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Comm. Anderson announced he had conferred with officials of the Los Angeles Heights Board of Education concerning their petition to acquire City property across from the Protestant Orphans' Home for a school site. He said he was agreeable to letting them have the property, so long as the City retains a corner of it which he wanted for a firehouse site. He suggested that since this is public property and the money all comes from the same source, the City let the Los Angeles Heights School District have the property for \$1.00.

Mayor Mauermann suggested Comm. Anderson have his firehouse site surveyed and marked off so there could be no question as to the part of the property he wants retained. The Mayor said he would take up the matter with the Board of Education and report back to the Commission.

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The Mayor announced approximately 100 inquiries had been received on the proposed sale of \$5,700,000 Bonds, on which bids are to be opened Thursday, October 17, 1946.

Comm. Steffler asked the status of the proposed baseball park, stating he did not want to see this matter die.

The Mayor replied he had seen a letter the day before from the St. Louis Browns baseball officials, indicating they were willing to accept the proposition worked out by the Chamber of Commerce Committee. He said he wanted to have the City Attorney check it over and put it in the form of an ordinance.

Comm. Anderson said there was never anything before the Council on this proposition and that he thought it should be gone into very thoroughly.

Mayor Mauermann said the Mayor and Commissioners would meet as a Committee of the Whole and go into it very thoroughly.

On motion of Comm. Hein, seconded by Comm. Callaghan and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson, the meeting adjourned Tuesday, October 15, 1946.
