

AN ORDINANCE 27614

RECORD CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING RESULT OF AN ELECTION HELD MAY 30, 1959, ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE CITY'S ENTERING INTO A COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, RELATING TO THE CONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF 1500 LOW-RENT HOUSING UNITS.

WHEREAS, by Resolution passed and approved on November 26, 1958, the City Council of the City of San Antonio gave notice of its intention to enter into a cooperation agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas, relating to the development and construction by said Housing Authority of 1,500 low-rent housing units in the City of San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, prior to the expiration of the 60-day period prescribed by said statute, a petition bearing the valid signature of the number of qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, as prescribed by said statute was duly filed requesting that an election be held on whether or not the City Council should enter into such cooperation agreement; and

WHEREAS, The City Council, in response to said petition, ordered that an election on said question be held on Saturday, May 30, 1959, on the following proposition:

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio enter into a cooperation agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas, as authorized by Art. 12691, V.A.T.S., for the purpose of aiding and cooperating in the planning, undertaking, construction and operation of 1,500 low-rent housing units by said Housing Authority within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas?"

and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on the 30th day of May, 1959, in conformity with the election ordinance heretofore passed by the City Council and the result of said election has been certified and returned to this Council by the proper judges and clerks of said election; and

WHEREAS, this council has this day considered the returns of said election on the proposition of said election hereinabove stated, which was held on the 30th day of May, 1959; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council and the Council so finds that said election was in all respects lawfully held and said returns duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election the following votes:

"FOR THE EXECUTION BY THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO OF A COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, RELATIVE TO THE CONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE 1500 LOW-RENT HOUSING UNITS:

9887 votes;

"AGAINST THE EXECUTION BY THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO  
OF A COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUSING AUTHORITY  
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, RELATIVE TO THE  
CONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE 1500 LOW-RENT  
HOUSING UNITS"

11701 votes;

NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. The proposition for the execution of a cooperation agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas, relative to the construction and development of 1,500 low-rent housing units was not approved by a majority of the resident qualified electors voting in the election held May 30, 1959, and the City Council is not authorized to enter into cooperation agreement referred to in the resolution passed and approved by the City Council on November 26, 1958.

PROCLAMATION AND NOTICE OF  
ELECTION  
TO BE HELD ON THE 30TH DAY OF MAY,  
A. D. 1959

WHEREAS, at a meeting of the City Council of the City of San Antonio held in the Council Chamber at the City Hall, on the 30th day of April, A. D. 1959, the ordinance herein set out was duly and finally passed by said City Council to take effect immediately and same has been duly approved by the Mayor, said ordinance being in words and figures as follows:-

AN ORDINANCE

CALLING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 30TH DAY OF MAY, 1959, ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ENTERING INTO BY THE CITY OF A COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, RELATING TO THE CONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT OF 1,500 LOW-RENT HOUSING UNITS BY SAID HOUSING AUTHORITY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO

WHEREAS, by Resolution passed and approved on November 26, 1958, the City Council of the City of San Antonio gave notice of its intention to enter into a cooperation agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas, relating to the development and construction by said Housing Authority of 1,500 low-rent housing units in the City of San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, notice of such intention was duly given by publication as required by Art. 12691, V.A.T.S.; and

WHEREAS, prior to the expiration of the 60-day period prescribed by said statute, a petition bearing the valid signature of the number of qualified voters of the City of San Antonio, as prescribed by said statute was duly filed requesting that an election be held on whether or not the City Council should enter into such cooperation agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, in response to said petition, has determined that an election on said question shall be held on Saturday, May 30, 1959; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That an election be held in the said City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 30th day of May, 1959, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted to the qualified voters residing in the City of San Antonio:

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio enter into a cooperation agreement with the Housing Authority of the City of San Antonio, Texas, as authorized by Art. 12691, V.A.T.S., for the purpose of aiding and cooperating in the planning, undertaking, construction and operation of 1,500 low-rent housing units by said Housing Authority within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Texas?"

2. That voting machines shall be employed at the election herein ordered in accordance with the provisions of V.A.T.S. Election Code, Article 7.14, and voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes in the Office of the City Clerk, which absentee balloting shall be conducted in the manner made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on the subject, and said election shall be held at the polling places in the regularly prescribed voting precincts of the City of San Antonio, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 P.M. Central Standard Time. Such Voting precincts and polling places being as follows:

3. All qualified voters residing in the City of San Antonio shall be eligible to vote at said election.

4. The ballots for said election shall have written or printed thereon the follows:

"FOR THE EXECUTION BY THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO  
OF A COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUSING  
AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS,  
RELATIVE TO THE CONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT  
OF 1,500 LOW-RENT HOUSING UNITS."

"AGAINST THE EXECUTION BY THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO  
OF A COOPERATION AGREEMENT WITH THE HOUSING  
AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS,  
RELATIVE TO THE CONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT  
OF 1,500 LOW-RENT HOUSING UNITS."

5. A copy of this Ordinance, signed by the Mayor of said City, and attested by the City Clerk shall serve as proper notice of said election. Notice shall be given in accordance with Article 704, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, of 1925, as amended. The Mayor is authorized and directed to have a copy of said notice posted at the City Hall in said City and at each of the voting places in said City, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date fixed for holding said election. He shall also cause said notice to be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in the COMMERCIAL RECORDER, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of San Antonio, the date of the first publication to be not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date set for said election. The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws governing general elections.

6. An emergency exists for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, welfare, and safety, requiring that this ordinance become effective immediately, therefore, upon passage, this ordinance by an affirmative vote of six (6) members of the City Council, shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.
