

AN ORDINANCE

BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING RESULT OF AN ELECTION ON THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF THE FOLLOWING BONDS: \$3,952,000.00 STREET CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENT BONDS; \$2,250,000.00 SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENT AND EXTENSION BONDS; \$2,750,000.00 STORM SEWER AND DRAINAGE BONDS; \$1,900,000.00 SAN ANTONIO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT AND EXTENSION BONDS; \$1,850,000.00 POLICE HEADQUARTERS BUILDING BONDS; \$268,000.00 FIRE STATION BONDS; \$1,600,000.00 PARKS AND RECREATION IMPROVEMENT AND EXTENSION BONDS; \$190,000.00 WITTE MUSEUM ADDITIONS AND IMPROVEMENT BONDS; \$240,000.00 BRANCH PUBLIC LIBRARY BONDS.

WHEREAS, heretofore on the 3rd day of November, A.D., 1955, the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, passed an ordinance calling an election to be held in said city on the 29th day of November, 1955, on the following propositions:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$3,952,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of building, grading, paving, curbing, and improving the streets of said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,250,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of improving and extending the Sanitary Sewer System of said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,750,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for

"the purpose of constructing and improving storm sewers, and the storm drainage appurtenances and accessories thereto of said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 4

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$1,900,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of acquiring rights of way and improving and extending facilities and runways at the San Antonio International Airport owned by said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 5

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$1,850,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building in said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 6

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$268,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping fire stations within said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 7

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$1,600,000.00 maturing serially in such

"installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of acquiring property for and extending, improving, and constructing Parks and Recreational facilities in said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 8

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$240,000.00, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of constructing Branch Public Libraries and the purchase of sites incidental thereto in said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 9

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$190,000.00, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 4% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of improving and extending the Witte Museum, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

WHEREAS, said election was duly held at the time and places specified after due notice as required by law had been given by posting and publication; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on the 29th day of November, 1955, in conformity with the election ordinance heretofore passed by the City Council and the result of said election has been certified and returned to this Council by the proper judges and clerks thereof; and

WHEREAS, this Council has today considered the returns of said election, on the propositions of said election hereinabove stated, which was held on the 29th day of November, 1955; and

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council and the Council so finds that said election was in all respects lawfully held and

said returns duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election the following votes:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"FOR THE ISSUANCE OF STREET CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENT BONDS" 15167 Votes;
"AGAINST THE ISSUANCE OF STREET CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENT BONDS" 12742 Votes;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS:-

1. That Proposition No. 1 for the issuance of \$3,952,000.00 of Street Construction and Improvement Bonds was sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with said Proposition No. 1;

That Proposition No. 2 for the issuance of \$2,250,000.00 of Sanitary Sewer Improvement and Extension Bonds was sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered the same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with said Proposition No. 2;


That Proposition No. 3 for the issuance of \$2,750,000.00 of Storm Sewer and Drainage Bonds was sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered the same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with said Proposition No. 3;

That Proposition No. 6 for the issuance of \$268,000.00 of Fire Station Bonds was sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered the same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with said Proposition No. 6.


2. That Propositions No. 4 for the issuance of San Antonio International Airport Improvement and Extension Bonds, Proposition No. 5 for the issuance of a new Police Headquarters Building Bonds, Proposition No. 7 for the issuance of Parks and Recreation Improvement and Extension Bonds, Proposition No. 8 for the issuance of Branch Public Library Bonds, and Proposition No. 9 for the issuance of Witte Museum Improvement and Extension Bonds were not approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said City who duly rendered the same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, pursuant to the voters' disapproval of Propositions No. 4, 5, 7, 8 and 9, hereby declare said propositions disapproved.

3. Whereas, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of order, good government and public safety that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by a vote of six (6) members of the City Council, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.
