Mayor Quin introduced AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR ADMISSION TO ALL BUSINESSES, OPERATING UNDER AND BY VIRTUE OF A LICENSE FROM THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO TO ALL PERSONS WHO ARE CITIZENS OF THE LATIN-AMERICAN REPUBLICS OF THE WESTERN HEMISPHERE OR WHOSE RACIAL ORIGIN IS FROM SAME; AND PROVIDING FOR REVOCATION OF SUCH LICENSE BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO FOR VIOLATION OF SECTION I HEREOF, which was read first time and laid over.

Petitions to the City of San Antonio, Texas, for the adoption of ordinances, known as moving-picture and amusement ordinances, creating and maintaining a Moving-picture and Amusement censorship Board with the power and authority to act upon and censor public moving-pictures, films and amusements, as well as regulations and permits for the exhibitions of same, were read, and referred to City Attorney for opinion.
