

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, JUNE 8th, A.D.1922, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Rieden, Wright. Absent, Lambert.

---MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

Petition of citizens withdrawing protest against dancing pavilion near River Avenue and Josephine Street was read and referred to the Mayor.

Communication from J. Locke in reference to taxes and rent on old Travis Street Fire ~~Eng~~ Station was read and referred to City Attorney.

Petition of Alexander Joske requesting river line on property was read and referred to City Engineer.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police: Business Mens Atheletic Club, for temporary permit to use So;edad Roof, pending erection of Fire Escapes. For arc lights on Lubbock Street.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation: J.F.Clifton, for refund of taxes. S.Sugarman, for refund of taxes. South Side Christian Church, for exemption from taxation.

Commissioner of Fire and Police recommended that petition of Central Baptist Church for permit to erect tent and conduct services at Pruitt Ave and Sommerset Road be granted. Adopted.

Commissioner Pfeiffer recommended that petition of A.W.Zerr for refund of taxes be granted. Adopted.

Upon recommendation of the City Engineer the paving of Grand Avenue from Austin Street to Avenue C was awarded the Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company.
