## MB-460 AN ORDINANCE

Recognizing ownership by the United States Government of a certain storm sewer.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,

Section 1: That the City of San Antonio hereby recognizes the ownership by the United States Government, of a certain storm water sewer heretofore constructed by the United States for its own use and benefit, in Alamo Plaza, between the Federal Building and a point at the intersection of Crockett Street and Alamo Plaza.

Section 2: That in order to effect better drainage conditions the United States Government be, and is hereby granted permission to construct for its own use and benefit, a storm water sewer on Crockett Street, between the intersection of Crockett Street and Alamo Plaza to the San Antonio River, said sewer to be constructed in accordance with grade to be established by the City Engineer

Section 3: In consideration of this permit, all paving where disturbed by reason

of the condition of said sewer, shall be restored to its previous condition free of expense to the City of San Antonio.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 283                    **MB-461**      AN ORDINANCE

Ordering construction of storm sewer on Alamo Plaza, from near the Federal Building to Crockett Street and the connection of the existing inlets to the Government Storm sewer to this new City sewer. Exact location to be determined between City Engineers Dep't and Dep't of Parks.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, a storm water sewer be and is hereby ordered constructed on Alamo Plaza, and that the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund to pay the construction thereof.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

No. 284                    **- 462**      AN ORDINANCE

Authorizing the Mayor to accept deed of conveyance from Albin Seidel and Alexander Joske.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to accept deed of conveyance from Albin Seidel and Alexander Joske to a certain parcel of land appropriated by the City of San Antonio for the widening and straightening of Bowie Street, the consideration to be the payment of \$200.00 in cash to said Seidel and Joske, which sum is hereby appropriated out of the 1916 General Fund, and the construction of a sidewalk in front of the property of said Albin Seidel and Alexander Joske at the cost and expense of the City.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the ~~same~~ same shall take effect at once.

No. 285.                    **- 463**      AN ORDINANCE

Authorizing the payment of wages to City Laborers for the week ending March 3, 1917 and making an appropriation therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to issue warrants for the payment of wages to City Day Laborers for the week ending March 3, 1917, and that the following sums be and are hereby appropriated out of the several special funds for that purpose to-wit:

General Fund of 1916

\$1933.00

Petition of Lowry, Doolin Co., for permit to erect an electric sign at corner St Mary and Travis Street, as recommended by City Electrician.

At the request of Mr. C.M. Barnes and a committee of ladies, followed by motion of Commissioner Kearny, duly seconded and carried, the flag of the Republic of Texas was ordered raised at half mast on all anniversaries of the days on which the forces of the Republic suffered defeat at the hands of their enemies, and to full mast upon the anniversaries of those days on which the forces of the Republic prevailed over their enemies.
