Friday, September, 15. A.D.1916, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr.

Commissioner Garland submitted the following:

Hon. Clinton G. Brown, Mayor,
Hon. J.F. Garland, Commissioner,

Gentlemen:

I wish to hereby tender my resignation from the office of Chief Deputy City Treasurer same to become effective as soon as you may be able to have my accounts checked up and my bond for \$100,000.00 released.

I regret the necessity for this action but my own business now requires practically all my time and I cannot for reason continue in the City's service.

In severing my official connection with the administration I assure you that I am with you in your efforts for the City's good and want you to call upon me whenever I can help in any way.

MB-133 AN ORDINANCE

Approving accounts of John Francis Gallagher as City Treasurer and Chief Deputy City Treasurer, and directing release and surrender of old official bond.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WHEREAS heretofore to-wit on the 11th day of June, A.D.1913, John Francis Gallagher, Principal, as Treasurer of said City and the National Surety Company as Surety, made, executed and delivered to the City of San Antonio a certain official bond in the sum of One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000.00) Dollars conditioned for the performance of the official duties of said Gallagher as Treasurer, an office of said City, a copy of which bond is hereto attached and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS said Gallagher has more recently held the position and performed the duties of Chief Deputy City Treasurer, and office created by ordinances of said City and charged with the performance of certain duties as Treasurer. and

Whereas all the books, accounts and vouchers relating to the city funds and monies and the duties of said Treasurer or of said Chief Deputy City Treasurer, for the period covered by said bond, have now been duly audited; said audit and accounts showing that all funds and monies belonging to or controlled by said City, and in the hands or under the control of said Treasurer, or of said Chief Deputy City Treasurer, under the security of said bond, have been duly accounted for and paid over; Now Therefore, Be It Further Ordained

That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make, execute and deliver on behalf of the City a good and lawful release of said bond above described,

and of said John Francis Gallagher, as principal, and said National Surety Company, as surety thereon, fully discharging them, and each of them from all liability to the City on account of the premises; and that the City Clerk be and he is hereby directed to surrender and deliver to them, or either of them, said original bond, taking receipt therefor. BE IT REMEMBERED: That at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the NATIONAL SURETY COMPANY, duly called and held on the sixth day of February, 1912, a quorum being present, the following By-law was adopted;

ARTICLE XI11.

Section 1. Signatures required.- All bonds, recognizances, or contracts of indemnity, policies of insurance, and all other writings obligatory in the nature thereof, shall be signed by the President, a Vice-President, a Resident Vice-President, or Attorney-in-fact, and shall have the seal of the Company affixed thereto, duly attested by the Secretary, an assistant Secretary, or Resident Assistant Secretary. All Vice-Presidents and Resident Vice-Presidents shall ~~have~~ each have authority to sign such instruments, whether the President be absent or incapacated, or not, and the Assistant Secretaries and Resident Assistant Secretaries shall each have authority to seal and attest such instruments, whether the Secretary be absent or incapacitated, or not,; and the Attorneys-in-Fact shall each have authority, in the discretion of such Attorneys-in-Fact, to affix to such instruments an impression of the Company's seal, whether the Secretary be absent or incapacated, or not, or to attach the individual seal of the Attorney-in-Fact thereto, or to use the scoll of the Attorney-in-Fact, or a wafer, wax, or other similar adhesive substance affixed thereto, or a seal of paper or other similar substance affixed thereto by mucilage, or other adhesive substance, or use the word "SEAL" or the letters "l.s." opposite the signature of such Attorneys-in-Fact, as the case may be.

Gentlemen:-

In accordance with your request, we herewith submit our report on the affairs of the City Treasurer for the periods as follows:

First;-- J.F.Gallagher, City Treasurer
from January 1. 1913 to May 31st, 1915

Second;-- J. F. Gallagher, Chief Deputy City Treasurer
from June 1, 1915 to Sept. 9, 1916.

On page 3 of this report we have set forth a balance Sheet of the current Assets and Liabilities of this office, as of Sept. 9, 1916.

Cash

Banks, Checking Accounts-- \$940,429.89

These bank balances have been reconciled to the Fund Balances and Certificates obtained from each bank certifying to the balance on deposit, and the total of these certificates agrees, with the total cash on deposit, set forth in the Balance Sheet.

The actual Bank Balance in the Commonwealth Bank & Trust Co, amounts to \$246,928.01 There are outstanding drafts given in payment of Street Paving warrants for \$662.79, leaving a net Bank Balance in this Bank of \$246,265.22.

On all other banks there are no outstanding drafts, other than the outstanding warrants with checks attached, the total amount of which is represented by the amount of outstanding warrants,

Cash on hand-- Pay Rolls-- \$2,295.25

This amount represents the unpaid pay roll items as per the unsigned items on the weekly Pay Rolls, and the net amount of over payments on Pay Roll warrants, due to erroneous footings on the pay rolls.

In this connection we wish to state that there are a few Pay Rolls missing and which we have been unable to locate.

A list of the missing pay rolls has been submitted in previous Reports.

Interest Coupon Account -- \$50,487.50

This amount represents the value of the unrepresented coupons on the 1913 Improvement Bonds, which amount is now on deposit at the Alamo National Bank, awaiting their presentation.

Securities on hand -- \$268,000.00

This amount is the value of the bonds representing the Bond Investment account of the City of San Antonio, Texas. We have examined the coupons attached to same, and find them in tact.

We have seen and verified these securities as of Sept. 9, 1916 and find the same on hand as set forth.

We have not included in this amount the unsigned and unissued Bond Issue of Improvement District #6, which bonds are also in the hands of your Treasurer.

Total Fund Balances -- \$796,977.44

This amount represents the actual Fund Balances as per the Auditors record as of Sept, 9, 1916.

Outstanding Warrants -- \$143,452.45

This amount represents the outstanding warrants, included in the above fund balances.

Interest on Bond Money \$1,992.10

This amount represents interest earned on Bond money on deposit in the various Banks, which has been paid to J.F.Gallagher, Chief Deputy City Treasurer, and awaits the issuing of a deposit warrant by the Auditor.

In previous reports we have submitted to you in detail schedules supporting the amounts set forth in this Balance Sheet. We therefore do not deem it necessary to incorporate these schedules in this report.

We have verified the Receipts and disbursements of this office from January 1, 1913 to September 9, 1916, covering the incumbency of J.F.Gallagher, City Treasurer, from January 1, 1913 to May 31, 1915; and J.F.Gallagher, Chief Deputy City Treasurer from June 1, 1915 to September 9, 1916. We hereby certify that the balances as set forth in this report are true and correct, subject to the above comments.

MB-134 AN ORDINANCE

Ordering the laying of sidewalks, etc, on various streets, under the penalties for failure to comply with said order.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WHEREAS the City Commissioners in the exercise of the Police Power, finds and hereby declares a public necessity for the laying of sidewalks, etc, as hereinafter ordered; and

WHEREAS by an ordinance heretofore on the 10th day of August A.D. 1914, passed and approved this City Commissioners provided for such cases; said ordinance being entitled "An ordinance prescribing specifications for sidewalks and curbing for public streets and places and providing measures to compel the Laying, Construction and repair of the

same by owners of abutting property; requiring the cost thereof to be paid by the owners of such property and declaring such cost a personal liability of such owners, and a first and prior lien and charge against such property; and prescribing the manner of ordering and compelling the construction of such work, and the punishment for failure to comply with such orders", and proceeding hereupon in accordance with said previous ordinance, which is made a part hereof;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED:

Section One. That the construction of cement sidewalks be and the same is hereby ordered along or in front of the entire extent of each parcel of the property and premises hereinafter described, and that the owners of such premises proceed immediately to construct said improvements, or to cause same to be constructed at their cost and expense, on the streets and public places hereinafter named; the respective premises herein referred to, the owner or owners thereof to whom this order is addressed and each such respective street or public place being as follows, to-wit:

Section Two. That said improvements shall be constructed promptly in accordance with the specifications and other provisions contained in said ordinance of August 10th, 1914, and that said work shall be commenced within thirty days after the service of notice on this order, and that said notices shall be given and all other things shall be done as therein provided, and that for failure to comply with or violation of this order, any person, association of persons, or corporation found guilty of such offense shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, all under and as in said ordinance of August 10, 1914 provided.

AN ORDINANCE

To regulate billposting and the size, location, construction and maintenance of bill boards within the City of San Antonio, Texas, and levying certain license fees upon the business of bill posting, public outdoor advertising and billboards, providing for the violation thereof, and repealing all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict therewith.
