Mr. Steve Moore, Director of the Convention & Visitors Bureau, explained the need for leasing of the Alamodome suite by the Bureau.

In response to a question by Mr. Webster, Mr. Moore spoke to the measurements of success in selling San Antonio by use of the Alamodome suite to entertain persons involved with future conventions bookings. He stated his belief that this use of the suite has been responsible for some \$50-60 million in bookings last year alone.

Mr. Ross asked for details comparing the number of persons entertained in the suite with the number of signed leases for future event bookings, stating his belief that they have a direct relationship.

Mr. Moore spoke to the available data indicating the direct relationship to use of the suite compared to the bookings derived from that usage, and spoke further to the three-year lease and its costs.

Mr. Alexander E. Briseño, City Manager, addressed a brief background history of the use of this suite by the Bureau.

He stated that this new proposed study by SAWS would be regional in nature. He further noted that the study will not include the Wilcox Sands, south of San Antonio, and outlined details of the proposed study.

Ms. Billa Burke urged that the new study not duplicate other such work by other agencies, and noted that state water-related agencies also might participate in its funding. She spoke to the need for a long-term monitoring plan for the Edwards Aquifer.

Mr. Ralph Huber, Chief Financial Officer, San Antonio Water System, explained the four Ordinances before City Council today as a package and the need for enactment of each in order to cover costs of SAWS' construction program. He then spoke to details of that program. A copy of his video presentation is made a part of the papers of this meeting. He outlined details of each proposed ordinance and its impact, and stated his belief that SAWS will need future financing by bond issue and additional revenues to finance payment of those bonds. He then spoke to improvements in the recent bond market.

The Following Citizens Appeared To Speak:

Mr. Tom Culbertson, 511 Westwood, spoke to his concern with SAWS' rush to sell these bonds, and spoke to the need for a thorough study of its figures and public hearings on the issue.

Mr. Jack Finger, P.O. Box 12048, stated his belief that some \$3 million of the requested bond funds would be a mistake, dealing with a wastewater recycling system. He spoke to his concerns with certain actions of SAWS and the need for public confidence in that utility. He also spoke to the alleged refusal of the SAWS chairman to reveal all the details of the construction program.

Mr. Faris Hodge, Jr., 140 Dora, spoke to the need to be conservative with water, and stated his opinion that there is no water shortage in San Antonio. He then spoke against water waste, since water is such a vital issue, and the need to develop water sources other than the Edwards Aquifer over the long-term, such as water from Canyon Lake or other reservoirs, or perhaps from the Gulf of Mexico. Finally, he spoke to the need for water conservation education.

\* \* \* \*

Mr. Joe Aceves, President, San Antonio Water System, explained the misconception concerning the questions of whether or not the wastewater recycling program should continue while the Mayor's Water Policy Committee still is preparing its final report. He defended the SAWS chairman's actions in that regard, and noted that the City Council had intended for SAWS' continuing program to go on, while the committee met. He then noted that the committee as a whole has not requested the information mentioned.

Mr. Peak confirmed that the City Council intended for the recycling program to go on while the committee met, and spoke in support for SAWS' planned bond sale, addressing the good bond ratings of the agency.

In response to a question by Mr. Solis, Mr. Aceves stated that SAWS is only retiring a part of its 1992 bonds.

In response to a question by Mr. Solis, Mr. Huber spoke to details of the SAWS board appointment process.

Mr. Ross noted that the water committee recognizes that SAWS programs must go on, while the committee meets, and stated his belief that expressions made today are only personal expressions, not those of the committee as a whole. He noted that the SAWS wastewater recycling program is a long-standing program requested by the City Council many years ago. He then noted that the bond issue matter was briefed to City Council weeks ago and has been discussed for some time.

In response to a question by Mr. Ross, Mr. Huber stated that SAWS has some \$600 millions in outstanding bonds, and about \$100 million in commercial paper. He explained the five-year projection of SAWS' needs, and stated that there is no written policy that forbids SAWS from having new bonded indebtedness exceed 20 per cent of its permanent debt. He noted that the 20 per cent figure is only a target figure, which can go up or down.

Mr. Ross stated his desire that SAWS seek City Council approval to exceed the 20 per cent figure, and spoke to his perceptions of the impact of today's proposed bond issue.

Mr. Huber noted that the commercial paper program of SAWS primarily provides funds for capital projects.

Mr. Ross discussed short-term versus long-term debt, and his concern over the bond rates involved. He also addressed his concern with SAWS exceeding the 20 per cent figure.

Mr. Huber explained SAWS' financing strategies, and noted that SAWS does not intend to have its commercial paper program exceed 20 per cent of the utility's total debt.

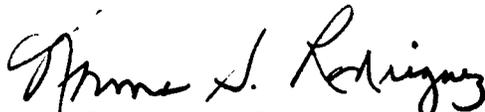
