

REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HELD IN  
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON  
THURSDAY, DECEMBER 9, 1965, 8:30 AM

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The regular meeting of the City Council was called to order by the Presiding Officer, Mayor W. W. McAllister, with the following members present: McALLISTER, CALDERON, JONES, JAMES, COCKRELL, GATTI arrived late, TREVINO, PARKER and BREMER; ABSENT: None.

65-1254 The invocation was given by Reverend Gerald Blackburn, Saint Stephens Presbyterian Church.

The minutes of the meeting of December 2, 1965, were approved.

65-1254 Mayor McAllister recognized the service of various members of City Boards, Committees and Commissions, and presented each one with a citation as follows: Harvey Powers - served as Member and Chairman of the Heating, Air-Conditioning and Refrigeration Code Board of Appeals for over seven years; Martin Royer - served as a Member of the Plumbing Appeals and Advisory Board for over four years. Mr. Royer accepted the citation for Mr. Powers. Dr. Herbert Calderon, served on the Advisory Committee for Public Assistance 3½ years until January, 1965, when he was appointed a Member of the City Council; Roger Rasbach, who served as a Member of the River Walk Commission for almost three years and has now moved away from San Antonio.

65-1254 Mayor McAllister recognized the loyal service of Mr. Fred Paniagua, Public Works Department employee who began his career with the City in 1925, and who during his 40 years was never involved in a vehicle accident, and presented him with a special citation in recognition of this outstanding safe driving record.

65-1254 The Mayor then presented Safe Driving pins to 13 Municipal employees, representing 841 fellow employees from 13 City Departments who are also to receive Safe Driving pins, as part of the San Antonio Fleet Safety Awards Program.

The pins represent one or more years of driving without a preventable accident, and covers both commercial and passenger vehicle operators.

The Mayor, then on behalf of the City Council and Administrative Staff, thanked the Municipal employees for their dedicated work and assured them that they appreciated tremendously the work they are doing in San Antonio.

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65-1287 Mr. C. W. Fenstermaker, Chairman of the River Walk Commission, made the following statement to the City Council:

"The River Walk Commission, at its regular meeting on Monday, December 6, 1965, received a proposal from the Wide-Lite Corporation concerning aesthetic lighting along Paseo del Rio. The Wide-Lite Corporation requested permission to light one block of the river walk from below Casa Rio Mexican Restaurant south to the Arneson River Theatre. This lighting would be done strictly on a temporary basis and completely at the expense of the Wide-Lite Corporation, even to the extent of providing their own generator for power. The purpose of this temporary lighting would be to demonstrate their ideas and abilities in regard to the dramatic lighting of this area.

The River Walk Commission recommends that the San Antonio City Council grant permission to the Wide-Lite Corporation to conduct this demonstration. We recognize, of course, that both the City Council and the River Walk Commission have approved plans for an aesthetic lighting project in the block between the Arneson River Theatre and the Presa Street bridge. We do not feel that the Wide-Lite Corporation's demonstration should in anyway interfere with this previously approved lighting project. It will simply give us all a better means of judging and comparing in order that the very best possible aesthetic lighting job may be done for Paseo del Rio."

65-1287 Mr. Frank Feeney, representing Esquire, Inc., the parent company for Wide-Lite Corporation, stated this would be done at no cost or obligation to the River Walk Commission or the City, and it was their desire to complete this project by January 6th for a national sales conference it is holding in San Antonio in which representatives from all over the United States and two foreign countries will be in attendance.

He said that he would like to leave it installed through the time of the lighting program in April, however, if the Council prefers to take it out after the conference, they will do so and will be glad to install it again in April.

Mrs. Cockrell stated that in view of plans already made on a portion of the lighting project, and the national publicity program, she was against going ahead with this demonstration at this time.

After further discussion of the matter, the Council was polled, where, by the following vote, the City Manager was authorized to make the necessary arrangements to permit the lighting demonstration as recommended by the River Walk Commission: AYES: McAllister, Calderon, Jones, James, Gatti, Trevino, Parker and Bremer; NAYS: Cockrell; ABSENT: None.

65-1288 Dr. Calderon reported for the City Council Committee comprising Mr. Jones, Mr. James and Dr. Calderon, which met with Southern Pacific Railroad Officials and the City Manager last Friday, pertaining to the grade crossings at Ceralvo, Brady, Rittiman and Cupples Roads, as well as the overpasses at New Braunfels Avenue and Olive Street.

After a long discussion of the matter the Committee thought of adopting a plan similar to the one in Fort Worth, whereby on existing grade crossings, where safety devices are to be installed, that the City pay 1/3 of the cost and the Railroad pay 2/3 of the cost, with the Railroad maintaining them in the future.

The new crossings where streets are going to cross the tracks, the City will pay 2/3 of the cost and the Railroad will pay 1/3 of the cost.

In instances where streets are going to be widened, the City would pay for materials and labor. He said the Committee recommends that the Council adopt these three points for settlement of these particular matters.

Dr. Calderon added that the Southern Pacific Railroad Officials had agreed to proceed on Brady and Ceralvo Street crossings on the 1/3 basis and since it was a policy matter with the Railroad, they were notifying the Railroad of this.

He further reported that starting in January, the Committee would continue to work with the Railroad Officials regarding the New Braunfels Avenue and Olive Street overpasses.

Mayor McAllister stated this seemed to be a fair and equitable solution and there being no objections from the Council, the City Manager was instructed to proceed to prepare the necessary ordinance and contract on this matter.

Our investigation reveals that there is already an opening in the median on Zarzamora at West Mayfield Street. No further action is contemplated.

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There being no further business to come before the Council, the meeting adjourned.
