

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 14TH, A.D.1922, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Rieden, Wright. Absent, Lambert.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

----MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS----

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation:
J.Garcia, for refund of Jitney License.
Gustavo Esparza, for refund of Jitney License.

Petition of Gulf Refining Co. for permit to install gasoline pump and tank Hackberry and Aransas Streets was read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police.

Petition to change the name of Reservoir Street to Pershing Ave. was read the second time and laid over.

Petition to have Duffield Street closed was refused on recommendation of the City Engineer that this street was necessary to form a connection between West Myrtle Street and West Laurel Street.

Reporting on the petition of property owners on Dumoulin Avenue, requesting the City to assist in laying sewers, the City Engineer recommended that the work be done on a 50/50 basis. Adopted.

The City Engineer recommended that the paving of West Myrtle St. between San Pedro and N.Flores St. be awarded the Uvalde Rock Asphalt Company. Adopted.

No. 433 AN ORDINANCE
Appropriating the sum of \$575.00 to be paid over to the State Health Officer of the State of Texas for the purpose of conducting educational work in the City of San Antonio for the prevention of diseases.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION ONE: That the sum of \$575.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1922 General Fund and charged to the Health Department to be delivered to the State Health Officer of the State of Texas, for the purpose of conducting an educational campaign in the City of San Antonio for the prevention of diseases.

SECTION TWO: The City Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant in in said sum of \$575.00 payable to the State Health Officer of the State of Texas, and to deliver same to said State Health Officer.

A resolution cancelling the contract awarded to King Furniture Company on the 24th day of August for chairs for the Council Chamber was read and held over.
