

APRIL 20, 1944

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO,  
HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER OF THE CITY HALL IN SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS  
AT 10:00 O'CLOCK, A. M. ON THURSDAY, APRIL 20TH, 1944.

PRESENT: Mauermann, Callaghan and Hein. ABSENT: Steffler and Anderson. Mayor Mauermann presiding.

The Minutes of the meeting of April 13th and the recessed meeting of April 19th were read by the Clerk, and after a motion by Commissioner Hein, seconded by Commissioner Callaghan, were approved as read by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan and Hein. Nay, Steffler (Absent) and Anderson (Absent).

Two petitions of Albert Kaak were presented requesting permission to install two electric computing pumps at 825 San Pedro Avenue, and two electric computing pumps at 3101 McCullough Avenue, both of which petitions were referred to the Commissioner of Fire and Police for action.

The following petitions protesting annexation have been presented and referred to the Council as a Committee of the Whole:

Petition of L. J. Lassere and other residents of South San Antonio;

Petition of Mr. and Mrs. L. M. Bynum;

Petition of Mrs. Alma Mitchell and other residents of Davis Heights;

Petition of John J. Gleeson and other residents of the community known as Loma Vista.

Mr. Gleeson asked if he might be heard, and asked that his committee be allowed to appear before the Committee of the Whole. Mayor Mauermann answered that he would take the request up with the Commissioners, and if it was their wish, the Committee would be so advised.

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Commissioner Hein moved that a holiday be declared for San Jacinto Day, April 21st, which was seconded by Commissioner Callaghan, and carried by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan and Hein. Nay, Steffler (Absent) and Anderson (Absent).

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The Annexation Ordinance was read in full by the Clerk for the second time, and passed over to the third reading.

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As a matter of unfinished business, an ordinance which had been heretofore introduced and referred to the Committee of the whole was re-introduced, as follows:

"AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE CONTRACT  
BETWEEN BEXAR COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT  
NO. 8 AND THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO HANDLE THE SEWAGE OF  
SAID DISTRICT".

Mayor Mauermann asked City Attorney Cobbs whether or not the contracts of any other sewage districts would affect the delivery of the sewerage from District No. 8. Mr. Cobbs stated that they would not because Paragraph 3 of the contract with District 8 provided that the City was to take the sewerage at the point where the sewer line of the District entered the City of San Antonio and that the obligation of District No. 8 was to bring its lines to a connection point with the City. Mr. Cobbs then read Paragraph 3, as follows:

"3. The City of San Antonio will take the sanitary sewage of the Bexar County Water Control and Improvement District No. 8 for a term of 30 years at the point where the sewerage line of the District enters the property of the City and transport the sewage through the sewerage system of the City and treat it for disposal with the

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se sewage of the City."

At the request of Commissioner Callaghan, who said he wished more time to study the proposed contract, action on this Ordinance was deferred until the next meeting.

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The following bids were opened and read aloud and referred to the Purchasing Agent for tabulation:

- Bids to furnish Traffic Signal Lights to the City of San Antonio;
- Bids to furnish a tractor and Bulldozer to the Street Department;
- Bids to furnish radio equipment to the Police Department;
- Bids to furnish a tractor to the Fire Department.

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On motion by Commissioner Callaghan, seconded by Commissioner Hein, and carried by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein; Nay, Anderson (Absent), Steffler (Absent), the meeting adjourned April 20th, 1944.
