MONDAY, AUGUST 6th, A. D. 1923, 4 P.M.

AN ORDINANCE

ME-1513 REPEALLING AN ORDINANCE PASSED AND APPROVED JULY 30, 1923, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY OF CERTAIN CITY OF SAN ANTONIO PROMISSORY NOTES THEREIN DESCRIBED.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioner of the City of San Antonio, that,  
AN ORDINANCE passed and approved on July 30, 1923, entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO PROMISSORY NOTES, TO EVIDENCE MONEY BORROWED FOR THE USE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR PAYMENT OF OPERATING EXPENSES OF SAID CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING MAY 31, 1923; PLEDGING AS SECURITY FOR SUCH LOAN THE UNCOLLECTED TAXES AND REVENUES OF SAID CITY FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR AND THE PRECEEDING YEARS", be, and the same is hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE

-1514 AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE, EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CITY OF SAN ANTONIO PROMISSORY NOTES, TO EVIDENCE MONEY BORROWED FOR THE USE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR PAYMENT OF OPERATING EXPENSES OF SAID CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING MAY 31, 1923, PLEDGING AS SECURITY FOR SUCH LOAN THE UNCOLLECTED TAXES AND REVENUES OF SAID CITY FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR AND THE PRECEEDING YEARS.

WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio needs to borrow money for the purpose of paying operating expenses of said City during the fiscal year ending May 31, 1923, in anticipation of the receipts of uncollected taxes levied for that year and current revenues therefor; and

WHEREAS, the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, has submitted a proposition to the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio to loan to said City the funds required to pay said expense debts, incurred during said fiscal year ending May 31, 1923, and to accept from said City to evidence such loan, promissory notes bearing five per cent. (5%) annual interest, which proposition has been accepted by said Commissioners, THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section 1; That for the purpose of paying off the debts of the City of San Antonio incurred for current expenses during the fiscal year ending May 31, 1923, there shall be borrowed and secured from the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, an advance of money for said purpose in the amount of THREE HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$395,000,00) DOLLARS, which amount does not exceed the estimated income of said City for said fiscal year.

Section 2: That to evidence such loan, promissory notes of the City of San Antonio shall be executed and delivered to said City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, under and by virtue of the Charter of said City, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

Section 3: Said notes shall be numbered consecutively, from one (1) to fifteen (15), both inclusive, notes numbered one (1) to fourteen (14), both inclusive, shall be of the denomination of TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$25,000,00) DOLLARS, each, and note numbered fifteen (15) shall be of the denomination of FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$45,000,00) DOLLARS, aggregating the said sum of THREE HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$395,000,00) DOLLARS.

Section 4: Said notes shall be payable to the order of the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, and shall be dated the first day of August, 1923, and become due and payable on the first day of June, 1925, and shall bear interest at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum from date thereof until paid.

Section 5; Said notes shall be signed by the Mayor, Countersigned by the City Auditor and attested by the City Clerk of said City, and the corporate seal of said City shall be impressed on each of said notes.

Section 6: That to secure the payment of said notes, and all interest thereon, the current revenues of the City of San Antonio, arising from taxation, and all other sources, including the surplus of the revenues and income of said City for other preceding fiscal year after all current debts and obligations of such other year have first been paid in accordance with Section 52, of the Charter of said City (with the exception of approximately the sum of TWELVE THOUSAND (\$12,000,00) DOLLARS, heretofore appropriated for street work and construction), are hereby irrevocably pledged; and said notes, and all interest thereon, shall be paid from said income before such revenues may be lawfully appropriated to any other purpose or object whatsoever.

Section 7: That the proceeds of said loan shall be used to take up and pay off the outstanding indebtedness incurred for current expenses of said City during said fiscal year ending May 31, 1923.

Section 8: The form of said notes shall be substantially as follows, the notes numbered from one (1) to fourteen (14), both inclusive, being in the sum of TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$25,000,00) DOLLARS, each, and note numbered fifteen (15) being in the sum of FORTY-FIVE THOUSAND (\$45,000,00) DOLLARS.

aggregating THREE HUNDRED AND NINETY -FIVE THOUSAND (\$395,000,00) DOLLARS, this day given by the City of San Antonio to the City National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, evidencing a loan made to said City by said Bank, for the purpose of paying off certain indebtednesses incurred for operating expenses of said City during the fiscal year ending May 31, 1923; said notes having been issued under and by virtue of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and in pursuance of an ordinance passed by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on the 6th day of August, 1923, which ordinance is recorded in Vol. \_\_\_\_\_ page \_\_\_\_\_ et seq. of the minutes of said City Commissioners.

The date of this note, in conformity with said ordinance, is August 1st, 1923.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this series of notes, have been properly done and performed, and have happened in regular and due time, form and manner, as required by law; and that the full faith and credit of the said City of San Antonio, and the taxes and revenues collected for the General Fund for the fiscal year ending May 31, 1923, and all preceeding years, as provided in said ordinance passed August \_\_\_\_\_, 1923, (with the exception of approximately the sum of TWELVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$12,000,00) heretofore appropriated for Street Work under Construction) are hereby irrevocably pledged for the punctual payment of the principal, and interest of this series of notes.

The City of San Antonio reserves the right to pay or all of this series of notes at semi-annual periods by payment of the principal and accrued interest.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF the City of San Antonio, Texas, has caused its corporate seal to be hereto affixed, and this note to be signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, and attested by the City Clerk of said City, as of the 1st, day of August, 1923.

Section 1. That the following proposition of Antonio Saladino be and the same is hereby accepted; said proposition being as follows:

TO THE MAYOR AND COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Your Petitioner, Antonio Saladino, as a settlement of all matters in controversy growing out of the taking by the City of that certain tract of land lying and being in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, required for the opening of Lakeview Avenue, at intersection on the North side, with Cameron Street, more particularly described as follows:-

All that certain tract or parcel of land out of Lot A-31, City Block 132, more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows, to-wit; Beginning at the southwest corner of lot No. A-31, and northwest corner of Lot No. A-30, as shown on plat showing improvement of Lakeview Avenue now on file in the City Engineer's office. Thence in an easterly direction with the south line of Lot No. A-31, and north line of Lot No. A-30, a distance of one hundred twenty-five and five-tenths (125.5) feet to a point on the new established north line of Lakeview Avenue extension. Thence in a westerly direction with the new established north line of Lakeview Avenue extension a distance of one hundred thirty and five-tenths (130.5) feet to a point on the east line of Cameron Street. Thence in a southerly direction with the east line of Cameron Street, a distance of nineteen (19) feet to the place of beginning. and in settlement of the Condemnation Suit No. 61, now pending before the Judge of Bexar County, filed by the City, for the condemnation of said property, offers and proposes:-

First. To convey the same to said City by clear unencumbered title and to pay all current taxes thereon, in consideration of the city conveying to me by warranty deed, all that parcel and tract of land on the north side of the property newly established line of Lakeview Avenue, between Cameron and North Flores Street, in the City of San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, more particularly described as follows:-

All that certain tract or parcel of land out of lot A-20 in City Block 132, on the north side of Lakeview Avenue when opened and extended, and being the same property acquired by the City of San Antonio from F. C. Davis and J. E. Webb, and more particularly from F. C. Davis and J. E. Webb, and more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows, to-wit:- Beginning at the northwest corner of lot No. A-20, City Block No. 132, as shown on plat recorded in City Engineer's Record Book No. 6, page 145. Thence in an easterly direction with the south line of lot A-31, a distance of 111.6 feet to the southeast corner of lot No. A-31, and southwest corner of lot No. A-19. Thence in a southerly direction sixteen (16) feet to a point on the new established line of Lakeview Avenue extension. The above to be in full settlement and satisfaction of all damages to my property by reason of the opening of said street in addition I will pay to the City the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in cash in lieu of assessments for benefits on account of the opening of Lakeview Avenue, against the tract first above described, then in the name of S. Lucchese.

Possession of said property to be given immediately.

That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to acquire from said Antonio Saladino, in accordance with said proposition, the tract of land first in said proposition described, and the City does sell, and the Mayor is hereby authorized and empowered to execute a general warranty deed in the name of the City of San Antonio, conveying unto said Antonio Saladino the track of land last described in said proposition upon payment by said Saladino of the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) therein agreed to be paid, and his compliance with all the terms and conditions of said proposition.

Section 3. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to cause to be constructed the curbing referred to in said proposition and carry out all the terms thereof.

## RESOLUTION

Accepting paving on various streets having been skips- Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company.

## Resolution

Declaring certain tracks of the International-Great Northern Railroad Company dangerous to the public, and directing the City Attorney to petition the Railroad Commission of Texas to inquire into certain existing tracks of the International-Great Northern Railroad Company to set a public hearing and to order relocation of said tracks.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

Section One: That the part of the right-of-way and tracks of the International-Great Northern Railroad Company beginning at the northern limits of the City of San Antonio, and running in

a southwesterly direction through North Haven and Beacon Hill Addition, and along San Marcos Street to Ruiz Street, and in a southeasterly direction from San Marcos Street and Ruiz Street across City Blocks numbered 200, 199, 198, 219, and 220 to Morales Street, is dangerous to the public in that the same runs through a populous center with many dangerous street crossings and imperiling the lives and property of the public generally.

SECTION TWO. That the City Attorney be, and is hereby, instructed to petition the Railroad Commissioner of Texas to inquire into the existing arrangement of the tracks of the International-Great Northern Railroad Company between the points described in the First Section hereof, to set a public hearing, and investigate, and make an order requiring the International-Great Northern Railroad Company to relocate its tracks, and cause the same to be run in a westerly direction beginning at the northern limits of the City of San Antonio to a junction of the right-of-way and tracks of the San Antonio and Aransas Pass Railway Company, thence in a southerly and southeasterly direction over the right-of-way and tracks of said San Antonio and Aransas Pass Railway Company, or paralleling said right-of-way and tracks to a point in the junction of Leal and Colorado Streets, thence in an easterly and southeasterly direction across City Blocks numbered 2211, 198 and 220 to a junction with the present right-of-way and tracks of the said International-Great Northern Railroad Company.
