Mr. Joe Winters, President of San Antonio Communication Workers which consists of six local unions, asked the council to help get San Antonio workers of the S. W. Bell Telephone Company reclassified from wage schedule 2 to schedule 1, which would mean an additional yearly payroll of \$250,000 for San Antonio. He stated that telephone rates are the same as in Ft. Worth and Dallas but they have a lower wage scale. He asked the Council to write a letter to Edwin Clark, President of Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. regarding this matter.

Mrs. Louise Ryan, President of the Telephone Operators local stated their records showed they were tops in every way but in wages.

Mr. Lowell Means, President of Local 643, gave the wage scale of various trades and compared them with the scale of communication workers. He asked the Council to write a letter or pass a resolution that they be reclassified the same as Ft. Worth and Dallas.

Mr. C. M. Collins, 226 Beverly Drive, appeared as a private citizen and gave his views on the ordinance banning sirens on ambulances. He felt there should be some way that ambulances could be allowed to use some type of warning device.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
