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AN ORDINANCE (1670)

DIRECTING WATER WORKS BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO CONSTRUCT  
MAINS FOR THE PROTECTION OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

That the report of the Committee consisting of Thos. H. Coghill, C. A. Hart, and Lewis C. Robbins, M.D., appointed by the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, to investigate conditions and places where it is necessary for the protection of Public Health and Safety to extend and construct water mains in the City of San Antonio, be and the same is hereby adopted by the Board of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

In accordance with said report, it appears that it is necessary to construct mains on the following streets within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, to-wit: Millard Street, from San Pedro Avenue east three blocks, Earl Street, from San Pedro Avenue east to

City Limits (150 feet west of McCullough Avenue), Henry and Lombardo Streets, between Hamilton and 18th Streets, Lampico Street, South Zarzamora Street, west to Elmendorf Creek.

Therefore, the Water Works Board of Trustees, in the performance of its duty, as a Department of the City Government of the City of San Antonio, be, and the same is hereby directed to construct forthwith water mains on the streets specified above, such mains to be of a size and capacity sufficient to supply water for use by the citizens of San Antonio adjacent to such places, and for use by the Fire Department of the City of San Antonio in the prevention and quenching of fires.

This Ordinance is passed for the protection of Public Health by supplying potable water to consumers and for sanitary sewage purposes and to prevent and control fires. A copy of this Ordinance and of the recommendations of the committee shall be certified by the City Clerk and transmitted to the General Manager of the Water Department.

LEVYING AN ADVALOREM AND OCCUPATION TAX FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CITY GOVERNMENT OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND LEVYING A TAX TO PAY THE INTEREST ON THE BONDED DEBT OF SAID CITY, AND TO CREATE A SINKING FUND THEREOF, AND A SPECIAL TAX FOR THE SUPPORT OF THE CARNEGIE LIBRARY IN SAID CITY, ALL SAID TAXES BEING LEVIED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JUNE 1, 1944 AND ENDING MAY 31, 1945.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

Section 1:- That there is hereby levied for general purposes for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, on all property, real, personal, and mixed, within the limits of the City of San Antonio, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of the State, and Ordinances of this City, an Advalorem Tax of and at the rate of \$1.145 upon every One Hundred Dollars of valuation.

Section 4:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$25,000.00 for Constructing Sidewalks and Curbing, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax of and at the rate of \$.000694 on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

SECTION 5:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$175,000.00 for Constructing a Police and Fire Station, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax of and at the rate of \$.003394 on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 6:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$375,000.00 for Opening and Widening Streets, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax of and at the rate of \$.006925 on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 7:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1913, in the sum of \$100,000.00 for the Construction of Concrete Bridges and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof, as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax of and at the rate of \$.002154 on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 11:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$900,000.00 for Street Paving, Storm Sewers and Drains and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax of and at the rate of \$.019651 on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 12:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$500,000.00 for Sanitary Sewers, Mains and Laterals, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax of and at the rate of \$.010311 on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 13:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$50,000.00 for Construction of Sidewalks and Curbing and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax of and at the rate of \$.000967 on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

Section 14:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on an issue of bonds dated September 1, 1919, in the sum of \$150,000.00 for Fire and Police Station Building, and to create a sinking fund for the payment thereof as they severally mature, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax of and at the rate of \$.003485 on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property mentioned in section 1 hereof.

Section 3:- That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 15, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 25th day of October, 1938, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1944 and ending May 31, 1945, a special tax at the rate of two Cents on every One Hundred Dollars of valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and laws of this state, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 15, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of said City.

AN ORDINANCE (1688)

DIRECTING THE WITHHOLDING OF A TAX UPON THE WAGES OF  
CITY EMPLOYEES, AND REPEALING ORDINANCE IN CONFLICT.

1. Beginning the 1st day of January 1945, the City of San Antonio is required to deduct and withhold a tax upon the wages of all employees.
2. The City of San Antonio has elected to withhold income tax from wages of its employees in accordance with the semi-monthly wage-bracket table as provided for, in the Individual Income Tax Act of 1944.
3. The City Treasurer and Auditor at the time of making up the payroll shall transfer the money deducted therefrom under the provisions of this ordinance, to a separate account in the City Depository of San Antonio, Texas, where they shall be deposited and designated as a "UNITED STATES GOVT TAX ACCOUNT". The money accumulated from such withholdings shall be paid by the City Treasurer to the United States, as provided by the Individual Income Tax Act of 1944.
4. The provisions of an ordinance dated 29 July 1943 now in effect relating to payroll procedure of the City are repealed.

We will pay you the par value thereof plus accrued interest from the date of the bonds to date of delivery to us at any bank in San Antonio, Texas.

It is understood and agreed that all laws pertaining to the issuance of Revenue Bonds in this state shall be complied with to the end that said bonds shall be secured by a first lien against the properties and the revenues therefrom, as provided by law, and that the bond ordinance shall contain such provisions as may be directed by our attorneys, and in addition to be secured by all the net revenues from the operation of the swimming pools to be built from the proceeds of these bonds. It is agreed that the city will enter into a contract satisfactory to us with a concessionaire to operate such concessions as will be built with a part of the proceeds from these bonds and that the contract will run the entire life of the bonds, that proper bond will be furnished by the concessionaire, and that all revenues received from such concessions will be pledged to payment of principal and interest of these bonds.

It is further understood and agreed that all net proceeds from the operation of the pools will be placed in a fund known as "The Bond Fund" at the close of each month, after expenses have been paid. During the first five year period the City, after paying the current interest and principal requirements will pay to the trustee Bank a sum equal to 1/5th the average interest and principal requirements for the first 19 years of the life of the bonds. Excess funds will then be used to call a part of the bonds maturing in 1965 in their inverse numerical order, it being understood, however, that prior to January 1st each year the City may ask for tenders of bonds of this maturity for payment. After five years from date (when a one year principal and interest requirement has been accumulated) the City will then be required to either thru tender or call use all funds in excess of current interest and principal requirements to retire the bonds due in 1965.

It is further understood and agreed that the City will maintain the pools and the grounds in first class shape at all times, and will have the City Health Department supervise the operations of the pools to the extent that they will at all times be sanitary and fit for use, in conformity with federal and State sanitary laws.

The City further agrees to maintain an entrance charge sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the bonds as they become due, and to comply with the other provisions of this proposal.

This proposal is made subject to our being furnished with the satisfactory approval of the engineer's plans, by the Health Departments of the United States, State of Texas and City of San Antonio, Texas.

It is agreed that prior to delivery of the bonds we will be furnished with satisfactory evidence that the City will be able to complete these pools and have them in operation by June 15, 1945, and it is further agreed that out of the proceeds of the sale of these bonds, or from other funds available, the City will deposit with the paying agent on the date said bonds are taken up by us, a sum sufficient to pay one year's interest on said bonds.

It is further understood and agreed that prior to delivery of said bonds and payment being made therefor, the City will furnish us with a complete certified copy of all legal proceedings had incident to the issuance of these bonds which will evidence their legality to the satisfaction of the Attorney General of the State of Texas and to the satisfaction of the firm of bond attorneys of our selection and, subject to their final unqualified approving opinion, we will purchase the bonds.
