

AN ORDINANCE 93719

AUTHORIZING THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF CERTAIN STREETS IN CONNECTION WITH THE 2001 FIESTA SAN ANTONIO CELEBRATION; APPROVING THE LOCATIONS, DATES AND TIMES FOR THE FIESTA CARNIVAL AND OFFICIAL FIESTA EVENTS, AND RELATED REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS; APPROVING THE FIESTA PARADE ROUTES; AND AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 91563, PASSED ON APRIL 6, 2000 TO REFLECT SUCH CHANGES.

WHEREAS, San Antonio's annual Fiesta San Antonio Celebration, through the dedicated efforts of many civic-minded persons and nonprofit organizations, has achieved state wide, national, and international recognition as one of the outstanding festival events in our nation; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 88270 of August, 13, 1998, set the dates for Fiesta San Antonio for the years 2000 through 2008, designated the Fiesta San Antonio Commission as the planning and coordinating organization for the event, provided for and allocated financial support to Fiesta events, adopted regulations for Fiesta events, and made other provisions in connection with Fiesta; and

WHEREAS, planning is underway for the 2001 Fiesta San Antonio, and it is necessary to approve certain events, close streets to vehicular traffic in connection with certain events, approve the dates, times and locations for events, including the Fiesta Carnival, and declaring the rules, rates, regulations and conditions for staging these events; and also to approve the Fiesta Parade Routes and close streets to vehicular traffic in connection with the Fiesta Parades; and

WHEREAS; in planning for the 2001 Fiesta San Antonio, it has been agreed that certain portions of Ordinance No. 91563, of April 6, 2000, be amended; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The following Fiesta events are approved for the dates and times as set forth below. The listed public streets and ways shall be closed to vehicular traffic during the dates and times indicated to facilitate the events and their use of the public property.

1. **SOUTHWEST CRAFT CENTER ART FAIR:** Augusta Street from Giraud Street to Navarro Street will be made a temporary one-way (eastbound). The west half of Augusta Street from Giraud Street to Convent will be closed to westbound traffic. These streets will be closed on Friday, April 20, 2001 from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., on Saturday, April 21, 2001 from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and on Sunday, April 22, 2001 from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Two (2) off-duty police officers will be required. One officer will be posted at Augusta and Navarro Streets, the second officer will be posted at Augusta St. and Giraud St., both officers will be responsible to direct vehicular and pedestrian traffic. These two (2) off-duty police officers will be required to be on their post during the requested street closure. The daily placement and daily removal of all traffic control devices shall only be done by the certified barricade company. Augusta Street from Convent Street to Navarro Street shall be open to two (2) way traffic during non-event hours.
2. **NIGHT IN OLD SAN ANTONIO:** The following streets are to be closed on Saturday, April 21, 2001 from 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon on Sunday, April 29, 2001. South Presa Street from Market Street to Nueva Street, South Presa Street from Nueva St. to Arcienga St. will be made a one-way southbound,

the median and west bound lanes of Nueva Street from South Alamo Street to 175 feet west of South Presa Street; Access to Villita Assembly Hall will be maintained for participants in the "Patriotic and Historic Ball" on Saturday evening April 21, 2001. Nueva St. will be closed to through traffic from St. Mary's Street to Alamo Street on April 24, 2001 to April 27, 2001 between the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight. Vehicular access to the Fairmount Hotel will remain open.

3. **FIESTA DEL MERCADO:** San Saba Street from Dolorosa to West Commerce Street shall be closed entirely to include sidewalks and the roadway from 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, April 17, 2001 through 6:00 p.m. on Monday, April 30, 2001. **NO SIDEWALKS OR TRAFFIC LANES SHALL BE CLOSED AT ANY OTHER PERIOD OTHER THAN THE DATE AND TIME INDICATED BY THIS ORDINANCE.**

Fiesta Del Mercado Approved Event Hours of Operation (Reference City Ordinance 89551):

April 20 – 27, & 29, 2001: 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight

April 28, 2001: 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.

Pecos Street: The area from the "Tour Bus Loading Zone" to the temporary fence erected under IH-35 ramp shall be used for parking ***by permit only*** as issued by the City of San Antonio Public Works Department, for Market Square vehicles relating to the Fiesta Del Mercado event. Parking on City sidewalks and Gateway Plaza and other Plaza pedestrian walkways **WILL NOT BE AUTHORIZED AND STRICTLY ENFORCED BY SAPD AND PUBLIC WORKS PARKING ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL.**

Approved Vendor Service Vehicle Parking: Commercial vendor's service vehicles with a valid affixed commercial placard and displayed valid parking permit (parking meter bag) issued by the City of San Antonio will be authorized to park at the following locations:

Market Square will park Beer, Ice, and Soda Trailers under IH 35 between Pecos and Nueva in the reserved parking area.

On the northbound lane of San Saba just north of Dolorosa (1-trailer)

On the west curb lane of San Saba between Commerce and Houston (1-trailer, 2-vehicle)

On north side of Dolorosa between San Saba and Santa Rosa (1-trailer, 2-trucks)

On north side of Dolorosa from San Saba to Santa Rosa between the hours of 7:00 am to 3:00 pm on weekdays and 7:00 am to 9:00 am weekends.

On the west curb lane of San Saba between Dolorosa and Nueva. (Band vehicles only)

The serving, loading and/or unloading of any parked trailers on Dolorosa Street during event operations will be hereby prohibited and violators will be towed at owner's expense.

Approved Parking Areas for "Non-Service Vehicles": Any vehicle may park on the south side of Dolorosa between San Saba and Santa Rosa at the open meters throughout the day **EXCEPT; Service Vehicles** – and they may **NOT** be parked there after 3:00 pm on weekdays and 9:00 am on weekends. All other Posted Restrictions are to be adhered to. Driveways and sidewalks are not to be blocked at any time and vehicles shall not park less than twenty-five (25') feet from any intersection.

4. **ST. MARY'S OYSTER BAKE:** Marquette Street from 36th Street to Camino Santa Maria; Overhill Street from 36th Street to Camino Santa Maria; Ligustrum Street from Woodlawn to Marquette Street. Said streets will be closed to thru traffic on Friday, April 20, 2001 from 4:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m. and Saturday, April 21, 2001 from 10:00 a.m. until 10:00 p.m. Camino Santa Maria from Colgate to Wake Forest (westside curb only for VIA bus parking, twelve foot (12') width, from face of curb) will be closed on Friday, April 20, 2001 at 3:30 p.m. until 11:00 p.m. and Saturday, April 21, 2001 from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m.
5. **FIESTA MISSION RUN:** East White Avenue from Mission Parkway to Padre Drive; Mission Parkway from East White to Mission Road; Mission Road from Mission Parkway to Mission Concepcion; Padre

SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

This ordinance authorizes the closure of certain streets in connection with Fiesta 2001, approves the dates and times for specified Fiesta events, approves the location, dates and times for the Fiesta Carnival and related requirements and conditions, and approves the Fiesta Parade routes.

Staff concurs with prior City Council Fiesta Committee recommendations to approve this annual ordinance.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The following Fiesta events are approved for the dates and times as outlined below:

1. **SOUTHWEST CRAFT CENTER ART FAIR:** Augusta Street from Giraud Street to Navarro Street will be made a temporary one-way (eastbound). The west half of Augusta Street from Giraud Street to Convent will be closed to westbound traffic. These streets will be closed on Friday, April 20, 2001 from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., on Saturday, April 21, 2001 from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and on Sunday, April 22, 2001 from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Two (2) off-duty police officers will be required. One officer will be posted at Augusta and Navarro Streets, the second officer will be posted at Augusta St. and Giraud St., both will be responsible to direct vehicular and pedestrian traffic. These two (2) off-duty police officers will be required to be on their post during the requested street closure. The daily placement and daily removal of all traffic control devices shall only be done by the certified barricade company. Augusta Street from Convent Street to Navarro Street shall be open to two (2) way traffic during non-event hours.
2. **NIGHT IN OLD SAN ANTONIO:** The following streets are requested to be closed on Saturday, April 21, 2001 at 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon on Sunday, April 29, 2001. South Presa Street from Market Street to NuevaStreet, South Presa Street from Nueva St. to Arcienga St will be made a one-way southbound, the median and west bound lanes of Nueva Street from South Alamo Street to 175 feet west of South Presa Street; Access to Villita Assembly Hall will be maintained for participants in the "Patriotic and Historic Ball" on Saturday evening April 21, 2001. Nueva St. will be closed to through traffic from St. Mary's Street to Alamo Street on April 24, 2001 to April 27, 2001 between the hours of 8:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight. Vehicular access to the Farimount Hotel will remain .
3. **FIESTA DEL MERCADO:** San Saba Street from Dolorosa to West Commerce Street closed entirely to include sidewalks and the roadway from 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, April 17, 2001 through 6:00 p.m. on Monday April 30, 2001. **NO SIDEWALKS OR TRAFFIC LANES SHALL BE CLOSED AT ANY OTHER PERIOD OTHER THAN THE DATE AND TIME INDICATED BY THIS ORDINANCE.**

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April 20 – 27, & 29, 2001: 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight

April 28, 2001: 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m.

Pecos Street: The area from the "Tour Bus Loading Zone" to the temporary fence erected under IH-35 ramp shall be used for parking by permit only as issued by the City of San Antonio Public Works Department, for Market Square vehicles relating to the Fiesta Del Mercado event. Parking on City sidewalks and Gateway Plaza and other Plaza pedestrian walkways **WILL NOT BE AUTHORIZED AND STRICTLY ENFORCED BY SAPD AND PUBLIC WORKS PARKING ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL.**

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On the west curb lane of San Saba between Commerce and Houston (1-trailer, 2-vehicle)

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On north side of Dolorosa from San Saba to Santa Rosa between the hours of 7:00 am to 3:00 pm on weekdays and 7:00 am to 9:00 am weekends.

On the west curb lane of San Saba between Dolorosa and Nueva. (Band vehicles only)

The serving, loading and/or unloading of any parked trailers on Dolorosa Street during event operations will be hereby prohibited and violators will be towed at owner's expense.

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5. **FIESTA MISSION RUN:** East White Avenue from Mission Parkway to Padre Drive; Mission Parkway from East White to Mission Road; Mission Road from Mission Parkway to Mission Concepcion; Padre Drive from East White to Pyron Avenue; Pyron Avenue from Padre Drive to San Jose Drive. Streets will be closed on Saturday, April 21, 2001 from 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 a.m.
6. **PILGRIMAGE TO THE ALAMO:** Auditorium Circle and Alamo Plaza from East Houston Street to Crockett Street. Parkway will be restricted or prohibited on Martin Street from Jefferson Street to Navarro Street and Jefferson Street to Commerce Street. The streets will be closed on Monday, April 22, 2001 from 3:00 p.m. until 5:30 p.m.
7. **PARADES: BATTLE OF FLOWERS AND FIESTA FLAMBEAU:** Both parades will follow this route: assemble at E. Grayson to Broadway, south on Broadway, east on 3rd Street, south on Alamo Street, west on Commerce, north on Santa Rosa to Martin, disband on Martin.
Broadway from Newell to Jones Avenue will be closed on Saturday, April 28, 2001 from 11:00 p.m. until Sunday, April 29, 2001 at 2:00 a.m. for bleacher removal.
8. **KING WILLIAM FAIR:** East Guenther from South Alamo Street to South Main; King William Street from East Guenther to South St. Mary's Street; Madison from East Guenther to St. Mary's Street; Washington from Arsenal to Turner; East Johnson and East Sheridan Streets from the San Antonio River to South Alamo Street; East Sheridan from the San Antonio River to South Alamo Street; Beauregard and Turner Streets from Washington to South Alamo Street; Pancoast from Washington

to Durango Street; Arsenal Street from Washington to Main Streets; streets will be closed on Friday, April 27, 2001 from 7:00 a.m. until Saturday, April 28, 2001, 10:00 p.m. In addition, Eagleland Street from St. Mary's Street to Guenther Street will be closed on Saturday, April 28 from 6:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon for parade staging.

9. **ST. LUKE'S FIESTA FINALE:** Manitou Drive from 11:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 29, 2001. Also on this date and time, Winlock Drive from Horizon to Callaghan will be made temporarily one-way with traffic flowing north to south.
10. **FIESTA EN LA VILLA DE SAN FERNANDO:** East lane of Main Street closed at 10:00 p.m. on Wednesday, April 25, 2001 for set-up of booths. Main Street closed from Dolorosa to Commerce on Thursday, April 26, 2001 from 12:00 noon until 12:00 midnight; Friday, April 27, 2001 from 12:00 noon until 12:00 midnight; Saturday, April 28, 2001 from 12:00 noon until 12:00 midnight; Sunday, April 29, 2001 from 12:00 noon until 12:00 midnight.
11. **FIESTA FUNDAY SUNDAY PARADE:** IH-10 West Access road from Leon Springs Elementary School, 23881 IH-10 West to Leon Springs Dance Hall, 24135 IH-10 West. Forming area at Leon Springs Elementary School Parking Lot. Parade ends at Leon Springs Dance Hall Courtyard. Parade route will not cross Boerne Stage Road. Parade begins at 1:00 p.m. and ends at 1:30 p.m. Sunday, April 22, 2001.

POLICY ANALYSIS

Approval of this ordinance will allow for the timely planning, coordination and development of the Fiesta San Antonio events for 2001 in accordance with the adopted agreement between the City of San Antonio and the Fiesta Commission.

COORDINATION

These events have been coordinated with the City Manager's Office, the City Council Fiesta Committee, the Police Department, the Fire Department, the Public Works Department, the Parks & Recreation Department, the Building Inspections Department, the Metropolitan Health District, the Office of Budget and Management Analysis, the City Attorney's Office and the Fiesta Commission. All of the involved organizations concur with the staff recommendation to approve this request.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

Fiesta 1999 was the first year the City realized \$162,500 in revenue from the Fiesta Commission as required in our current contract. The City received \$180,000 in revenue for Fiesta 2000 and the minimum guarantee for Fiesta 2001 is \$197,500. This amount reflects proceeds derived from the minimum guarantee submitted by the Carnival Contractor, Alamo/Wade, Inc. to the Fiesta Commission, and in turn, the Fiesta Commission's calculated payment to the City.

This is the final year of the current contract with Alamo/Wade as the City's official carnival concessionaire. The Fiesta San Antonio Commission is now in the process of reviewing proposals from four (4) carnival firms for the next three (3) Fiesta years with an option for an additional two (2) years, a total term of five (5) years. The Fiesta Commission anticipates submitting a recommendation for Council review and action May, 2001.


The annual City expenditures for Fiesta San Antonio historically have been approximately \$900,000. The City provides police officers for traffic control and security at some Fiesta events. The City also provides inspectors, but concessionaires are required to pay the inspection fees as set in the annual budget. Revenues are received from Fiesta sponsors by separate contractual arrangements for rental of city facilities. This Fiesta year Alamo/Wade again has requested the addition of the Cattleman Square Parking Lot as an additional site for carnival rides. The Carnival Concessionaire has agreed to reimburse the City approximately \$37,000 for lost parking revenues and \$4,000 for additional fencing and site restoration services. The Carnival Concessionaire will also remit \$40,000 for police security required at the Cattleman Square site as this security is not included in the City's annual budget for additional Fiesta week sites.







Background

- **The Fiesta Commission is responsible for the organization, planning, operation and administration of official Fiesta events, including the carnival and parade concessions. (Ord. No: 88270)**
- **City Council approved W.G. Wade Shows/Alamo Attractions, Inc. to produce the Fiesta Carnival and administer official Parade Route Concessions.**
- **This ordinance approves street closures for various Fiesta 2001 events, the Battle of Flowers and Fiesta Flambeau Parades, and the Fiesta 2001 Carnival**

Fiesta 2001 Schedule


- **Fiesta 2001 officially begins Friday April 20 and ends April 29, 2001.**
