AN ORDINANCE *MM-645*

TO RELEASE INTEREST AND PENALTIES ON TAXES WHICH WERE DELINQUENT ON OR BEFORE THE 1ST OF AUGUST, 1934.

Commissioner Bushick, moved a suspension of the rules, which motion being duly seconded by Commissioner Wright was carried by the following vote on roll call, to-wit; Ayes, Quin, Bushick, Rubiola, Steffler, Wright: The ordinance was then passed and approved by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Quin, Bushick, Rubiola, Steffler, Wright.

AN ORDINANCE

TO RELEASE INTEREST AND PENALTIES ON TAXES WHICH WERE DELINQUENT ON OR BEFORE THE 1ST OF AUGUST, 1934.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That all interest and penalties that have accrued on all ad valorem taxes that were delinquent on or before the 1st of August, 1934, due to the City of San Antonio shall be, and the same are hereby released, provided said ad valorem taxes are paid to the City of San Antonio during the period from the 8th day of February, 1935 to the 15th day of March, 1935, both days

inclusive; as stipulated in Section 1 of the "TAX PENALTY AND INTEREST REMISSION LAW", being House Bill No. 7 approved on the 9th of November, 1934 and passed by the Fourth Called Session of the 43rd Legislature.

2. The Tax Collector of the City of San Antonio and the deputy tax collectors are directed to accept the payment of the taxes herein specified, as herein stipulated, and handle the same otherwise as directed by the ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby expressly suspended during the term of this ordinance, in so far as the same are in conflict with the provisions hereof.

4. It is further provided that in case any section, clause, sentence, paragraph or part of this ordinance shall for any reason be adjudged by any court of competent or final jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance but shall be confined in its operation to the section, clause, sentence, paragraph or part thereof, directly involved in the controversy in which said judgment shall have been rendered.

5. The fact that thousands of dollars in taxes have been due to the City the collection of which can be accelerated by this ordinance creates an emergency and public necessity demanding that the rule which requires ordinances to be read on three several days be suspended; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by a vote of 4/5 of the Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the 8th day of February, 1935.

AN ORDINANCE *MM-647*

AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO BORROW \$100,000.00 TO PAY THE EXPENSES OF THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1934.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. To pay the debts of the City of San Antonio incurred for current expenses during the fiscal year 1934, beginning the 1st of June 1934 and ending the 31st day of May 1935, including contingent expenses arising during said fiscal year, which can be provided lawfully out of the General Fund of the City for said fiscal year, and obligations of the City created during said fiscal year, which can be provided lawfully out of the General Fund of the City for said fiscal year, and to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year, including such contingent expenses and the obligations created therefor; there shall be borrowed for the use of the City in anticipation of the receipts of taxes levied for said fiscal year, and in anticipation of the revenue for said fiscal year, from the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and from the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, \$100,000.00 for said purposes, which amount together with the loans and advances of the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas under contracts with the City of San Antonio, and money to be advanced and to be lent by the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, Texas and the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, for the current fiscal year, which contracts are included herein by reference, does not exceed the estimated amount of income of the City for said fiscal year, based upon the assessed value, the tax rate and other income of the City from all sources.

2. Promissory notes of the City of San Antonio as hereinafter specified shall be executed

to evidence said loans and advances and shall be delivered to said banks as herein provided, as specified under the power vested in the City of San Antonio by its Charter, by the laws of the State of Texas and by the Constitution of the State of Texas.

3. Said notes shall be numbered consecutively from 69 to 72, inclusive, and shall be for \$25,000.00 each.

4. That said notes bearing odd numbers, aggregating \$50,000.00 shall be payable to the order of the Frost National Bank of San Antonio, and said notes bearing even numbers, aggregating \$50,000.00 shall be payable to the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio; all said notes to be dated the day and date they are executed, and shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum from date thereof, calculated and payable monthly, as it accrues, provided, that interest shall be paid only on cash actually advanced on said notes and only from the dates of such advancements, and, provided, that said notes or advances made by said banks to said City shall draw interest after the maturity thereof at the rate of seven per cent (7%) per annum; said notes shall be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor of said City, and attested by the City Clerk of said City, and the corporate seal of said City shall be impressed upon each of said notes; said notes shall provide for final maturity not later than July 1, 1935, with privilege of prepayment prior to maturity.

5. That the uncollected taxes and revenues of the City of San Antonio for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1934, and ending May 31, 1935, and all of the current revenues of the City of San Antonio arising from taxation and all other sources during said fiscal year, and all uncollected back taxes for previous years subject only to existing prior valid pledges of said back taxes, be and the same are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the above said notes and advances, and that said notes and all interest thereon shall constitute a first lien upon and against all said taxes and revenues for said fiscal year, and all said uncollected back taxes for previous years subject only to existing prior pledges of said back taxes, and shall be paid therefrom and from the current incomes and revenues of the City and such uncollected back taxes before any such taxes, revenues or income or back taxes may be lawfully appropriated to any other purpose or object whatsoever.

6. That the money to be borrowed by the City from the said banks as above provided shall be borrowed as provided by and in accordance with the terms of the contract between the City and the banks for the loan thereof by the banks to the City, which contract is set out in and evidenced by ordinance passed by the Commissioners of the City, dated June 28th, 1934, and recorded in Vol. M, page 237, et seq., of the Minutes of the Commissioners of said City.

7. That the proceeds of said loans shall be used to take up and pay off the outstanding indebtedness of the City of San Antonio legally incurred for the current expenses of said City during the said current fiscal year, and in the payment of the current expenses of said City for the remainder of the said current fiscal year, as provided by and in accordance with the charter and ordinances of said City.

8. That the form of said notes shall be substantially as follows:

CITY OF SAN ANTONIO 1934 GENERAL FUND NOTE

City of San Antonio, a municipality of the State of Texas, in the County of Bexar, for value received, promises hereby to pay to the order of (--- name of bank ---) of San Antonio, Texas, on or before the 1st day of July, A. D. 1935, at the office of the Treasurer of the City of San Antonio, the principal sum of (--- state amount in dollars ---) in lawful money of the United States of America,

together with interest thereon from the date hereof until maturity at the rate of 6% per annum payable monthly and at the rate of 7% per annum after maturity until paid.

This note is one of a series of 4 notes numbered from 69 to 72, inclusive, aggregating \$100,000.00 authorized to be issued by the City of San Antonio to the bank specified herein to evidence a loan made to the said City by said bank to pay certain indebtedness for current expenses of said City during the fiscal year 1934 and to supply funds to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year, said notes having been issued under the authority of the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and in pursuance of an Ordinance passed by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the - - - - day of February, 1935, which Ordinance is recorded in the Minutes of the City Commission and is included herein by reference for all intents and purposes.

The date of this note shall be the date of the loan and the delivery of the money to the City of San Antonio by the payee as stipulated in said Ordinance.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this series of notes have been done and performed properly, and have happened in regular and due time, form and manner, as stipulated by law; and that the full faith and credit of the City of San Antonio and the current taxes and the current revenues of said City for the current fiscal year 1934 are pledged hereby for the punctual payment of the amount of this series of notes, subject, however, to the prior payment of notes 1 to 68, both inclusive, heretofore authorized and superior to this series."

9. The City of San Antonio agrees to levy a tax as stipulated by law at the rate sufficient to produce a return sufficient to pay the series of notes specified herein according to their tenor and effect.

10. The Mayor of the City of San Antonio is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver said notes to the payees herein specified upon the payment by said payee of the amount designated in each of said notes.
