

AN ORDINANCE **80 05 5**

AUTHORIZING THE CLOSING, VACATING, ABANDONING AND QUITCLAIMING OF IMPROVED NAPIER AVENUE, MISSION ROAD AND WOODHULL DRIVE IN EXCHANGE FOR THE RELOCATION OF NAPIER AVENUE AND MISSION ROAD IN CONNECTION WITH THE PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT OF A NEW VISITOR CENTER BY THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, in connection with the proposed development of a new Visitor's Center as part of the San Antonio Missions National **Historic Park**, the U.S. DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, **NATIONAL PARK SERVICE**, as "PETITIONER", has requested that the CITY OF SAN ANTONIO close, vacate, abandon and quitclaim certain improved portions of Napier Avenue, Mission Road and Woodhull Drive to be able to proceed with its development of a New Visitor Center and in exchange the **NATIONAL PARK SERVICE** will relocate Napier Avenue and Mission Road and, once relocated and constructed, they will become part of the City of San Antonio's street system; and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 75313 passed and approved February 20, 1992, a letter of intent was executed to give assurance to the **NATIONAL PARK SERVICE** that the CITY OF SAN ANTONIO ("CITY") would acquire certain properties within the boundaries of the San Antonio Missions National Historic Park for expansion and planned improvements of a new Visitor Center that the **NATIONAL PARK SERVICE** will construct; and

WHEREAS, a Cooperative Agreement was approved on February 24, 1994, by Ordinance No. 79675, to formalize the actions of the parties related to the properties that have been or are being acquired by the City of San Antonio pursuant to the previously mentioned ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Water System, CITY Public Works Department, CITY Planning Department, City Public Service Board and Paragon Cable T.V. have all imposed specific conditions and restrictions to which PETITIONER has agreed to comply, including (1) relocating Napier Avenue and Mission Road and (2) re-routing any and all affected utilities, at PETITIONER's sole cost and expense; and

WHEREAS, the CITY Planning Commission, at its regular meeting on March 9, 1994 considered the request to close, vacate, abandon and quitclaim improved portions of Napier Avenue, Mission Road and Woodhull Drive but postponed a formal recommendation to the City Council until such time as the proposed development project was further discussed with additional citizens who reside in the general area of the street closings; and

WHEREAS, City Council at its regular meeting on March 10, 1994 concurred with the Planning Commission's request; and

WHEREAS, CITY staff held a public meeting on April 12, 1994, presented the project, addressed all relevant issues and answered all related questions to everyone's satisfaction; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission thereafter concurred with and approved the request to close, vacate, abandon and quitclaim certain improved portions of Napier Avenue, Mission and Woodhull Drive; and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in that construction on the new streets will begin immediately, although the existing street rights-of-way will remain open until all utilities are relocated and new streets construction is completed, thus the preservation of public peace, property and safety requires this ordinance to become effective at once; upon passage of this ordinance by a vote of at least eight (8) members of the City Council, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by Article II, Section 15 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The improved portions of (1) Napier Avenue, (2) Mission Road and (3) Woodhull Drive, all of which are in San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, and shown on ATTACHMENT I hereto, are hereby closed, vacated and abandoned as public rights-of-way of the City of San Antonio. However, as a condition to such action all existing utility easements are to be retained in such portions of said streets rights-of-way until and unless the **NATIONAL PARK SERVICE** provides satisfactory alternate easements for the relocation of said utilities to be approved by the CITY and other utility agencies. As a further condition, existing streets will remain open until all utilities are re-routed and the new street construction is completed.

SECTION 2. The City Manager, or in his stead, the Assistant City Manager or the Assistant to the City Manager is authorized to execute a Quitclaim or Quitclaims to the adjacent property owners, transferring all right, title, interest and estate the CITY OF SAN ANTONIO may have in said streets, as legally described in the Quitclaims, copies of which will be affixed hereto as ATTACHMENT II upon execution.


SECTION 3. Due to the urgent necessity to commence construction of the new streets, an emergency is declared to exist making it necessary to preserve the public peace, property and safety by making this Ordinance effective immediately upon its enactment.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately if at least eight members of the City Council vote in the affirmative for its passage; otherwise this Ordinance shall be effective ten days following passage.



INTRODUCTION:

In conjunction with its proposal to construct a new Visitor Center with associated facilities, the National Park Service is requesting that the City of San Antonio close, vacate, abandon and quitclaim portions of improved Napier Avenue, Mission Road and Woodhull Drive in exchange for the relocation of Napier Avenue and Mission Road in the location as shown on attached Exhibits "A" and "B".

The Master Plan calls for other improvements involving pedestrian, parking and traffic circulation. On February 20, 1992, the City and the National Park Service executed a letter of intent (Ordinance No. 53313) towards the proposed improvements planned for the new Visitor Center which the National Park Service will construct. Specifically, the proposed closures are as follows:

1. Napier Avenue between the east boundary of Roosevelt Avenue to the east boundary of Lot 23, Block 2, New City Block 7658 as shown on attached Exhibit "B".
2. Mission Road from the present south boundary of Napier Avenue southeasterly to that approximate location as shown on said Exhibit "B".
3. Woodhull Drive from the present south boundary of Napier Avenue southwesterly to that approximate location as shown on said Exhibit "B".

So as to accommodate proper traffic flow, Petitioner proposes to relocate Napier Avenue and Mission Road as shown on said Exhibit "B". Once the relocated roadways are constructed, they will become part of the City of San Antonio's street system.

The Asset Management Department is recommending that City Council approve this request.

In compliance with City procedures, Petitioner's request has been circulated through all interested City departments and utility agencies involved.

The San Antonio Water System, Public Works Department, Planning Department, City Public Service Board and Paragon Cable T.V. have imposed specific conditions. Petitioner, in turn, has agreed to re-route, at its sole expense, any and all affected utilities. Said re-routing is to be coordinated with the above listed departments and/or utility agencies.

POLICY ANALYSIS:

The action requested is in accordance with the Department's present policies and procedures.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Indirectly, these proposed improvements will greatly enhance the San Jose Mission area and subsequently will attract increased local and tourist attendance.

SUPPLEMENTAL COMMENTS:



The Historic and Urban Design Section has no objections to this closure request.


