PRESENT: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor , presiding, and Commissioners Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Steves.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and ordered approved.

AN ORDINANCE.

Ordering the laying of sidewalks, etc, on various streets, under the penalties for failure to comply with said order.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

WHEREAS The City Commissioners in the exercise of the Police Power, finds and hereby declares a public necessity for the laying of sidewalks, etc, as hereinafter ordered; and

WHEREAS by an ordinance heretofore on the 10th day of Agust, A. D. 1914, passed and approved the City Commissioners provided for such cases,; said ordinance being entitled "An Ordinance prescribing specifications for Sidewalks and Curbing for Public Streets and Places, and providing measures to compel the laying, construction and repair of the same by owners of abutting property; requiring the cost thereof to be paid by the owners of such property and declaring such cost a personal liability of such owners, and a first and prior lien and charge against such property; and prescribing the manner of orwering and compelling the construction of such work, and the punishment for failure to comply with such orders," and proceeding hereupon in accordance with said previous ordinance, which is made a part hereof;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED:

SECTION ONE. That the construction of cement sidewalks be and the same is hereby ordered along or in front of the entire extent of each parcel of the property and premises hereinafter described, and that the owner of such premises proceed immediately to construct said improvements, or to cause same to be constructed at their cost and expense, on the streets and public places hereinafter named. the respective premises herein referred to, the owner or owners thereof to whom this order is addressed and each such respective street or public place being as follows, to-wit:

SECTION TWO: That said improvements shall be constructed promptly in accordance with the specifications and other provisions contained in said ordinance of August 10th, 1914, and that said work shall be commenced within thirty days after the service of notice of this order, and that said notices shall be given and all other things shall be done as therein provided; and that for failure to comply with or violation of this order, any person, association of persons, or corporation found guilty of such offense shall be fined not less than Five(\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, all under and as in said ordinance of August 10th, 1914, provided.

 Commissioner Kearny recommended that the petition for the extension of Eden Street be granted, when funds for extension and opening of streets are available. Adopted.

 Commissioner Kearney recommended that the petition of Citizen complaining of discontinuance of Street Car service on Gevers Street be granted. Adopted.

 Commissioner Lambert , reporting on the petition of Citizens Ice and Cold Storage Company for permit to sublet part of room leased by it in Market House, recommended that no leases be made untill re-adjustment of stalls. Adopted.

 The petition of W. G. Tobin, requesting removal of a Livery Stable from Martin Street, was referred to City Attorney on recommendation of Commissioner Garland with the request to advise what necessary to have the cause of the complaint removed.

MA-466 AN ORDINANCE.

Prohibiting the use of public drinking cups and providing penalty for violation thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That it shall be unlawful for any hotel, Cafe, Store, Office Building, Theatre, Playhouse or other Public Place, to have or maintain a common drinking cup

or other vessel of any sort in the City of San Antonio, and that any person, firm, corporation or association of persons, violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of an offense and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars.

AN ORDINANCE.

Appropriating \$92.13 in favor of Union Structural Steel Company for Lion's cage in Zoo in Brackenridge Park.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of Ninety Two Dollars and Thirteen Cents, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated out of the 1915 General Fund to pay Union Structural Steel Company for fabricating one Lion's cage 7'x 9'x 5', same being constructed of one-inch round iron per plans and specifications submitted.

AN ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That it shall be unlawful for any person under the age of twenty-one(21) years, or for any student of any institution of learning, to enter or remain in any saloon or barroom, or in any house or place of business where any malt, vinous or spiritous liquor, or other intoxicating liquor, is sold in quantities less than one gallon which may be drunk on the premises; and any person violating this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum of not less than Five (\$5.00) Dollars nor more than Two Hundred(\$200.00) Dollars; and any invalidity of any part or application of this ordinance shall not render invalid any other part or application.

AN ORDINANCE.

Authorizing the payment of wages to laborers for the week ending Nov. 30th, 1915.
