

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A hearing was announced on the Annual Budget. As no one present desired to make comment, a vote was taken on its adoption by the ordinance numbered above and it was adopted by a roll call vote to-wit: Ayes, White, Davis, Hein, Knight, & South; Nays, None.

Please be advised that I have presented to the Mayor for his approval and signature the following resolution:

August 10, 1950

'Announcing the intention of the City Commissioners to pass an Ordinance on September 21, 1950 authorizing an election to be held on December 19, 1950, for the submission of an amendment to the existing Charter of said City'

He has disapproved this Resolution and has specified his objections thereto in writing and has returned it to the Board of Commissioners, with such disapproval, on this the 9th day of August, 1950, and the same has been filed and is being held in my custody.

TO THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO.

SIRS:

Under the authority vested in me, as Mayor, by Paragraph 1, Section 26, of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, I hereby notify you that I disapprove of the resolution ANNOUNCING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY COMMISSIONERS TO PASS AN ORDINANCE ON SEPTEMBER 21, 1950 AUTHORIZING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON DECEMBER 19, 1950, FOR THE SUBMISSION OF AN AMENDMENT TO THE EXISTING CHARTER OF SAID CITY; and I hereby veto said Resolution.

In compliance with the City's Charter, I specify my objections to this Resolution in writing; and they are as follows:

1. On May the 9th, 1950, just three months ago, an Amendment, identical in almost every respect with the one proposed to be submitted by this Resolution, was presented to the qualified voters; and the four City Commissioners, together with this same little selfish group, voted against it, and fought with every weapon at their command. Therefore, we may rightly assume that this same group does not sincerely submit this proposal for the good of this city but proposes it solely for ulterior purposes.

2. I believe this is a brazen attempt to deceive and take advantage of the vast majority of City employees, in that the original amendment submitted to me gave little, if any, protection to an employee as was correctly pointed out by all three of our daily newspapers.

3. I further object to this Resolution and the proposed amendment because, even as amended, it still does not give the kind of Civil Service protection to our honest and faithful employees, to which they are entitled.

4. The selection of the arbitrary date of December 19th, 1950, (the week before Christmas) to hold this election is a clear attempt to fix a date that will be to the greatest disadvantage to our citizens in casting their votes. Its purpose is to deny to all our people the equal opportunity of expressing themselves at the polls.

5. Everyone knows, including this little selfish group who seek to perpetuate themselves in office, that our Charter cannot be amended within two years after an amendment is adopted by the people. We all know that our Charter is woefully in need of being modernized. It is likewise no secret that a majority of our citizens favor the adoption of some form of Council-Manager or City Manager Government. This Resolution and proposed amendment is but an underhanded effort to deny our people the right to change their form of government and improve it.

6. I, too, believe in Civil Service. I voted for it on May 9th. The proponents of this Amendment fought it bitterly. But I do not believe in adopting a Civil Service Amendment alone and depriving our citizens for some two years of their right to adopt other improvements in our government.

7. This is a cunning, clever attempt to deceive our people and strangle their

growing determination to improve our local government, and its services to all the people.

Our employees should have Civil Service, the best possible. But it should be adopted by the people along with a fully comprehensive plan for the improvement of the entire form of government for our city.
