WHEREAS, the City took over the said Water-works Plant at midnight on the 31st day of May, A. D. 1925;

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES, said Natt T. Wagner agrees to pay all City and Independent School District taxes up to and including the 31st day of May, A. D. 1925; and said Natt T. Wagner further agrees to hold the City harmless and indemnify it against all State and County taxes, penalties, interest and costs that may become due and owing on said Plant from January 1, 1925, to May 31, 1925.

And the City of San Antonio and the Water-works Board of Trustees join herein and agree to assume all State and County taxes which may become a charge against this Plant, after the thirty-first day of May, 1925.

Ant in the event there is any litigation with reference to the State and County taxes, then the said Natt T. Wagner and his associates will reimburse, indemnify and hold the City harmless from all interest, penalties, costs, attorneys fees and other expenses arising from such litigation, if any. This instrument shall be strictly construed in favor of the City and the Water Trustees; and shall not operate as waiver or restriction of the general warranty in said Deed.

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE DENOUNCING AND PENALIZING FISHING, SEINING AND NETTING ANYWHERE IN THE SAN ANTONIO RIVER WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY, PASSED AND APPROVED THE FIRST DAY OF SEPTEMBER, A. D. 1916.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That An Ordinance denouncing and penalizing fishing, seining and netting anywhere in the San Antonio River within the corporate limits of the City, passed and approved the 1st day of September, A. D. 1916, be and the same is hereby amended so that said Ordinance shall hereafter read as follows:-

SECTION TWO: Any person who fishes, seins or nets anywhere in the San Antonio River for the purpose of catching any kind of fish, large or small (the word "fish" in this connection being used in its most comprehensive sense), within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio except during the months of June, July, August and September, shall be deemed guilty of the commission of a misdemeanor; and, upon conviction therefor before the Corporation Court, shall be fined in any sum of money not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

SECTION THREE: And each such act of fishing, seining or netting shall constitute a separate and distinct offence within the meaning of this ordinance.

SECTION FOUR: Provided, however, that no person shall at any time fish, sein or net within the boundaries of that portion of the City of San Antonio known as Brackenridge Park.

SECTION FIVE: This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and it shall take effect from the date of its passage.

Commissioner Lambert placed in nomination the name of Phil Wright, as Mayor protem, which nomination was duly seconded and conformed by unanimous vote of the Commissioners.

On motion duly seconded and carried, the meeting recessed until 11 o'clock on June 2, 1925.

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH NATT. T. WAGNER TO SECURE THE CITY AGAINST CLAIMS AGAINST THE WATER SYSTEM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That John W. Tobin, Mayor of the City of San Antonio, be and he is hereby authorized to enter into the following contract with Natt T. Wagner:

"Received of Natt T. Wagner two hundred and fifty (250) City of San Antonio Water-works Gold Bonds, dated May 1 1925, of the par value of One Thousand (\$1,000) Dollars each, said bonds to be deposited with the City Treasurer of the City of San Antonio, conditioned that the said bonds will be delivered to said Natt T. Wagner, on his order, upon his furnishing satisfactory evidence to the City of San Antonio that there are no liens, encumbrances or claims that can be enforced on the Water-works System that was this day conveyed to the City by Natt T. Wagner, as against the said City, It is also understood that he may withdraw these bonds on substituting a like amount par value of Liberty Bonds of the United States Government, or he may furnish an indemnity bond, either a surety company or individual bond,
