MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL HELD IN THE  
COUNCIL CHAMBER OF THE CITY HALL ON THURSDAY  
MARCH 26, 1953 AT 10:00 A.M. (REGULAR MEETING)

## PRESENT:

Mayor Steves Presiding.

Invocation by Father George - San Fernando Cathedral

On motion of Mr. Schmidt seconded by Mr. Lozano the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

A hearing was now held on rezoning of property on Elmendorf and West Gramercy. Mr. V. A. Harrison, applicant, appeared and stated that his plans was to erect a post office on the site involved.

Mr. Parker, the Director of Planning, then informed<sup>him</sup> that under government regulations for post office sites, it would not be necessary to rezone the property but that a permit for erection could be granted by the Planning Commission. It was recommended that the matter be referred back to the Zoning Commission and for Mr. Harrison to arrange with the Commission and to show plans of the site.

On motion of Mr. Keller it was unanimously voted to refer the matter back to the Zoning Commission.

The City Clerk read a letter addressed to the City Council submitting information with regard to the selection of officials of the forthcoming Election. He gave them information with regard to the lists received from various contestants in the election and asked for approval of the suggested list of judges and clerks by ordinance.

Mr. White asked that Mr. Elton Cude from the "San Antonians" Ticket be heard.

Mr. Cude stated to the Council that three members of the list suggested to serve in Precinct #108, namely Edgar Haecker, Mrs. Eurlia Haecker and John Semlinger, were not within that portion of Precinct #108 which has been annexed to the City, hence ineligible to serve. The City Clerk informed Mr. Cude that if these people were found to be outside the city limits they could not serve, after which a vote was taken and the following ordinance was unanimously adopted.
