AN ORDINANCE 98-123

DESIGNATING THE ALAMO NATIONAL BANK OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, AS A GENERAL DEPOSITORY OF FUNDS BELONGING TO THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, AND APPROVING THE BOND OF SUCH DEPOSITORY.
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

THAT WHEREAS, THE ALAMO NATIONAL BANK of San Antonio, Texas, has been duly selected as a general depository of approximately ONE-HALF of all funds belonging to or controlled by said City, and the said The Alamo National Bank has executed and filed with the City Clerk a bond conditioned as required by law, which said bond has been approved by the Mayor of the City of San Antonio, Texas, subject to the concurrence of the Commissioners.

SECTION ONE: That the bond of the Alamo National Bank, same being in the principal sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00), Executed by the said Alamo National Bank, as principal, and JOSEPH COURVAD, WM. GREEN, ERNEST STEVES, OTTO MEFERSCHIEDT, ERNEST L. BROWN, J. B. MARTINDALE, G. A. C. HALFF, GEO. C. VAUGHN AND C. C. GIBBS, as sureties; be and the same is in all things accepted and approved by the Board of Commissioners, and ordered filed and recorded by the City Clerk and retained in the archives of the City of San Antonio!

SECTION TWO: That the Alamo National Bank be, and it is hereby designated as a general depository of and for ONE-HALF of the funds belonging to and controlled by the City of San Antonio, on deposit with all banks; whether general funds, special funds, or special trust funds, or from whatever source derived; all of which have been, or will be, deposited in said general depository, for the use and benefit of the City of San Antonio, in conformity with the purpose of said funds, as provided by law, and subject to all terms, conditions and provisions imposed by the laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, for such matters made and provided.

Said Alamo National Bank as such depository, shall pay to the City of San Antonio interest at the rate of three and one tenth (3.10%) per cent per annum upon daily balances on deposit, to be computed and paid monthly.

SECTION THREE: ~~That~~ in accordance with the proposal and bond of said Alamo National Bank, it has obligated itself to lend to the City of San Antonio, or pay its warrants issued by said City of San Antonio, in such amounts as the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio may desire to borrow, or obtain to meet the general expenses of said City, for the remainder of the current fiscal year, in such sums per month as may be desired by said City; Provided, however that said Alamo National Bank shall not be required to lend to the City of San Antonio, or to pay warrants, where/^{such}loan, if made, or the warrants, if paid, together with all previous loans made to the City of San Antonio, and all previous warrants issued by the City and paid by said Bank for the fiscal year beginning with the first day of June, A. D. 1926, and ending on the 31st day of May, 1927, in excess of one-half of ninety per cent (90%) of the estimated uncollected and unpledged revenue for the fiscal year 1926, said fiscal year beginning June 1, 1926, and ending May 31, 1927, The City is to pay to the Alamo National Bank, interest on all such loans, and pay interest upon all warrants issued by said City and paid by said Bank, provided warrants are issued instead of notes, from the date of such notes or from the date of payment of said warrants by said Bank for the City of

San Antonio, until June 20, 1927, at the rate of four and one-half (4½%) per cent per annum payable monthly.

At the option of the Alamo National Bank, the City of San Antonio shall, so far as is legally premissible, issue to said Bank as requested by it, notes in lieu of warrants previously cashed by said bank, said notes to be in denomination of \$50,000.00 each, payable at San Antonio, Texas, on or before June 20, 1927, and to bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum, payable monthly, as it accrues; said bank to be provided with satisfactory evidence and legal opinions showing said notes to be legally issued obligations of the City of San Antonio and that they are secured by First Lien on all of the uncollected, unpledged revenue of the City of San Antonio.

A lien is hereby created in favor of said Alamo National Bank, on the current general fund revenue of the City of San Antonio, for said fiscal year, to secure the payment of all principal sums that may be loaned to said City, or that may be advanced by said Alamo National Bank, upon warrants that may be issued by said City, together with interest thereon at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum from the date such loan is made or such warrant or warrants are issued and paid by said Bank until June 20, 1927.

SECTION FOUR: All matters and things concerning such depository and all things in connection with the City funds or moneys, to be deposited therein and all business with said depository shall be subject to, and governed by the laws of the State of Texas, and by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

SECTION FIVE: This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance, for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect immediately after its passage.

AN ORDINANCE 08-124

AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO PROMISSORY NOTES, TO EVIDENCE MONEY BORROWED FOR THE USE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO IN ANTICIPATION OF THE RECEIPTS OF TAXES AND REVENUES FOR THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR; PLEDGING AS SECURITY FOR SUCH LOAN THE UNCOLLECTED TAXES AND REVENUES OF SAID CITY FOR SAID YEAR.

WHEREAS, the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, have submitted a proposition to the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio to loan to said City the funds required to pay the current expense debts, incurred during the present fiscal year, and to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year; and to accept from said City, to evidence such loans, promissory notes bearing four and one-half (4½%) per cent interest per annum, which proposition has been accepted by said Commissioners; therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1: That for the purpose of paying off the debts of the City of San Antonio, incurred for current expenses during the present fiscal year, beginning June 1, 1926, and to pay the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year, ending May 31, 1927, there shall be borrowed and secured from the City National Bank, of San Antonio, Texas, an

advance of money for said purpose in the amount of ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,300,000.00), and there shall be borrowed and secured from the Alamo National Bank, of San Antonio, Texas, and advance of money for said purpose in the amount of ONE MILLION THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,300,000.00), which amounts do not exceed the current estimates income of said City for said fiscal year.

Section 2: That to evidence said loans, promissory notes of the City of San Antonio shall be executed and delivered to said City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and said Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, under and by virtue of the Charter of said City, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

Section 3: Said notes shall be numbered consecutively from one (1) to Fifty-two (52), both inclusive, and shall be of the denomination of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) each, aggregating the sum of TWO MILLION SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,600,000.00).

Section 4: One-half of said notes, to-wit, all notes bearing odd numbers, such as Nos. 1, 3, 5, 7, and each successive alternate number of said series, shall be payable to the order of the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and one-half of said notes, to-wit, all notes bearing even numbers, such as 2, 4, 6, 8, and each successive alternate number of said series, shall be payable to the order of the Alamo National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, all of which said notes shall be dated the _____ day of July, 1926; shall become due and payable on or before the 20th day of June, 1927; and shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per centum ($4\frac{1}{2}\%$) per annum, from date thereof until paid; provided, that interest shall be paid only on cash actually advanced on said notes and only from the dates of such advancements.

Section 5: Said notes shall be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, attested by the City Clerk, of said City, and the corporate seal of said City shall be impressed upon each of said notes,

Section 6: That to secure the payment of said notes, and all interest thereon, the current revenues of the City of San Antonio, arising from taxation and all other sources, for the fiscal year June 1, 1926 to May 31, 1927, are hereby irrevocably pledged; and said notes and all interest thereon shall be paid from said current income before such revenues may be lawfully appropriated to any other purpose or object whatsoever.

Section 7: That the proceeds of said loan shall be used first to take up and pay off the outstanding indebtedness, incurred for current expenses of said City during the present fiscal year, and the remainder of said proceeds shall be advanced as the notes are delivered by the City and such proceeds shall be deposited to the credit of the City of San Antonio under the provisions of the City Depository Contract, to be used in the payment of the current expenses of said City for the remainder of said fiscal year.

Section 8: The form of said notes shall be substantially as follows:

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, THE CITY NATIONAL BANK, of San Antonio, Texas, a banking institution duly organized and conducted under the laws of the United States, as Principal and FREDERICK TERRELL, HARRY H. ROGERS, JOHN A. KERR, OTTO WAHRMUND, A. KRONKOSKY, W.W. COLLIER, W. R. KING and R. F. Spencer as sureties, are held and firmly bound and obligated unto the CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, a municipal corporation of the State of Texas, and County of Bexar, in the sum of ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00) for the payment of which in and unto said CITY well and truly to be made we do hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, administrators and successors, jointly and severally, by these presents.

THE CONDITIONS OF THIS OBLIGATIONS, HOWEVER, ARE SUCH that, whereas the above bounden principal has been duly selected by the Commissioners of said City as a GENERAL DEPOSITORY OF AND FOR ONE-HALF, more or less, of the Funds belonging to or controlled by said City, except as otherwise specified in the ordinance prepared for the designation of such depository, the form of which ordinance is hereto attached; and said depositor has obligated itself to pay to the City interest on daily balances of all such funds at the rate of three and one tenth per cent (3.10%) per annum, to be computed and paid monthly; and has further obligated itself to lend to the City one-half of such amounts as the Board of Commissioners of said City may desire to borrow to meet the expenditures of said City for each current fiscal year during the continuance of said agreement as based on the tentative budget of said City for such year, the City to pay interest on all such loans from the date thereof at the rate of four and one-half per cent (4½%) per cent per annum; the City to secure such loans and issue notes therefor; all as provided by the Finance Ordinance of the City, with the right reserved by the bank to cancel such depository contract on thirty (30) day's written notice; and

WHEREAS, the further conditions of this obligation are such that the said banking institution shall and will faithfully perform all the duties and obligations devolving upon it as such depository by law, or by the charter and ordinances of said City, and especially what is known as the "Finance Ordinances" of the City; and shall and will ^{well} and truly pay upon presentation and checks properly drawn upon it on behalf of said City against any and all funds so deposited or credited, whenever any such fund or funds shall be in said depository or chargeable thereto and applicable to the payment of any such warrant and check; and that all funds and moneys of the City of San Antonio so deposited, together with all special trust funds so

deposited by said City, shall and will be faithfully kept and, with interest thereon, properly and correctly disbursed, paid over and accounted for according to law, and the charter and ordinances of said City.

And it is further agreed by all parties hereto, including sureties, that this bond shall be held to be an independent common law obligation in accordance with its face and tenor, as well as a bond required by statute, charter and ordinance; and all proceedings and prerequisites herein recited or required by law as preliminaries to the selection of such depository shall be conclusively presumed to have been duly and regularly had and performed before the execution of this bond; wholly regardless of defects or omissions, if any, in such preliminaries; and that at the time when this bond is presented to the City for approval and names of all sureties expected to join in this bond appear as signatories hereto;

NOW THEREFORE, if the said depository or principal hereinbefore named shall well and truly comply with all the terms and conditions of this obligation, then and in such case this obligation shall become null and void; otherwise to remain in full force and effect.

AN ORDINANCE 88-126

AMENDING SECTION TWO OF THE "JITNEY" ORDINANCE, PASSED ON THE 5th DAY OF APRIL, A. D. 1926.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

That Section Two of An Ordinance passed and approved April 5th, 1926, and recorded in Ordinance Book G, page 311, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved on the 30th day of June, 1924, and recorded in Ordinance Book G, page 175, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved on the 20th day of January, 1922, and recorded in Ordinance Book F, pages 618-619, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved December 1, 1921, and recorded in Ordinance Book F, pages 599-605, be and the same is amended by adding thereto the following Section:-

TWELFTH ROUTE

Beginning at the intersection of Broadway and Army

Boulevard;

Thence along Army Boulevard to Pine Street;
From this point the route traverses the United States Military Reservation to the intersection of New Braunfels Avenue and M Street;

Thence along M Street to the Austin Road;
Thence along the Austin Road to the 6th Street entrance to Camp Travis;

From this point the route traverses the United States Military Reservation;

Thence returning over the same route, in the inverse order, to the intersection of Army Boulevard and Haywood Street;

Thence over Haywood Street to Braham Boulevard;
Thence over Braham Boulevard to Broadway;

Thence along Broadway to Army Boulevard, the place of beginning.

Every motor vehicle operated on this TWELFTH ROUTE shall have a seating capacity of not less than twenty (20) persons and be completely enclosed by metal or wood sides and glass windows; no motor vehicle shall be operated on this TWELFTH ROUTE unless equipped with pneumatic tires; and on this TWELFTH ROUTE there shall be maintained a schedule whereby local transportation shall be furnished from six o'clock in the morning until twelve o'clock the following night, at intervals of not less than thirty (30) minutes.

That Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved April 5th, 1926, and recorded in Ordinance Book G, page 311, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved on the 30th day of June, 1924, and recorded in Ordinance Book G, page 175, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved on the 20th day of January, 1922, and recorded in Ordinance Book F, pages 618-619, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved December 1, 1921, and recorded in Ordinance Book F, pages 599-605, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following Section:-

THIRTEENTH ROUTE

Beginning at the corner of Travis and St. Mary's Streets;
Thence along Travis Street to Soledad Street;
Thence along Soledad Street to Romana Plaza;
Thence along Main Avenue to Laurel Street;
Thence along Laurel Street to Fredericksburg Road;
Thence along Fredericksburg Road to Woodlawn Avenue;
Thence along Woodlawn Avenue to Zarzamora Street;
Thence along Zarzamora Street to Huisache Avenue;
Thence along Huisache Avenue to Montrose Avenue;
Returning over the same route, in the inverse order, to Romana Plaza;
Thence along Navarro Street to St. Mary's Street;
Thence along St. Mary's Street to place of beginning.

Every motor vehicle operated on this THIRTEENTH ROUTE shall have a seating capacity of not less than Twenty (20) persons and be completely enclosed by metal or wood sides and glass windows; no motor vehicle shall be operated on this THIRTEENTH ROUTE unless equipped with pneumatic tires; and on this THIRTEENTH ROUTE there shall be maintained a schedule whereby local transportation shall be furnished from six o'clock in the morning until twelve o'clock the following night, at intervals of not less than twenty (20) minutes.

AN ORDINANCE 08-128

AMENDING SECTION TWO OF THE "JITNEY" ORDINANCE PASSED ON THE 5th DAY OF APRIL, A. D. 1926.

That Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved April 5th, 1926, and recorded in Ordinance Book G, page 311, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved on the 30th day of June, 1924, and recorded in Ordinance Book G, page 175, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved on the 20th day of January 1922, and recorded in Ordinance Book F, pages 618-619, amending Section Two of an Ordinance passed and approved December 1, 1921, and recorded in Ordinance Book F, pages 599-605, be and the same is hereby amended so that the SEVENTH ROUTE therein stipulated shall read as follows:-

SEVENTH ROUTE.

Beginning at the intersection of Jefferson and Travis Streets:

Thence west along Travis Street to Navarro Street;
Thence north along Navarro Street to Romana Street;
Thence along Romana Street to Romana Plaza;
Thence across Romana Plaza to Main Avenue;
Thence north along Main Avenue to French Place;
Thence west on French Place to Belknap Place;
Thence north on Belknap Place to West Woodlawn Avenue;
Thence west on West Woodlawn Avenue to the Fredericksburg Road;
Thence northwest on the Fredericksburg Road to West Avenue;

Thence returning over the same streets, in the inverse order, to the intersection of Navarro and Martin Streets;

Thence south along Jefferson Street to the point of Beginning.

AN ORDINANCE 08-129

AMENDING SECTION 1, CHAPTER 18 OF THE REVISED CRIMINAL ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

SECTION 1. That Section 1, Chapter 18 of the Revised Criminal Ordinances of the City of San Antonio, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows, to-wit:-

"SECTION 1 In all cases where a fine is imposed by or in the Corporation Court, in default of immediate payment thereof, the defendant shall be imprisoned in the City Prison, or required to work on the streets or other public work in the city, under the direction of the police, until the fine is paid, allowing Three (\$3.00) Dollars per day until the sum amounts to that of the fine."

SECTION 2. This Ordinance being of urgent and immediate public necessity for the immediate preservation of the public peace and safety, it is further ordained by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that the same be in force ^{from} and after its passage and approval.

AN ORDINANCE 08-130

Ordering an election to be held in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified tax-paying electors of said City, eleven (11) certain separate propositions to borrow money on the credit of said City, and to issue bonds of said City therefor, the proceeds from the sale of which shall be used in effecting and constructing the following permanent public improvements in and for said City, viz:-- (1) Bonds in the sum of \$50,000.00 for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hospital building; (2) Bonds in the sum of \$250,000.00 for the purpose of constructing necessary permanent additions to the present City Hall building; (3) Bonds in the sum of \$150,000.00 for the purpose of building incinerators and garbage loading stations, and acquiring sites therefor; (4) Bonds in the sum of \$750,000.00 for the purpose of constructing sewers and drains, and acquiring any land necessary therefor; (5) Bonds in the sum of \$300,000.00 for the purpose of paving and grading the public streets and public places of the City; (6) Bonds in the sum of \$250,000.00 for the purpose of constructing bridges; (7) Bonds in the sum of \$900,000.00 for the purpose of opening, widening and straightening public streets and places; (8) Bonds in the sum of \$150,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring land and sites for public parks, and constructing permanent improvements in the public parks of the City; (9) Bonds in the sum of \$125,000.00 for the purpose of constructing suitable buildings for the Police and Fire Departments, and acquiring necessary sites therefor; (10) Bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00 for the purpose of constructing and completing a public Auditorium building, and completing the acquiring of a site therefor; (11) Bonds in the sum of \$600,000.00 for the purpose of permanently improving the San Antonio River, San Pedro and Alazan Creeks, by widening, deepening, altering, changing and damming the channels thereof, and constructing levees and walls along and near the same, and building dams, dykes and reservoirs at and near the head waters
