

AN ORDINANCE 08-148

AMENDING SECTION 5, DIVISION 12, OF AN ORDINANCE FOR THE LICENSING AND REGULATION OF "AUTOMOBILES FOR HIRE", PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 23rd DAY OF SEPTEMBER, A. D. 1915; ESTABLISHING AN AUTHORIZED STAND FOR AUTOMOBILES FOR HIRE AT MILAM SQUARE, BETWEEN WEST HOUSTON STREET AND WEST COMMERCE STREET, ON NORTH SANTA ROSA AVENUE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section 5, Division 12, of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance for the Licensing and regulation of "Automobiles for Hire", and providing penalties for the violation thereof", passed and approved on the 23rd day of September, A. D. 1915, be and the same is hereby amended by adding, after the words "Travis Square; Along the west side of the park", the following:-

"Milam Square: On the east side of the Square, between West Houston Street and West Commerce Street, on North Santa Rosa Avenue".

AN ORDINANCE 08-149

AMENDING THE TRAFFIC ORDINANCE LIMITING PARKING TO ONE (1) HOUR ON NORTH ALAMO STREET, FROM EAST TRAVIS STREET TO FOURTH STREET.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Rule 39 of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Regulating the Government of Traffice on the Streets, Plazas and Public Places of the City of San Antonio", passed and approved on the 8th day of December, 1921, as amended on the 9th day of October, 1922, and as amended on the 22nd day of October, 1923, and as amended on the 16th day of June, 1924, and as amended on the 17th day of August, 1925; be and is hereby amended by adding, after the words "On Navarro Street, between Travis Street and Pecan Streets", the following:-

"On North Alamo Street, from East Travis Street to Fourth Street".

 AN ORDINANCE *08-150*

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO PROMISSORY NOTES, TO EVIDENCE MONEY BORROWED FOR THE USE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO IN ANTICIPATION OF THE RECEIPTS OF TAXES AND REVENUES FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR; PLEDGING AS SECURITY FOR SUCH LOAN THE UNCOLLECTED AND REVENUES OF SAID CITY FOR SAID YEAR.

WHEREAS, The City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, have submitted a proposition to the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio to loan to said City the funds required to pay the current debts, incurred during the present fiscal year, and to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year; and to accept from said City to evidence such loans, promissory notes bearing four and one-half ($4\frac{1}{2}$) per cent interest per annum, which proposition has been accepted by said Commissioners; therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1: That for the purpose of paying off the debts of the City of San Antonio, incurred for current expenses during the present fiscal year, beginning June 1, 1927, and to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year, ending May 31, 1928, there shall be borrowed and secured from the City National Bank, of San Antonio, Texas, an advance of money for said purpose in the amount of ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,300,000.00), and there shall be borrowed and secured from the Alamo National Bank, of San Antonio, Texas, an advance of money for said purpose in the amount of ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,300,000.00), which amounts do not exceed the current estimates income of said City for said fiscal year.

Section 2: That to evidence said loans, promissory notes of the City of San Antonio shall be executed and delivered to said City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and said Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, under and by virtue of the Charter of said City, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

Section 3: Said notes shall be numbered consecutively from one (1) to Fifty-Two (52), both inclusive, and shall be of the denomination of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) each, aggregating the sum of TWO MILLION SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,600,000.00).

Section 4: One-half of said notes, to-wit: All notes bearing odd numbers, such as Nos. 1, 3, 5, 7, and each successive alternate number of said series, shall be payable to the order
