AN ORDINANCE **MK-993**

RELEASING CLARA M. WATSON AND HER PROPERTY FROM A LIEN RESULTING FROM THE IMPROVEMENT OF GRAYSON STREET.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That the City of San Antonio for and in consideration of the accord and satisfaction of the debt;

AN ORDINANCE

Repealing an Ordinance "Providing for the Mayor Contingent Fund."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that,

An Ordinance "Providing for the Mayor Contingent Fund", passed and approved on the 4th day of June, 1928, and providing for the payment to the Mayor of the sum of Four Hundred and Sixteen and 66/100 Dollars (\$416.66) on the first day of each month, to be used by him to meet immediate incidental and contingent expenses as may arise from time to time, be and the same is in all respects repealed, effective April 1, 1932.

Mayor Chambers, introduced the following resolution, which was on his motion adopted by unanimous vote.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Mrs. Clara Driscoll Sever has given unselfishly of her time, her means, and her talent, in preserving to posterity that sacred Shrine of Liberty, the Alamo, whose walls and grounds are hallowed by the blood of martyrs, shed in the immortal cause of freedom; and,

WHEREAS, through her efforts this Cradle of Liberty has been rescued from the ceaseless march of commercialism; and,

WHEREAS, the people of Texas owe Mrs. Sever, that patriotic, unselfish citizen, a debt of everlasting gratitude; and,

WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of San Antonio desires to assist in perpetuating to a grateful posterity the record of her unselfish loyalty to the memory of those whom we revere, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That we, the City Commission of the City of San Antonio, in council assembled, do hereby recognize as invaluable her services to the State of Texas in rescuing from commercial encroachments that hallowed Mission and its surrounding grounds, recognizing her patriotic devotion to this cause as comparable with the unselfish sacrifices of those heroes whose memories she has done so much to perpetuate, we here publicly express our gratitude to her and place upon the official records of the City of the Alamo this expression of our deep sense of appreciation, representative of the feeling of the citizenship generally, and in full confidence that her memory will be perpetually enshrined in the hearts and minds of those multitudes yet unborn until time shall be no more.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

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That this resolution be spread on the minutes of the City Commission;

That a copy of same be presented to Mrs. Sever, signed personally by the Mayor and each of the Commissioners, attested by the City Secretary, and under the impress of the Seal of the City of San Antonio; and

That a copy of this resolution be handed to the press for publication.
