-way for State-Aid and Constructed Urban Expressways, Highways, Streets, Avenues, Boulevards and Grade Separations; also for access ways and approach streets thereto in said City, including the construction of approach streets, detours, and appurtenances thereto being more particularly described as follows:

(a) Urban Expressway from Herff Street south to Nogalitos Street at Cass Street, and

(b) Urban Expressway from Camaron Street connection easterly to the East City Limits, and

(c) Trafficway connecting U.S. 181 (So. Presa) and U.S. 231 (Roosevelt Ave.) with the Expressway by a northwesterly extension of Hicks Avenue to the South Side Artery (Probandt St.) at Gugert St., and

(d) Relocated Trafficway now known as U.S. 87 from Probandt Street and So. Alamo Street southeasterly to City Limits, and

(e) Grade Separation at West Commerce Street and/or Buena Vista Street at Missouri Pacific Railroad tracks.

b. \$275,000.00 to build 4 (four) Bridges at the following locations: (including necessary relocation of channels)

(a) Fifth Street over San Antonio River

(b) Seventh Street over San Antonio River

(c) South Side Artery over San Pedro Creek

(d) South Side Artery over Concepcion Creek

3. All to improve traffic conditions, public convenience and safety in said City in an amount totalling \$3,850,000.00, each bond being of the denomination of \$1,000.00; said bonds to bear interest from date payable semi-annually; and to be authorized to assess, levy and to collect taxes upon property in the said city, sufficient to pay the annual interest and to provide a sinking fund of at least 2 per cent to pay the bonds at maturity; said bonds to mature within a period of 20 years, payable serially in yearly installments as nearly equal as practicable from 1 to 20 years inclusive.

4. The manner of holding the election shall be governed by the laws regulating such elections, made and provided; and only qualified electors who own taxable property in the City of San Antonio and who have duly rendered the same for taxation as provided in Article VI, Section 3-a of the Constitution of Texas, shall be eligible to vote at said election.
