

JULY 5, 1945

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, HELD IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER OF THE CITY HALL AT TEN O'CLOCK, A. M., ON THURSDAY, JULY 5th, 1945.

PRESENT: Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, Anderson; Mayor Mauermann presiding.

The Clerk explained that due to the holiday (July 4) intervening between the meetings of July 3 and July 5, the minutes of the meetings of June 28, June 29 and July 3 had not been completed for reading at this meeting. Accordingly, on motion of Commissioner Anderson, seconded by Commissioner Hein and carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler, Anderson, the Council postponed the reading of these minutes to the next regular meeting.

Mr. C. J. Crampton and Mr. Howell Jones, officials of the Chamber of Commerce, appeared before the Council in behalf of the application of Eastern Air Lines for a new operation between New Orleans, La., and Tampa and Miami, Fla. Mr. Crampton explained this application had been filed with the Civil Aeronautics Board and would provide San Antonio with an airline connection with Miami and Tampa, with resulting connections with Eastern service to New York City and foreign lines. He proposed that the City of San Antonio consider becoming a party to this application and intervene on behalf of Eastern Air Lines, and that the City request the State of Texas, through Gov. Coke R. Stevenson and the Attorney General, to consider the Commissioner Anderson moved that the Mayor be instructed and empowered to take such steps as he deems necessary for the best interests of the City of San Antonio in this matter. After a second by Commissioner Callaghan, the motion was carried by roll call vote, to-wit: Ayes, Mauermann, Callaghan, Hein, Steffler and Anderson.
