3. Voting at said election shall be done by the use of voting machines; and, the City Council of the City of San Antonio does determine hereby that voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes at this election, and a voting machine shall be placed in the office of the City Clerk, in the City Hall of San Antonio, Texas; and the City Clerk, or any Assistant City Clerk, is authorized and charged to perform the functions provided by law in the casting of absentee ballots and shall hold such election, and ballots shall be cast at any time not more than 20 days nor less than 3 days prior to the date of such election; all in the method, manner and time made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on this subject.

4. The Mayor shall be authorized to issue a Proclamation and Notice of Election Substantially in the form hereof, and he is directed to cause such Proclamation and Notice of Election to be published and promulgated by posting one copy thereof in each of said election precincts at the polling place specified and cause the same to be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of San Antonio, in the time and manner prescribed by law.

Leech, Deceased, as seller, for and in consideration of the agreed purchase price of \$950.00 DOLLARS, and upon the terms and conditions hereof, contract to grant, sell and convey by general warranty deed to the City of San Antonio, as buyer, a good and indefeasible fee simple title, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances of every kind (except liens for current taxes and assessments), to the following described premises situated in Bexar County, to-wit: A tract of land out of the W. THENCE; S 89° 55' E, along the south line of Mauermann Road, a distance of 40.06 feet to the point of BEGINNING, together with all improvements and other things incident or belonging thereto, including all my/our right, title and interest in or to all adjoining streets, alleys or roads.

The agreed purchase price includes full accord, satisfaction and compensation for all demands and damages to the remaining premises of the seller, if any, together with, but not limited to, the following:

STEWART TITLE Company shall act as escrow agent and the seller upon demand by the buyer agrees to deliver such deed duly executed to the escrow agent at its san Antonio office and to surrender possession of the above described premises to the buyer not later than 10 days after the date of the delivery of such deed.

The agreed purchase price is payable \$950.00, at the time of the delivery of such deed and \$-----, at the time possession of the above described premises is delivered to the buyer. Time is of the essence of this contract and in the event possession is not delivered to the buyer within 10 days of the date of the delivery of such deed, the seller agrees that the buyer may retain such amount of \$-----, as liquidated damages and proceed to obtain possession by whatever legal means the buyer deems necessary. It is further agreed, should seller retain possession after execution of such deed, he does so as a tenant at will of the buyer.

Until title has been conveyed to the buyer, loss or damage to the above premises by fire or other casualty shall be at the risk of the seller and the amount thereof shall be deducted from the agreed purchase price. Current rents are to be prorated as of the date of the delivery of the deed.

The buyer without expense to the seller shall prepare the deed and provide the required United States documentary stamps for the conveyance to the buyer.

Owner will pay all taxes on the hereinabove described property, including those assessed or to be assessed for the current year; provided that current taxes are to be prorated

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS 31182

THE STATE OF TEXAS

WHEREAS, the bonds hereinafter authorized were duly and favorably voted, as required by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, at an election held in said City on the 10th day of January, 1961; and

WHEREAS, the bonds hereinafter authorized are to be issued and delivered pursuant to Vernon's Articles 823 and 1175.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1. That said City's coupon bonds to be designated the "City of San Antonio General Obligation Bonds, Series 1963," are hereby authorized to be issued and delivered in the accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas in the principal amount of \$3,500,000, for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring the right-of-way and necessary approach for a North Expressway to be constructed from the east leg of the Expressway west of Broadway to U. S. Highway No. 281 north of Loop 13.

Section 2. That said bonds shall be dated April 1, 1963, shall be numbered consecutively from 1 through 700, shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 each, and shall mature and become due and payable serially on April 1 in each of the years, and in the amounts, respectively, as set forth in the following schedule:
