

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, DECEMBER 18th, A.D.1922, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O.B.Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Rieden, Wright. Absent, Lambert.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

---MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation: J.F.Gibson, for refund of Auto for hire license. Paul R.Peters, for refund of jitney license. T.L.Hobbs, for refund of Cigarette License.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police: Protest of citizens against the sale of toy pistols. G.H & S.A.Ry for permit to build shelter house for crossing watchman.

Petition of Laurel Heights Methodist Church and citizens of the neighborhood, protesting against the erection of store buildings at corner of Belknap and Woodlawn, was read, and Building Inspector ordered to withhold permit for building until investigation could be had.

Petition of residents on E.Trenton Street to have name changed to Fifth Street, was read first time and laid over.

Petition requesting the name of Reservoir Street be changed to Pershing Avenue was read the third time and granted.

Commissioner Wright made the following recommendations, which were adopted: Grayburg Oil Co. for permit to erect filling station and install tanks and pumps at corner Victoria, Indiana and Hackberry Streets, granted. Gulf Refining Co. for permit to erect tank and pump at Hackberry & Aransas Sts.granted.

## AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating the sum of \$575.00 to be paid over to the State Treasurer of the State of Texas, for the purpose of conducting educational work in the City of San Antonio for the prevention of diseases, and repealing an ordinance passed and approved on the 14th day of December, A.D. 1922.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$575.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1922 General Fund and charged to the Health Department, to be paid to the Treasurer of the State of Texas for the use of the State Health Officer of the State of Texas, for the purpose of conducting an educational campaign in the City of San Antonio for the prevention of contagious and communicable diseases.

Section 2. The City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant in said sum of \$575.00 payable to the Treasurer of the State of Texas, and to deliver the same to the said Treasurer of the State of Texas.

Section 3. The ordinance passed and approved on the 14th day of December, A.D. 1922, and entitled "An ordinance appropriating the sum of \$575.00 to be paid over to the State Health Officer of the State of Texas for the purpose of conducting educational work in the City of San Antonio for the prevention of diseases", is hereby in all things repealed, and the warrant therein ordered to be issued is hereby cancelled and annulled.
