

AN ORDINANCE:  
DECLARING THE CANVASS OF THE SPECIAL  
ELECTION OF THE SEVENTH OF MAY, 1930.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

Came on this 8th day of May, A. D. 1930, regularly to be canvassed the returns of the special election held on the 7th day of May, 1930, to determine whether or not bonds of the City of San Antonio, submitted in Propositions "A" to "H", in the sum of Four Million Nine Hundred and Seventy-five Thousand (\$4,975,000.00) Dollars, shall be issued, payable serially during the period of Forty (40) years in yearly installments as stated in the ordinance ordering the election, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five (5%) per cent per annum; and, whether or not there shall be levied, assessed and collected an annual tax, sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as the same become payable, and create a sinking fund as provided by law, sufficient to pay said bonds as each of the same shall mature; said bonds having been submitted to the voters under eight separate propositions, as stated in the ordinance ordering said special election; and the said Commissioners of the City of San Antonio having undertaken to canvass the returns of said election in the manner as provided by law, and after considering and determining all matters of fact thereto appertaining, we the said Commissioners of the City of San Antonio do hereby declare and find the result of said election to be, as tabulated and attached hereto.

And it appearing to the Commissioners, that said eight propositions were submitted, and said election held and conducted, and returns thereof made, all as required by the ordinance ordering said election, and the law for such cases made and provided and that at said election there were cast on each of said propositions, respectively, the aggregate number of votes "For", and the aggregate number of votes, "Against", each of said separate propositions, all as shown by the report of said Commissioners, and the Commissioners having first canvassed said returns and said reports and having found the same in all things correct, said report was thereupon adopted, by unanimous vote of the Commissioners, and it was further ordered and declared, by said Commissioners, that said eight propositions, and each of them, to issue bonds, and to levy a special tax, as in each of said eight propositions set forth, was sustained by a majority vote of the qualified votes, voting at said election, and that the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio are authorized by said election, to issue bonds, and levy said tax, and to assess, and collect the same, all as in said respective propositions set forth.
