AN ORDINANCE (3386)

APPROPRIATING \$76.20 OUT OF 1945 GENERAL FUND, STREET MAINTENANCE DEPT., PAYABLE TO KELLY CONSTRUCTION CO. FOR STREET PAVING.

City Engineer Coghill presented the following letter:

May 3, 1946

Honorable Mayor
City Commissioners
City of San Antonio

Gentlemen:

On the attached map I have indicated, in red, the paving proposed by the City of Alamo Heights abutting the various lots owned by the City of San Antonio.

I have checked the ownership listed in their letter of April 16, 1946 and find that the City owns all of this property.

The cost of 80¢ per lineal foot for this paving included curbing and is an exceedingly low price, since curbing alone cost 75¢ per lineal foot, therefore, I recommend that the City of Alamo Heights be instructed to proceed with this paving.

In view of the fact that this is not an obligation of the Street Department, but of the City as a whole, it is suggested that payment be made from some source other than this department.

On motion of Commissioner Steffler, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Hein, Steffler and Anderson; Nay, Callaghan (absent), the Council adopted the recommendation of the City Engineer in this matter.

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Commissioner Anderson announced he had received an invitation to attend a celebration at San Luis Potosi, Mexico, on May 26, and asked permission to represent the City there.

Commissioner Hein moved that the Council grant Commissioner Anderson a leave of absence for that purpose, for 10 days or as much thereof as necessary. After a second by Commissioner Steffler, the motion was carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Hein, Steffler and Anderson; Nay, Callaghan (absent).

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Mr. Rene Baeten, who said he was a major property owner in the area between Zarzamora St. and Frio City Road, which had been suggested as a tentative location for the proposed whole-sale produce market terminal, addressed the Council in opposition to the location of the terminal in that area. He suggested that the terminal be located on Somerset Road and that the present produce market be considerably enlarged. He said this plan of a new terminal was not a new idea but had been talked about for years among the market users and others.

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On motion of Commissioner Hein, seconded by Commissioner Anderson and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Hein, Steffler and Anderson; Nay, Callaghan (absent), the meeting adjourned Friday, May 3, 1946.
