

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 27TH, A.D.1919, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Sam C. Bell, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Coy, Heuermann, Wright. Absent, Lambert.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$150.00 to pay P.T.Reynolds.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$150.00 be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund, warrant for which shall be issued to P.T.Reynolds, for services rendered as head book-keeper in the Tax Assessors office.

AN ORDINANCE

Directing the payment of salaries and wages for services rendered by officers and employes of the City of San Antonio for the month of February, 1919, and appropriating money therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio , that, the following sums of money, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated for the payment of officers and employes for the several accounts and departments as specified in the attached schedule as salaries and wages for services rendered to the City during the month of February, 1919, as per pay rolls:

for which amounts City warrants shall issue and be delivered to said respective payees, providing that all persons performing services for the City for uncertain periods, may be paid on pay rolls certified to be correct by the Commissioner of the Department or the Chief of the Division in which they are engaged, and such person so paid shall thereupon receipt said pay roll, all as provided by the charter.

AN ORDINANCE

Making appropriation for the payment of 1918 State and County taxes on lots 7 and 8 , City Block 628, known as Walnut Street Loading Station Property.

WHEREAS, when the City acquired title to lots 7 and 8, City Block 628, from Ralph H. Hugo, Executor, the State and County taxes for the year 1918 were pro-rated, the said Ralph H. Hugo allowing a credit to the City on account of said taxes amounting to \$23.65, the remainder of said tax being assumed by the City as a part of the consideration therefor; and

WHEREAS, said taxes, amounting to \$47.38, were assessed against said property in the name of Ralph H. Hugo, Executor; and

WHEREAS, said taxes, together with taxes on other property, due by said executor, were paid to the County Tax Collector by R.T. Carlile on January 31, 1919.

Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That the sum of Forty-seven and 38/100 (\$47.38) Dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1918 General Fund, warrant for which shall be drawn to the order of R.T. Carlile, in payment of the State and County taxes for the year 1918 on Lots 7 seven and Eight (8) in City Block Six Hundred and Twenty Eight (628) as per certificate of tax collector of Bexar County, Texas, hereto attached.

Commissioner Wright made the following recommendations, which were adopted:
 Petition of Joe Morales, for permit to install gasoline equipment at 1823 Monterey Street, granted.
 Petition of A. Heuberger, for permit to erect an electric sign at 206 N. Presa Street, granted.

Commissioner Coy recommended that petition of E.G.Rall Grain Co. for cancellation of taxes be granted. Adopted.
