

AN ORDINANCE 04-190

DIRECTING THE CITY ATTORNEY TO PROCEED TO CONDEMN CERTAIN PROPERTY BELONGING TO T. B. BLACK, T. B. BLACK, JR., E. B. BLACK, ANNIE HACHER AND LEONA COVELL ON NOGALITOS STREET FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES AUTHORIZED BY LAW.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. Public necessity requires that the City of San Antonio appropriate private property for the use of the City for a street and other public purposes authorized by law to abate the traffic hazard at the place herein described, and to widen, regrade and improve Nogalitos Street, the property to be appropriated being situated within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas; and described as follows:-

2. Part of Lot No. 4, City Block No. 3558, containing 826.9 square feet, described by metes and bounds as follows: Beginning at a point in the west property line of Nogalitos Street and the north line of Lot 4, City Block 3558; thence in a southerly direction along the west property line of Nogalitos Street, a distance of 55.5 feet to the north property line of West Fest Street; thence in a westerly direction along the north property line of West Fest Street, a distance of 15.2 feet to the new established west property line of Nogalitos Street; thence in a northerly direction along the new established west property line of Nogalitos Street, a distance of 59.35 feet to the north line of Lot 4, City Block 3558; thence in an easterly direction along the north line of Lot 4, City Block 3558, a distance of 14.5 feet to the point of beginning.

3. Said property is owned or claimed by T. B. Black, whose residence is Route 5, Applewhite Road, San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas; T. B. Black, Jr. 317 Nogalitos Street, San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, E. B. Black, Houston, Harris County, Texas; Annie Hacker, Route 5, Applewhite Road, Bexar County Texas; and Leona Covell, 317 Nogalitos Street, San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas.

4. A plot of said property is herewith filed in the office of the City Clerk of the City of San Antonio and marked Exhibit A for identification.

5. Said property shall be condemned for the use of the City for the purpose hereinabove expressed; and the City Attorney is directed to file the necessary proceedings for the condemnation thereof; all as provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

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AN ORDINANCE 011-191

EXTENDING THE RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES OF THE SAN ANTONIO PUBLIC SERVICE COMPANY, TO USE THE PUBLIC WAYS OF THE CITY FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF GAS AND ELECTRICITY, FOR 20 YEARS, FIXING MAXIMUM RATES, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF THE ORDINANCE AND THE PAYMENT OF A CONSIDERATION OF \$100,000.00.

1. Whereas, it has been determined by the Board of Commissioners that the franchises of the San Antonio Public Service Company should be extended for 20 years from the expiration of its present franchises in consideration of agreed reductions in rates and a cash consideration of \$100,000.00; NOW, THEREFORE:-

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

2. That the San Antonio Public Service Company, a Texas corporation, is hereby granted the rights and privileges for the period beginning with the acceptance of this ordinance and ending on July 1, 1960, to distribute and sell gas (natural, artificial, or mixed) within the City of San Antonio, and to use and occupy the streets, avenues, alleys, public places and public ways of the city with conduits, pipes, and other property and facilities useful in connection with the sale and distribution of gas; subject, however, to such regulations with respect to such use and occupancy as are now in force or which may hereafter be ordained. Until changed by ordinance the maximum rate to be charged by the San Antonio Public Service Company to domestic consumers within the City of San Antonio for gas shall be 70 cents net per one thousand cubic feet, plus ten percent if payment is made more than ten days after date of rendition of the bill; provided, however, that until changed by ordinance the minimum monthly charge for each domestic gas customer shall not exceed the sum of 50 cents; and provided further, that the Company may render service to any of its consumers under optional rate schedules providing for a higher or different minimum charge.

3. That the San Antonio Public Service Company, a Texas corporation, is hereby granted the rights and privileges for the period beginning with the acceptance of this ordinance and ending on July 1, 1960, to distribute and sell electricity within the City of San Antonio, and to use and occupy the streets, avenues, alleys, public places, and public ways of the city with poles, wires, conduits, and other property and facilities useful in connection with the sale and distribution of electricity; subject, however, to such regulations with respect to such use and occupancy as are now in force or which may hereafter be ordained. Until changed by ordinance the maximum rate to be charged by the San Antonio Public Service Company to domestic consumers within the City of San Antonio for electricity shall be five cents net per kilowatt hour, plus ten per cent if payment is made more than ten days after date of rendition of bill; provided, however, that until changed by ordinance the minimum monthly charged for each domestic electric consumer shall not exceed the sum of 50 cents; and provided further, that the Company may render service to any of its consumers under optional rate schedules providing for a higher or different minimum charge.

4. That this ordinance shall not become effective and in force as to any of its terms unless within sixty (60) days after its final passage this ordinance is accepted in writing in its entirety by the San Antonio Public Service Company, acting by and through its officers thereunto duly authorized by resolution of its board of directors, and the payment by the San Antonio Public Service Company to the City of San Antonio of \$100,000.00 in cash, to be credited ratably to the various sinking funds of the City.

5. This ordinance shall be published at least 3 times in the San Antonio Light designated by the Mayor, and such publication shall be made at least 20 days before the final vote on this ordinance; and, this ordinance shall be read in full at three regular meetings of the Board of Commissioners.

AN ORDINANCE 04-192

AMENDING RULE 39 OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE GOVERNMENT OF TRAFFIC ON THE STREETS, PLAZAS AND PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO", PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 8TH DAY OF DECEMBER 1921, AS AMENDED.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Rule 39 of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE GOVERNMENT OF TRAFFIC ON THE STREETS, PLAZAS AND PUBLIC PLACES OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO", passed and approved on the 8th day of December, 1921, as amended, be and the same is amended hereby by adding the following paragraphs thereto:-

"39-d: The word 'park' and its derivatives, when used herein, shall mean to stop a vehicle and to let stand more than 3 minutes upon a public street.

"39-e: The word 'parking space', as used herein, shall mean an area contiguous to the curb on the roadway, 20 feet long and 8 feet wide, marked with white boundary lines, which is controlled by a parking meter in the manner and for the time as herein provided.

"39-f: The parking meter regulations fixed by this ordinance shall apply daily between the hours of 7:00 A. M. and 6:00 P. M.; except Sundays and the 1st day of January, the 19th of January, the 22nd day of February, the 2nd day of March, the 21st day of April, the 3rd day of June, and the 4th day of July, the 1st Monday in September, the 12th day of October, the 11th day of November, the last Thursday in November, and the 25th day of December, of each year.

"39-g: The following streets of the City of San Antonio are hereby designated as parking meter areas, and the time limit of parking on said streets shall be as hereinafter indicated:

"39-h: Twenty minutes parking:- Avenue E, west side Houston to Travis; East Travis Street, south side 114 to west line of St. Mary; East Travis Street, south side from Navarro to East building line of St. Anthony Hotel; East Travis Street, south side Alamo to Avenue E; Main Plaza, west side from Trevino to Commerce; Military Plaza, east side from Trevino to Commerce; Navarro Street, west side from Travis to Houston; Navarro Street, east side from Commerce to 308; North Alamo Street, east side Houston to Travis; North St. Mary, west side from south line of Travis to 323 North St. Mary; North St. Mary, west side from 207 to north end of River bridge; North St. Mary, east side from Travis to Houston; South Presa, west side from south line of Commerce to 211 South Presa Street; South St. Mary, west side from Commerce to Market; Trevino, north side from Main Plaza to Military Plaza; West Commerce, north side from west line of Soledad to 405 West Commerce; West Commerce, north side from 207 West Commerce to 217 West Commerce; West Commerce, south side from west line of Presa to 134 West Commerce; West Commerce, south side from west line of Corcoran to 228

West Commerce; West Commerce, south side from west line of St. Mary to Yturri; West Commerce, south side from Main to Flores; West Market, north side from St. Mary to Yturri; West Market, south side from west end of River bridge to west line of Casino Street; Villita Street, south side from Navarro west building line Federal Reserve Bank; South St. Mary, from south end of River bridge to Villita.

"39-i: Sixty minutes parking:- Alamo Plaza around the parks; Alamo Plaza, east side from Houston Street to Commerce Street; Alamo Plaza, west side from Houston Street to Commerce Street; Alamo Plaza Plaza, south side; Alamo Street, 100 block east side; Alamo Street, 100 block west side; Alamo Street, west side from Travis Street to Houston Street; Avenue E, east side from Houston Street to Travis Street; Broadway, east side from Houston to Travis; Broadway, west side from Travis to Houston; Casino, west side from Commerce to Market; College Street, north side from Losoya to St. Mary; College Street, south side from St. Mary to Losoya; Crockett Street, north side from east line of Losoya to St. Mary; Crockett Street, south side from St. Mary to east side of Alamo Plaza; Dolorosa Street, north side from Main Plaza to South Flores Street; Dolorosa Street, south side from Dwyer Avenue to South Flores Street; East and West Commerce Street, north side of Alamo to Navarro; East Commerce, south side from Alamo to River bridge; East Houston, north side from Alamo Plaza to North Flores Street; East Houston, south side from Alamo Plaza to North Flores Street; East Market, south side from Alamo to east end of River bridge; East Travis, north side from Avenue E to east of River bridge; East Travis, south side from east building line of St. Anthony Hotel to Alamo Street; East Travis, south side from St. Mary to Navarro; East Travis, south side from east end of River bridge to 114 East Travis; Galan, south side from Main Plaza to Military Plaza; Jefferson Street, east side from Houston to Travis; Jefferson Street, west side from Travis to Houston; Losoya Street, east side from Market to Houston; Losoya Street, west side from Houston to Market; Main Plaza, around parks; Main Avenue, east side from Commerce to Travis; Main Avenue, west side from Travis to Commerce; Main Plaza, east side from Dolorosa to Commerce; Main Plaza, west side from Dolorosa to Galan; Military Plaza, around City Hall Park; Military Plaza, east side from Dolorosa to Trevino; Navarro Street, east side from 308 to Travis; Navarro Street, east side from Market to Commerce; Navarro Street, west side from Houston to Market; North Flores, east side from Commerce to Travis; North Flores, west side from Travis to Commerce; North and South Presa Street, east side from Market to Houston; North and South Presa Street, west side from Houston to Commerce; North and South St. Mary Street, east side from Crockett to Market; North St. Mary Street, east side from Houston to College; North St. Mary, west side from south end of River bridge to Commerce; North St. Mary, west side from 323 to 207 North St. Mary; Soledad Street, east side from Commerce to Travis; Soledad Street, west side from Travis to Commerce; South Presa Street, west side from 211 to Market; West Commerce Street, north side from 405 West Commerce to Flores Street; West Commerce Street, north side from St. Mary Street to Soledad Street; West Commerce, north side from 217 West Commerce to St. Mary; West Commerce Street, north side from Navarro Street to 207 West Commerce; West Commerce, south side from River bridge to Presa Street; West Commerce, south side from 134 West Commerce to Corcoran; West Commerce, south side from 228 West Commerce to St. Mary; West Commerce, south side from Yturri to Soledad Street; West Commerce, north side from Alamo to Navarro; West Market, north side from west line of Yturri to Main Plaza; West Market, south side from west line of Casino to Main Plaza; West Market Street, north side, west end of River bridge to St. Mary; West Travis, north side from west end of River bridge to Flores; West Travis, south side from Flores to west end of River bridge; South St. Mary, west side to south end of River bridge; South St. Mary, east side Market to Villita; Villita, south side from east end of River bridge to west building line of Federal Reserve Bank; Villita Street, north side from Navarro to east end of River bridge.

"39-j: In said areas and such other parking meter areas hereafter created by ordinance, at places where parking is not forbidden by law, the Police Department shall install parking meters and mark parking meter spaces with white boundary lines in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

"39-k: It shall be unlawful for a person to park a vehicle at any place except within a parking space, in the parking meter areas.

"39-l. It shall be unlawful for any person to cause or suffer any vehicle under his control to be parked beyond the lawful period of time specified herein for the various parking meter areas.

"39-m: A vehicle shall be parked so that the fore part of such vehicle shall be nearest to the parking meter, and entirely within the white lines marking the parking space next to the meter.

"39-n: When a vehicle is parked in a parking space adjacent to a parking meter, upon entering the said parking space the driver of said vehicle shall deposit or cause to be deposited, a five

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cent coin of the United States of America in the parking meter; and the failure to deposit such five-cent coin shall constitute a violation of this ordinance. Then the parking space may be occupied by one vehicle during the parking time provided by the ordinances of the City for a part of the street where said parking space is located.

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"39-o: Upon the deposit of a five-cent coin of the United States of America therein, each parking meter will show a green signal which will remain shown for the period of time conforming to the parking time prescribed by the ordinances of this City for a part of the street where the meter is placed. Each meter will show said green signal and continue operating from the time of depositing said coin, until the expiration of the time fixed by ordinance as the parking time for the part of the street where the meter is placed. Each meter is so arranged that upon the expiration of said parking time, it will cease to show the green signal, indicating that the lawful parking time fixed by the ordinance of this City, has expired.

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"39-p: The five-cent coins required to be deposited in parking meters as provided herein, are levied, assessed and collected as fees to provide for the proper regulation of traffic, and the control of the public streets; the cost of supervising and regulating the parking of vehicles in the parking meter areas created hereby; and, to cover the cost of the purchase, supervision, protection, inspection, installation, operation, maintenance, control and use of the parking meters described herein; all being necessary elements of the exercise of the police power of the City to prevent the blocking and incumbering of the streets in the congested business district.

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"39-q: It shall be unlawful for a person to deposit a five-cent coin in a parking meter to prolong the parking time for a vehicle beyond the time fixed by ordinance for parking in the parking space next to which said meter is placed.

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"39-r: It shall be unlawful and an offence for any person to deposit or cause to be deposited in any parking meter, any slug or counterfeit of a five-cent coin of the United States of America.

"39-s: If a vehicle shall remain parked continuously in any parking space beyond the parking time fixed by the ordinances of the City for such parking space, it shall be a violation of this ordinance and punishable as herein set out.

"39-t: It shall be unlawful for any person to permit a vehicle owned or driven by such person, to be in a parking space next to a parking meter while said meter does not show a green signal.

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"39-u: It shall be prima facie evidence that a vehicle has been parked beyond the period of time fixed by ordinance; or, that the driver did not deposit a five-cent coin of the United States of America in the parking meter when the vehicle was parked in the space, when a vehicle stands in a parking space next to which the parking meter does not show a green signal.

"39-v: Any person who shall cause or suffer any vehicle registered in his name or any vehicle under his control, to be parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of an offence and upon conviction shall be fined as provided.

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"39-w: It shall be the duty of police officers of the City to record the number of each parking meter which indicates that the vehicle occupying the parking space next to such parking meter is parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance; the street and number adjacent to parking space; that said meter is operating; the State License number of such vehicle; the length of time during which such vehicle was parked in violation of the provisions of this ordinance; any other facts, a knowledge of which is necessary to a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending such violation; and, to file a complaint and prosecute the offender.

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"39-x: The police officer shall attach to the right front door handle or to the steering wheel of such vehicle, a notice that such vehicle has been parked in violation of a provision of this ordinance and summoning the owner and the driver to appear at the Office of the Clerk of the Corporation Court of the City in regard to such violation.

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"39-y: The owner or the driver may, within 18 hours after the time such notice was attached to such vehicle, appear and pay as guilty, to the Clerk of the Court a fine of \$1.00, without costs, for such violation. After the failure to make such payment within said 18 hours, the Clerk of the Court shall issue process for the appearance of the offender.

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"39-z: It shall be unlawful for any person to mar, remove, open, break, or impair the usefulness of any parking meter; but this shall not be construed to apply to officers of the City discharging the duty imposed on them of keeping said meters maintained and cool.

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lecting coins deposited.

"39-aa: The provisions of any ordinance in irreconcilable conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed; but such repeal shall be the extent only of such conflict, and such repeal shall only be effective insofar as such conflict relates to the parking meter areas herein provided; it being intended herein to regulate solely said areas defined in this ordinance and to repeal conflicting provisions of other ordinances insofar as they apply to said areas.

"39-ab: If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason held to be invalid by the courts, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance; and the City Commission hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more of the other sections, sentences, clauses or phrases be invalid; except that said City declares that should the courts hold that the provision charging a fee to cover the control, regulation and inspection of parking as herein provided is invalid, it would not have passed said ordinance nor have installed said parking meters."

2. It is ordered by a two-thirds vote of the full Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio that this ordinance shall receive final action without having been read at three several meetings of the Commission.

3. Whereas, it is necessary for the public safety of the City in the exercise of its police power for the proper regulation of traffic, the control of public streets and the prevention of the blocking and encumbering of the streets in the congested business district, an urgency is created that this ordinance take immediate effect upon its passage; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by four-fifths vote of the Commissioners it shall be effective, as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

Public necessity requires that the City of San Antonio appropriate private property for the use of the City for a street and other public purposes authorized by law to abate the traffic hazard at the place herein described, and to widen, regrade and improve San Pedro Avenue, the property to be appropriated being situated within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, Bexar
