Mayor Steves stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of considering an ordinance annexing certain areas to the City.

The City Clerk then read the proposed ordinance aloud in full as follows after which the Mayor asked for a motion regarding same. Mr. Keller seconded by Mr. Tucker moved that the ordinance as read the first time be ordered published. The motion was carried by the following vote: Ayes, Lozano, Schmidt, Keller, Tucker, Roper, Cassidy, Greeman, Steves; Nays, White, absent.

J, AN ORDINANCE

- PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE LIMITS OF THE
CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN
ADDITIONAL TERRITORY LYING ADJACENT TO AND SURROUNDING
THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, SAID ADDITIONAL
TERRITORY BEING 120.04 SQUARE MILES MORE OR LESS SITUATED
IN BEXAR COUNTY, TEXAS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. THAT the boundary and limits of the City of San Antonio are hereby changed and fixed and the extension thereof provided for and additional territory lying adjacent to said City in Bexar County, Texas, being 120.04 square miles more or less per plat attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby annexed and the present bounds and limits of said City are hereby changed so as to include all of that territory lying and situated between the present boundary line of the City limits of the City of San Antonio and the line which by this Ordinance shall be established as the City limits. The City limits boundary line shall hereafter be as follows:

2. BEGINNING at a corner of the present City Limits, same being at the intersection of the southwest line of the Bitters Road and the southeast line of the Wetmore Road and the northwest line of the Missouri Pacific Right-of-Way line:

THENCE in a southeasterly direction along said southwest line of the Bitters Road to an intersection with the center line of the Nacogdoches Road;

THENCE in a southeasterly direction along a straight line to a point at the intersection of the center lines of the Zercher Road (Loop 13) and the Perrin Beitel Road;

THENCE in an easterly direction along the center line of the Zercher Road (Loop 13) to an intersection with the center line of U. S. Highway 81 (Austin Road);

THENCE in a NORTHEASTERLY DIRECTION ALONG THE CENTER LINE OF said U. S. Highway 81 to an intersection with the center line of the M.K. & T. R.R. Main Line rails;

THENCE in a southerly direction along said center line of the M.K. & T.R.R. Main Line rails to an intersection with the center line of the Rittiman Road;

THENCE in a southerly direction along a straight line to a point at the intersection of the center lines of the W. W. White Road and U. S. Highway 90 (East);

THENCE in a southerly, southeasterly and southwesterly direction along the center line of said W. W. White Road to an intersection with the center line of the Goliad Road;

THENCE in a westerly direction along a straight line to a point at the intersection of the center lines of the Chavaneaux Road and South Flores Street;

THENCE continuing westward along said center line of Chavaneaux Road to an intersection with the center line of the Palo Alto Road;

THENCE in a northwesterly direction along a straight line to a point at the intersection of the center lines of the Pearsall Road and the Dwyer Road;

THENCE in a westerly and northwesterly direction along the center line of said Dwyer Road to an intersection with the center line of U. S. Highway 90 (West);

THENCE in an easterly direction along the center line of said U. S. Highway 90 (West) to an intersection with the center line of the Pinn Road;

THENCE in a northerly direction along said center line of the Pinn Road to an intersection with the center line of West Commerce Street;

THENCE in a northerly direction along a straight line to a point at the intersection of the center lines of State Highway 16 (Bandera Road) and the Huebner Road;

THENCE in a northeasterly direction along said center line of the Huebner Road to an intersection with the center line of the Lockhill-Selma Road;

THENCE in a northeasterly direction along a straight line to a point at the intersection of the center lines of the Blanco Road and the Bitters Road;

THENCE in a northeasterly and a southeasterly direction along said center line of the Bitters Road to an intersection with the center line of the Jones-Maltzberger Road;

THENCE in a southwesterly direction along said center line of the Jones Maltzberger Road to an intersection with the southwest line of the Bitters Road;

THENCE in a southeasterly direction along said southwest line of the Bitters Road to the place of BEGINNING.

3. The strip of land 500 feet in width lying immediately adjacent to and outside of the hereinabove described new boundary line established by this ordinance shall be included within the City limits and is hereby annexed.

4. The aforesaid boundary and limits shall include the territory over which the City of San Antonio has jurisdiction.

5. That the City of San Antonio shall become liable and bound for the payment of all legal indebtedness, or pro-rata thereof, owing by said area, territory or district for which the City is justly liable upon annexation to the City.

6. That the additional territory and area so annexed shall be a part of the City of San Antonio, and the inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to all of the rights and privileges of all the other citizens of the City of San Antonio, and shall be bound by the acts, ordinances and regulations of the City of San Antonio.

7. That the City Engineer shall change the records of his office to conform to the new bounds and limits of the City of San Antonio, as changed and fixed by this ordinance.

8. The City Tax Assessor shall change the records of his office to conform to the new bounds and limits, and shall proceed to assess taxes and collect taxes on the property included in the new bounds and limits for the next fiscal year, as now provided by the Charter and ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

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9. After the introduction of this ordinance, and after it has been amended as desired by the City Council of the City of San Antonio, for final passage, it shall be published in the "Commercial Recorder", in the City of San Antonio, one time; and shall not be passed finally thereafter until at least thirty days have elapsed after said publication.

10. APPROVED for PUBLICATION this 12th day of March, 1952.
