

AN ORDINANCE      **91262**

ORDERING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 6TH DAY OF MAY, 2000, IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 334, AS AMENDED, TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, AND OTHER APPLICABLE LAW, ON THE QUESTION OF IMPLEMENTING AND APPROVING CITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION NO. 2000-04-07 WHICH DESIGNATES, AND PROVIDES FOR THE PLANNING, ACQUISITION, ESTABLISHMENT, DEVELOPMENT, CONSTRUCTION, OR RENOVATION OF, AND THE METHOD OF FINANCING FOR, THE FOLLOWING FOUR "VENUE PROJECTS": (1) THE SAN ANTONIO RIVER VENUE PROJECT, (2) THE KELLY AIR FORCE BASE VENUE PROJECT, (3) THE PARKS DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION VENUE PROJECT, AND (4) THE BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION VENUE PROJECT; MAKING PROVISION FOR THE HOLDING OF SAID ELECTION; CONTAINING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATED THERETO; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

**WHEREAS**, the City Council (the "City Council") of the City of San Antonio, Texas (the "City") desires to provide for the planning, acquisition, establishment, development, construction or renovation of various "venue projects" (collectively, the "Venue Projects") as authorized by, and defined in, Chapter 334, as amended, Texas Local Government Code ("Chapter 334" or the "Act"), which are further described below; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Section 334.042(d), Texas Local Government Code, if one or more of such Venue Projects is approved by the voters, the City may use money received from the sales and use tax approved by the voters in connection with such approved Venue Projects to reimburse or pay the costs of planning, acquiring, establishing, developing, constructing, or renovating such approved Venue Projects, pay the principal of, interest on, and other costs relating to bonds or other obligations issued by the City to finance a Venue Project, and pay the costs of operating or maintaining one or more approved Venue Projects; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the requirements of Section 334.021, Texas Local Government Code, the City Council, on January 27, 2000, has heretofore duly adopted Resolution No.: 2000-04-07 (the "Venue Projects Resolution") designating each of the projects identified therein as a "Venue Project" and designating the method of financing of each such Venue Project; and

**WHEREAS**, due to uncertainties in legal interpretation of the Act, the City Council hereby finds and determines it to be in the best interests of the citizens of the City, at this time, to withdraw from consideration by the voters the "Better Jobs" Venue Project described in the Venue Projects Resolution; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council deems it necessary and appropriate to amend the Venue Projects Resolution to delete the "Better Jobs" Venue Project, and expresses its intention, by this Ordinance, to effectuate such amendment to the Venue Projects Resolution; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with such amendment to the Venue Projects Resolution effectuated hereinafter, the City Council deems it necessary and appropriate to exclude the Better Jobs Venue Project from the propositions to be submitted to the voters at the election hereby called and submit to the voters only the four Better Future Propositions described herein; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council is authorized by Section 334.024, Texas Local Government Code to order an election on the question of approving and implementing the Venue Projects Resolution and approving each Venue Project and the method of financing each Venue Project; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the requirements of Section 334.021, Texas Local Government Code, the City, before calling such election has sent a copy of the Venue Projects Resolution to the State Comptroller, who has (1) performed an analysis to determine if approval and implementation of the Venue Projects Resolution will have a significant negative fiscal impact on state revenue, and (2) provided to the City written notice of the results of the analysis; and

**WHEREAS**, the Comptroller has heretofore determined, of which the City has received written confirmation, that implementation of the Venue Projects Resolution will not have a significant negative impact on state revenue; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council may now order an election on the question of approving and implementing the Venue Projects Resolution which designates, and provides for the planning, acquisition, establishment, development, construction, or renovation of, and the method of financing for, the following four "venue projects":

- (1) THE SAN ANTONIO RIVER VENUE PROJECT,
- (2) THE KELLY AIR FORCE BASE VENUE PROJECT,
- (3) THE PARKS DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION VENUE PROJECT, AND
- (4) THE BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION VENUE PROJECT; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has commonly referred to Venue Projects (1) through (4), immediately above, collectively as the "Better Future Propositions" for purposes of describing the propositions to the voters of the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council desires to provide an allocation within the Business Development and Expansion Venue Project for venues within each of the ten Council Districts (the "District-Based Venues") to be provided for in this election as part of the Business Development and Expansion Venue Project, and for other venues to be provided for throughout the City without identification to a particular City Council District (the "City-Wide Venues") to be provided for in this election as part the Business Development and Expansion Venue Project; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council hereby finds that an election should be held under authority of Chapter 334 on the question of implementing and approving the Venue Projects Resolution, as amended, of the City Council and impose the taxes of the types, in the amounts, and for the purposes hereinafter identified; and

**WHEREAS**, the City anticipates conducting the election ordered hereby as a joint election with the Alamo Community College District, San Antonio Independent School District, North East Independent School District, and the VIA Metropolitan Transit Authority under authority of Chapter 271, Texas Election Code, which joint elections will be approved by the City Council at a later date hereafter; and

**WHEREAS**, the City also anticipates entering into a Contract for Election Services with the Bexar County Elections Office under authority of Subchapter D of Chapter 31, Texas Election Code, for the conduct of the election ordered hereby, which Contract for Election Services will be approved by the City Council at a later date hereafter; and

**WHEREAS**, it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Texas Government Code; **NOW THEREFORE:**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:**

**SECTION 1. DATE; OFFICIAL PROPOSITIONS.** An election shall be held on Saturday, the 6th day of May, 2000, in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, including Chapter 334, as amended, Texas Local Government Code (the "Act"), the Texas Election Code, as amended, and the provisions of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Chapter 334, Texas Local Government Code, and the Texas Election Code, and at said election the following PROPOSITIONS, as classified and commonly referred to individually and collectively as follows, shall be submitted in accordance with the law:

**“BETTER FUTURE PROPOSITIONS”**

**SAN ANTONIO RIVER VENUE PROJECT PROPOSITION**

**PROPOSITION NO. 1**

“Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas be authorized to implement Resolution No. 2000-04-07, as amended (the “Venue Projects Resolution”), which designates the San Antonio River within the city limits of the City as a “tourist development area along an inland waterway,” and provides for the planning, acquisition, establishment, development, construction, or renovation of, and method of financing for, such development area along the San Antonio River, (including related infrastructure), as a “Venue Project” of the type defined, described, and authorized by Section 334.001(4)(C), Texas Local Government Code, and the Venue Projects Resolution (collectively, the “*San Antonio River Venue Project*”), and to impose a sales and use tax (for a period not to exceed ten years from the effective date of such tax) at the maximum rate not to exceed one-eighth of one percent (1/8%) (a portion of which tax shall be shared with and used for the “*Kelly Air Force Base Venue Project*,” the “*Parks Development and Expansion Venue Project*,” and the “*Business Development and Expansion Venue Project*” if one or more of such Venue Projects are also approved by the voters) for the purpose of financing (in an amount not to exceed \$30,000,000, including costs of issuance and interest on bonds, if any) the *San Antonio River Venue Project*?”

**KELLY AIR FORCE BASE VENUE PROJECT PROPOSITION**

**PROPOSITION NO. 2**

“Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas be authorized to implement Resolution No. 2000-04-07, as amended (the “Venue Projects Resolution”), which designates, and provides for the planning, acquisition, establishment, development, construction, or renovation of, and method of financing for, the “*Kelly Air Force Base Venue Project*” (including related infrastructure), as a “Venue Project” of the type defined, described, and authorized by Section 334.001(4)(E), Texas Local Government Code, Sections 2(11)(A) of the Development Corporation Act of 1979 (Article 5190.6, Texas Revised Civil Statutes), and the Venue Projects Resolution, and generally described to include the land, buildings, equipment, facilities, targeted infrastructure and improvements found by the City to be required or suitable for the promotion of development or redevelopment and expansion, including costs of administration and operation, of Kelly Air Force Base (which is being closed or realigned pursuant to recommendation of the Defense Closure and Realignment Commission pursuant to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1990), and facilities which are related thereto, and to impose a sales and use tax (for a period not to exceed ten years from the effective date of such tax) at the maximum rate not to exceed one-eighth of one percent (1/8%) (a portion of which tax shall be shared with and used for the “*San Antonio River Venue Project*,” the “*Parks Development and Expansion Venue Project*,” and the “*Business Development and Expansion Venue Project*” if one or more of such Venue Projects are also approved by the voters) for the purpose of financing (in an amount not to exceed \$50,000,000, including costs of issuance and interest on bonds, if any) the *Kelly Air Force Base Venue Project*?”

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**PARKS DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION VENUE PROJECT PROPOSITION**

**PROPOSITION NO. 3**

“Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas be authorized to implement Resolution No. 2000-04-07, as amended (the “Venue Projects Resolution”), which designates, and provides for the planning, acquisition, establishment, development, construction, or renovation of, and method of financing for, the *“Parks Development and Expansion Venue Project”* (including related infrastructure), as a “Venue Project” of the type defined, described and authorized by Section 334.001(4)(D), Texas Local Government Code, and the Venue Projects Resolution, and generally described to include the acquisition of open space over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone (the “Open Space Parks”) and linear parks within the City along Leon Creek and Salado Creek (the “Linear Parks”) and the construction or acquisition of improvements or additions to such Open Space Parks and Linear Parks, all as additions to the City’s Parks and Recreation System, and to impose a sales and use tax (for a period not to exceed ten years from the effective date of such tax) at the maximum rate not to exceed one-eighth of one percent (1/8%) (a portion of which tax shall be shared with and used for the “*San Antonio River Venue Project,*” the “*Kelly Air Force Base Venue Project,*” and the “*Business Development and Expansion Venue Project*” if one or more of such Venue Projects are also approved by the voters) for the purpose of financing (in an amount not to exceed \$65,000,000, including costs of issuance and interest on bonds, if any) the *Parks Development and Expansion Venue Project?*”

**BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION VENUE PROJECT PROPOSITION**

**PROPOSITION NO. 4**

“Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas be authorized to implement Resolution No. 2000-04-07, as amended (the “Venue Projects Resolution”), which designates, and provides for the planning, acquisition, establishment, development, construction, or renovation of, and method of financing for, the “*Business Development and Expansion Venue Project*” (including related infrastructure) as a “Venue Project” of the type defined, described, and authorized by Section 334.001(4)(E), Texas Local Government Code, and Section 2(11)(A) and Section 4B(a)(2)(B) of the Development Corporation Act of 1979 (Article 5190.6, Texas Revised Civil Statutes), and the Venue Projects Resolution, and generally described to include: (I) job training required or suitable for the promotion of development and expansion of business enterprises; and (II) the land, buildings, equipment, facilities, targeted infrastructure, and improvements found by the City to (a) be required or suitable for the promotion of development and expansion of manufacturing and industrial facilities; or (b) promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises, including projects to provide public safety facilities, streets and roads, drainage and related improvements, demolition of existing structures, general municipally owned improvements, as well as any improvements or facilities that are related to any of those projects; and to impose a sales and use tax (for a period not to exceed ten years from the effective date of such tax) at the maximum rate not to exceed one-eighth of one percent (1/8%) (a portion of which tax shall be shared with and used for the “*San Antonio River Venue Project,*” the “*Kelly Air Force Base Venue Project,*” and the “*Parks Development and Expansion Venue Project*” if one or more of such Venue Projects are also approved by the voters.) ?

And shall the imposition of this tax be for the purpose of financing (in an amount not to exceed an aggregate of \$30,000,000 [including costs of issuance and interest on bonds, if any] to be allocated approximately equally among the ten council districts for improvements described above, with all other sales and use tax revenues [excluding such revenues which would have been allocated to finance any other Venue Project that is not approved by the voters] be made available to finance other improvements and purposes described above) the *Business Development and Expansion Venue Project?*”

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**SECTION 2. FORM OF BALLOTS.** The official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Chapter 334, Texas Local Government Code, and the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITIONS, with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings, and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITIONS, as classified and commonly referred to individually and collectively as follows, to be expressed substantially as follows:

DESCRIBED ABOVE) THE "**BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION VENUE PROJECT.**"

**SECTION 3. PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES; TIME.** Said election shall be held as prescribed by law, in the City of San Antonio, at the following polling or voting places in the several precincts of the City of San Antonio, each of which is composed of the territory included in certain Bexar County election precincts, as listed in Attachment "I", which is attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes as if copied herein verbatim, and the polls shall be open between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 7:00 o'clock p.m.

**SECTION 4. PRESIDING JUDGES; ELECTION CLERKS; CONTRACT FOR ELECTIONS SERVICES; JOINT ELECTIONS.** The election officers, shall be listed on the Attachment "III" attached hereto, of the respective election precincts of the City at the polling places listed on the Attachment "I" are to be hereafter appointed by the City Council. The City Council will hereafter contract with the Bexar County Clerk's Office - Elections Department to conduct this election, which contract will be in the form of an Elections Services Contract to be hereafter approved by the City Council under authority of Chapter 31, Subchapter D, Texas Election Code. Additionally, the City Council will hereafter authorize agreements with the San Antonio Independent School District, North East Independent School District, Alamo Community College District, and the VIA Metropolitan Transit Authority to hold this election as a joint election with each of their respective elections. The agreements to hold joint elections with the other political subdivisions will be in the form to be hereafter approved by the City Council under authority of, and for the purposes of, and contain provisions required and authorized by Chapter 271, Texas Election Code. The election officers shall be appointed by the City Council at the time that the Contract for Elections Services and the Agreements for Joint Elections are approved by the City Council, which appointments shall be contained in the list contained on the Attachment "III," which, when approved by the City Council, shall be attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes as if copies herein verbatim. The Presiding Judge of each polling place shall appoint not less than two nor more than six qualified election clerks to serve and assist in conducting said election; provided that if the Presiding Judge actually serves as expected, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall be one of such clerks.

**SECTION 5. EARLY VOTING.** (a) *Early Voting by Mail.* Electors may cast their early vote by mail, and the early voting clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail shall be sent to, is as follows:

(b) *Early Voting by Personal Appearance.* Early voting by personal appearance shall be conducted at the locations and times listed on the Attachment "II" attached hereto. The early voting clerk and the deputy early voting clerk for said election shall be Norma Rodriguez and Gerry Rickhoff, respectively.

(c) *Temporary Branch Locations, Days, Dates, and Times for Early Voting.* Temporary branch locations for early voting, and the days, dates, and times for early voting at such early voting temporary branch locations shall be as indicated on the attached Attachment "II".

**SECTION 6. EARLY VOTING BALLOT BOARD.** An early voting ballot board is hereby created to process early voting results, and Jeff Piercy is hereby appointed the presiding judge of said board. The presiding judge shall appoint at least two other members of the board.

**SECTION 7. VOTING SYSTEMS.** Voting at said election shall be done by the use of voting machines, paper ballots or the electronic voting system as determined by the City Clerk, and the City Council of the City of

San Antonio does determine hereby that voting machines, paper ballots or electronic voting system shall be used for the casting of early votes at this election, and voting machines shall be placed at temporary branch offices (Attachment "II") established for the purpose of conducting early voting by personal appearance during the hours hereby indicated in Attachment "II".

**SECTION 8. ELECTORS.** All resident, qualified electors of the City shall be entitled to vote at said election.

**SECTION 9. CHAPTER 334; ELECTION CODE.** In all respects said election shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 334, as amended, Texas Local Government Code, and the Texas Election Code.

**SECTION 10. BILINGUAL ELECTION MATERIALS.** All election materials (including notice of the election, ballots, instruction cards, affidavits, and other forms which voters may be required to sign) and all early voting materials shall be printed in both English and Spanish, or Spanish translations thereof, and/or other assistance shall be provided, as required by the Texas Election Code and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, each as amended.

**SECTION 11. NOTICE.** (a) *Form of Notice of Election.* The City Clerk of the City is hereby authorized and directed to prepare a form of a Notice of Election (or Notice of Joint Election, if the City Council authorizes the conduct of a joint election pursuant to authority of Chapter 271 of the Texas Election Code), in both English and Spanish, the contents of which comply with the requirements of §4.004 of the Texas Election Code (and other applicable law), and include at a minimum the nature and date of the election, the forms of the propositions included in Section 2 of this Ordinance, the forms of the ballot propositions included in Section 3 of this Ordinance, the location of each election day and early voting polling place, the locations, dates, and times of temporary branch locations for early voting, the hours the polls will be open, and any other information required by other law, and with such variations permitted by applicable law.

(b) *Method of Giving Notice.* Notice of said election shall be given by posting, both in English and in Spanish, not later than the 21st day before the date set for said election, a copy of said Notice of Election (or Notice of Joint Election, if applicable) on the bulletin board used for posting notices of the meetings of the City Council of the City. Notice of said election shall also be given by publishing said Notice of Election (or Notice of Joint Election, if applicable), both in English and in Spanish, one time in the *San Antonio Express-News* not more than 30 days and not less than 10 days prior to the date set for said election. It is hereby found and declared that the *San Antonio Express-News* is a newspaper of general circulation within the City.


**SECTION 12. AMENDMENT TO VENUE PROJECTS RESOLUTION.** The Venue Projects Resolution, Resolution No. 2000-04-07, passed and approved by the City Council on January 27, 2000, is hereby amended to delete the "Better Jobs" Venue Project from the designation of the Venue Projects and the description of method of financing thereof described in the Venue Projects Resolution. The election of the voters hereby called on the question of implementing the Venue Projects Resolution shall include implementation of the Venue Projects Resolution as hereby amended, without the "Better Jobs" Venue Project deleted hereby. All other provisions of the Venue Projects Resolution not expressly amended hereby shall be and remain in full force and effect as of the day of enactment of the Venue Projects Resolution.

**SECTION 13. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS.** The statements contained in recitals included in the preamble of this Ordinance are hereby found to be true and correct, and such recitals are hereby incorporated into, and made a part of, this Ordinance for all purposes and are adopted as part of the judgment and findings of the City Council.







The purpose of this memorandum is to outline the legal authority for each of the five propositions to be considered for the proposed sales tax election. City Council recently adopted a Resolution focusing upon the provisions of Chapter 334 of the Texas Development Corporation Act for the sales tax election. Chapter 334, which was passed by the Legislature in 1997, was intended primarily to finance major sports facilities, however it also contains language which permits funding "any other economic development project authorized by other law" as a "venue project" if approved by the voters. The City's outside legal counsel has researched the matter and has found no other governmental entity to have utilized Section 334.001(4)(D) to declare and finance a "venue project" as an "economic development project authorized by other law". Consequently, there are numerous provisions under the statute which have never been tested, and numerous questions arise for which *no clear answers* have been given at this time.

Unless otherwise identified herein, all references to Sections in this letter refer to Sections in Chapter 334 of the Texas Local Government Code.

Due to the provision in Section 334.024(b)(1) which requires each venue project to be separately voted, our current view is that the City will have to present at least five separate propositions to cover the projects proposed. For reasons further explained below, at this time we believe the projects to be included in each proposition would be grouped approximately as follows:

**PULLED**

- Proposition 1: Better Jobs Program;
- Proposition 2: San Antonio River Improvements;
- Proposition 3: Kelly Air Force Base
- Proposition 4 Acquisition of Park Property over Edwards Recharge Zone and Creek Based Linear Parks
- Proposition 5: Support of businesses wishing to expand in, or relocate to, San Antonio and related infrastructure

KEY REQUIREMENTS OF CHAPTER 334

There are numerous procedural and technical requirements imposed by Chapter 334 which must be considered. Among those requirements are as follows:

- Section 334.021(a)(1) provides that the City must first receive a determination from the Comptroller that "the implementation of the resolution [i.e. the resolution which

provides for the planning, acquisition, establishment and development of a venue project] *will not have a significant negative fiscal impact on state revenue.*" Section 334.022 requires the City to submit the resolution to the Comptroller, who then initially has 15 days to complete her analysis. On January 31, 2000, Comptroller has confirmed that the election will not have a significant negative fiscal impact on state revenue.

- The projects financed with Chapter 334 sales taxes must have an economic development purpose related to the project.
- Section 334.042(c)(3) authorizes the use of venue sales tax revenues to pay the costs of operating or maintaining venue projects.

As further discussed below, Section 334.001(C) provides specific statutory authority to make economic development improvements along the San Antonio River. This section states "development area along an inland waterway." The San Antonio River is an "inland waterway" that can be funded under this provision. Section 334.001(E) provides specific statutory authority for acquisition of park property. This proposition is limited to park acquisition over the Edwards Recharge Zone and along Leon and Salado creeks. Once acquired, property must become a part of the city's municipal parks system.

With respect to each of the other proposed economic development projects, we must rely upon Section 334.001(4)(E) which provides that "*any other economic development project authorized by other law*" may be approved by the voters as a "venue project" under Chapter 334 and, therefore, are eligible to be financed with venue taxes approved by the voters. As previously noted, no other municipality has utilized Section 334.001(4)(E) to declare and finance a "venue project" as an "economic development project authorized by other law", but the statutory authority to do so is clear.

#### BETTER JOBS PROGRAM

**PULLED**

Of the proposed venue projects, the state law is less clear in whether the Better Jobs program, as proposed, could be financed with a sales tax election. In reviewing the applicable law since it was amended in May 1999, and based upon discussions which outside counsel had with the Attorney General's Public Finance Division, Section 4B of the Development Corporation Act provides some legal authority to permit the City to fund limited job training programs with Section 4B sales tax revenues. However, the law is not as clear on whether the City can fund some of the programs proposed in the Better Jobs proposition.

As a result of amendments made to the Development Corporation Act during the 1999 Legislative Session, job training is now mentioned in three provisions as set forth below:

*Project shall mean the land, buildings, equipment, facilities, targeted infrastructure and improvements (one or more) to promote new and expanded business development or found by the board of directors to be required or suitable for the promotion of development and expansion of manufacturing and industrial facilities, job creation and retention, job training.... - Section 2 (11)(A). (Emphasis added).*

*"Project" also includes job training required or suitable for the promotion of development and expansion of business enterprises and other enterprises described by the Act, as provided by Section 38 of this Act. - Section 2(11)(A). (Emphasis added).*

PULLED

*"Project" means land, buildings, equipment, facilities, and improvements included in the definition of that term under Section 2 of this Act, and includes job training as provided by Section 38 of this Act. - Section 4B(a)(2). (Emphasis added).*

It is clear that the City can finance buildings and facilities for job training purposes with a sales tax raised under Section 334. Two of the three references to job training as authorized by the Development Corporation Act are tied to the provisions of Section 38 of the Development Corporation Act which imposes several restrictions with respect to using sales tax revenues to finance job training. Specifically, Section 38(b) of the Development Corporation Act provides that proceeds could only be used *"for job training offered through a business enterprise only if the business enterprise has committed in writing to create new jobs that pay at least the average weekly wage for the county in which the jobs are to be located."* In addition, Section 38(c) of the Development Corporation Act provides that no more than 50% of the "actual cost" of a job training program which qualifies under Section 38 of the Development Corporation Act can be funded.

The proposed "Better Jobs Program" contains several components which complement job training efforts such as providing funds for early childhood development, etc. Although it is not clear that the "job training" language in the Development Corporation Act permits the use of funds for those purposes, it should be noted that numerous other state and federal statutes related to job training *permit* the use of funds for similar purposes. The City could seek an amendment to the Development Corporation Act in the next legislative session to clarify its ability to use a portion of the sales tax funds for these other programs related to job training.

PULLED

Another possible basis for funding these Better Job components is Section 4B(a)(2)(B). This provision includes within the definition of the term "project" the phrase *"any other project that the board in its discretion determines promotes or develops new or expanded business enterprises"*. Although Chapter 334 does not provide for the creation of a board of directors to serve as the governing body to oversee venue projects and venue taxes, the City Council, pursuant to the City Charter, would be able to create an advisory board to serve at the Council's direction.

The proposed Better Jobs board would be the appropriate body to make a finding that the establishment of better childhood development facilities "promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises". Operation and maintenance costs for those facilities could then be supported with venue sales taxes pursuant to Section 334.042(d)(3). Therefore, in order to fund early childhood programs, City could build or improve a facility then provide funds to maintain and operate the facility. Going beyond this, is an untested avenue of legal authority.

The portion of the "Better Jobs Program" which includes providing money for higher education scholarships is the initiative for which legal staff and consultants were unable to find any "other law" which would permit funding through the proposed sales tax.

#### SAN ANTONIO RIVER IMPROVEMENTS

The San Antonio River would be considered an "inland waterway." Section 334.001(C) provides clear authority to classify such improvements as a "venue" project and fund such improvements with sales taxes if approved by the voters. This is one of the projects being proposed for funding with venue sales taxes, which does not have to rely on "other law" for authority to finance such project.

#### KELLY AIR FORCE BASE

Section 2(11)(A) of 4B specifically includes "the promotion of development or redevelopment and expansion, including costs of administration and operation, of a military base closed or realigned pursuant to recommendation of the Defense Closure and Realignment Commission pursuant to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act of 1990...as amended..." as a "project" under the Development Corporation Act. Therefore, there is no question that improvements at Kelly AFB could be financed with venue sales taxes if approved by the voters. However, at this time, Brooks AFB would not qualify for funding under that same provision of the Development Corporation Act because it has not been closed or realigned pursuant to the Defense Base Closure and Realignment Act. Notwithstanding this, depending on the specific improvements desired to be made at Brooks, such improvements may be financed by Proposition 5 in connection with assisting in the expansion or relocation of business in San Antonio.

#### Acquisition of Park Property over Edwards Recharge Zone

There is clear legislative authority under Section 334.001(4)(D) to classify "improvements or additions to a park and recreation system" as a "venue" project and fund such additions and improvements with a sales taxes if approved by the voters. This is the other project being proposed for funding which does not have to rely on "other law" for authority to finance such project. The proposed venue project would limit the acquisition and improvements to property purchased over the Edwards Recharge Zone and along Leon and Salado creeks.

#### SUPPORT OF BUSINESSES WISHING TO EXPAND IN, OR RELOCATE TO, SAN ANTONIO AND RELATED INFRASTRUCTURE

Providing funds to assist private entities to relocate to a city or expand existing businesses is a very common use of Section 4B sales tax funds by other Section 4B corporations throughout the state. The introductory phrase of Section 2(11)(A) of the Development Corporation Act defines a "project" as

*...the land, buildings, equipment, facilities, targeted infrastructure, and improvements (one or more) to promote new and expanded business development or found by the board of directors to be required or suitable for the promotion of development and expansions of manufacturing and industrial facilities...*

Language is incorporated in the ballot proposition which would refer to assisting the expansion or relocation of business enterprises in San Antonio. Analysis of this provision leads us to conclude that the City would not be required to vote separately on each venue project nor to specifically identify in the proposition which businesses will be supported with venue sales tax revenues.


Finally, funding for streets, drainage and utility infrastructure improvements which are directly related to the promotion or development of new or expanded business enterprises, are included in Proposition 5. The legal authority to permit such infrastructure improvements as an economic development project is Section 4B(a)(2)(B) of the Development Corporation Act which provides, in pertinent part, as follows:

*...land, buildings, equipment, facilities, and improvements found by the board of directors to promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises, including a project to provide public safety facilities, streets and roads, drainage and related improvements, demolition of existing structure, general municipally owned improvements, as well as any improvements or facilities that are related to any of those projects...*

Notwithstanding this authority, it is important to note that any such infrastructure improvements financed with venue taxes must be related to promoting or developing new or expanded business enterprises. General infrastructure improvements such as neighborhood streets, etc., which do not have a logical nexus with promoting or developing new or expanded business enterprises could not be financed with venue taxes. Each economic development infrastructure project proposed to be financed with sales tax funds must be evaluated on a case by case basis to ascertain if the project will promote or develop new or expanded business enterprises.

#### CONCLUSION

Chapter 334 and the Development Corporation Act (4B) are both available to cities to finance or fund economic development initiatives. There is clear legal authority to allow the above mentioned Better Future venue projects to be presented to the voters. These proposed projects are within the meaning of the statutory language and the legislative intent. Any challenge to these proposed venue projects will fail. The Better Jobs project as proposed is not as legally precise. Chapter 334 seems to limit expenditures of sales tax proceeds to expenditure only on "projects" and not programs which do not seem to constitute a "project" under law. The City could make credible arguments and findings that the proposed Better Jobs programs are also allowed by law. However, the legal authority is not clear and proceeding under current law could make the Better Jobs program subject to challenge.

## Chronology of Better Jobs Sales Tax Election Laws

Below is a chronology dealing with the Sales Tax Election which outlines the changes to the law over the last 18 months and its impact to the development of the proposed propositions.

- Fall 1998 City staff evaluates a proposed Tax Increment Financing project to build an arena at the Longhorn Quarry for the San Antonio Spurs. During the same period of time, staff evaluates other laws which could be used to finance an arena. Laws reviewed include the Development Corporation Act (4B) and Section 334 of the Local Government Code.
- Dec. 1998 Project does not proceed because Northeast Independent School District decides not to participate in the TIF. Council directs staff to continue studying the other laws that could be utilized to fund an arena project.
- May 1999 State legislature amends the Development Corporation Act (4B) to include new limitations on job development. (Section 38). Limitations include that proceeds could only be used *"for job training offered through a business enterprise only if the business enterprise has committed in writing to create new jobs that pay at least the average weekly wage for the county in which the jobs are to be located."* In addition, Section 38(c) of the Development Corporation Act provides that the City could not fund with sales tax revenues more than 50% of the "actual cost" of a job training program which qualifies under Section 38 of the Development Corporation Act.
- June 1999 Staff begins working on calling a November sales tax election for the purpose of financing four projects. Multi-purpose Arena, Better Jobs program, General Economic Development and Infrastructure improvements. Outside consultants were hired to assist the staff in evaluating the financial and legal parameters of such an election.
- July 16, 1999 Bond Counsel wrote letter to Public Finance Division of the Attorney General's Office. Specifically, the letter asked whether the limitations proposed in the new legislation (Section 38) under the Development Corporation Act would apply to the City's proposed job training programs. Letter expressed the importance of these limitations not applying since the "human development fund" encompassed other non-traditional job training aspects, such as early child development and scholarships.
- July 27, 1999 Bond Counsel writes letter to City Attorney regarding the four proposed venue projects. With regards to the Job Training, the letters states a preliminary finding that the "Chief of the Attorney General's Public Finance Division does not believe that the City would be subject to the limitations set forth in Section 38 of the Development Corporation Act..."
- Aug. 1999 San Antonio Spurs elect to have Bexar County call a venue project election utilizing Hotel/Motel tax and Car Rental tax.
- Aug. 31, 1999 Section 38 of the Development Corporation Act (4B) goes into effect.
- Oct. 1999 City staff begins working on developing a sales tax election to fund a Better Jobs initiative. This work is based on the legal presumptions provided earlier in the year. This work includes countless hours of community input.

- Dec. 1999 Legal staff begins to work on the upcoming proposed sales tax election for Better Jobs. Initial efforts are focused on having a 4B election under the Development Corporation Act. The major hurdle to overcome is the \$135 million cap on the proposition. Legal counsel did not consider Section 38 a hurdle because of the previous inquiries that had occurred.
- Jan. 13, 2000 Mayor briefs City Council during "B" Session about the Better Jobs/Better Future Programs. Legal basis discussed is a 4B sales tax election.
- Jan. 17 2000 Direction is given to staff to focus on having a Section 334 sales tax election, but utilizing some provisions of 4B of the Development Corporation Act. This direction is based on the inability to overcome the \$135 million cap. At this time, discussion with the Attorney General's Office indicated that Section 38 limitations could apply to the city's proposed job training programs. City Attorney directs outside counsel to analyze all available statutes to see if job training programs could be funded without limitations.
- Jan. 21,2000 Outside legal counsel communicates to the City Attorney that certain job training programs could be funded with a sales tax election under Section 334 and 4B. Specifically, job training tied to specific employers who commit in writing to create new jobs at a certain wage; city could build facilities for job training and child care as well as maintenance and operation of those facilities; finally, the advisory board created by Council could recommend the funding of any other "project" that the board in its discretion determines or promotes or develops new or expanded business enterprises. By utilizing this last option, them City Attorney's Office developed a legal argument to support early childhood development and after school care programs.
- Jan. 25, 2000 City Attorney met with citizen group who indicated that a member of the Attorney General's Office had stated that Chapter 373, Texas Community Development Act, could possibly be used to fund the type of programs the City wanted to fund. Specifically, this statute allows for funding of programs related to "employment opportunities, economic development, crime prevention, child care, health, drug abuse, education...". City Attorney contacts Attorney General's office and outside legal counsel regarding the possibility of utilizing Section 373.
- Jan. 28, 2000 After conferring with the AG's office, outside legal counsel concluded that Section 373 could not be used to fund Better Jobs as proposed. This conclusion is based on the analysis that Section 334 is limited to funding "projects", while Section 373 is specifically for programs.
- Feb. 1, 2000 After conferring with Attorney General's Office, outside legal counsel verbally communicates to City Attorney's Office the lack of clear authority to fund "programs" under Chapter 334 due to the limitations outlined in Section 38. City Attorney asks them to proceed focusing on what can be done under Chapter 334.
- Feb.4, 2000 City Attorney is unable to provide assurances to the Mayor that funding the Better Jobs program under the current law will be successfully defended, if challenged. This is due to the fact that a court may rule that the findings by the Board to fund early childhood development, scholarships and after school care programs were outside the authority allowed under Section 334 and 4B as amended by Section 38.
