

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, HELD IN
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON
THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 11, 1988.

The meeting was called to order by the presiding officer, Mayor Henry Cisneros, with the following members present: BERRIOZABAL, WEBB, DUTMER, WING, MARTINEZ, VERA, WOLFF, LABATT, HASSLOCHER, CISNEROS; Absent: THOMPSON.

88-08 The Clerk read the following Resolution:

A RESOLUTION 88-08-14

STATING THE CITY COUNCIL'S OPPOSITION OF ANY FURLOUGH OR SEPARATION OF FEDERAL CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES AT THE AIR LOGISTICS COMMAND AT KELLY AIR FORCE BASE; AND REQUESTING THAT THE AGENCIES INVOLVED LOOK AT ALL OTHER FUNDING SOURCES BEFORE ANY EMPLOYEES ARE FURLOUGHED OR SEPARATED.

Mrs. Dutmer stated that she feels that this is a federal matter and she cannot support this proposed resolution since it is not a city matter.

Mr. Wing made a motion to approve the proposed Resolution. Mrs. Berriozabal seconded the motion.

Mr. Labatt stated that he supports local jobs but feels that the government is seeking to balance the federal budget and this is just a part of that balancing process. He stated that, in his opinion, this is strictly a federal matter and he feels that excessive federal spending is the underlying problem involved.

Mr. Martinez stated that he feels this is also a local matter as well since it affects San Antonio residents and it will have an adverse impact on San Antonio. He then spoke in support of the resolution.

Mr. Webb spoke in support of the resolution, stating that the city reduced its budget and yet did not have to layoff any employees. He urged support of the resolution.

City Council members then voiced their opinions in support of or against the proposed resolution.

A discussion then took place among Council members concerning the impact of proposed job loss and furloughs at Kelly AFB and the question of whether or not to add other federal installations to the resolution.

Mayor Cisneros spoke of previous actions taken by the City Council in similar type cases and he spoke to the reasons why he feels that a resolution is extremely important in this case.

A discussion then took place on a previous resolution which Mrs. Dutmer alluded to in her previous statement.

After consideration, the motion, carrying with it the passage of the Resolution, prevailed by the following vote: AYES: Berriozabal, Webb, Wing, Martinez, Vera, Wolff, Cisneros; NAYS: Dutmer, Labatt, Hasslocher; ABSENT: Thompson.

There being no further business to come before the City Council, the meeting was adjourned at 4:43 P.M.
