OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO HELD IN
THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON
THURSDAY, APRIL 6, 1967 AT 8:30 A.M.

The meeting was called to order by the Presiding Officer, Mayor W. W. McAllister, with the following members present: McALLISTER, CALDERON, JONES, JAMES, COCKRELL, GATTI, TREVINO and PARKER; Absent: BREMER.

67-196 The invocation was given by Councilman S. H. James.

67-196 Mayor McAllister proclaimed the week of April 6 - 13, 1967 as Junior American Citizen Club Week in San Antonio in recognition of the work of the Daughters of the American Revolution, the individual teachers and administrators of the schools and the junior citizens who are doing so much to help young people understand and appreciate the great advantages of our democratic way of life and the responsibilities of good citizenship.

Copies of the proclamation were presented to Patrick Sigel, a student at Kate Schenck Elementary School and to Mollie Guerrero, a student at McKinley Elementary School.

Both explained the work of Junior Citizen Clubs and thanked the Mayor and City Council for the recognition.

67-196 Mayor McAllister invited everyone to attend the ground breaking ceremony for the Federal Pavilion at the HemisFair site on Saturday morning, April 8, 1967 at 10:30 A.M.

67-199 Next heard was zoning case 2924 to rezone Lot 149, NCB 11178 from "B" Residence District and "JJ" Commercial District to "B-3" Business District located between S. E. Military Drive, Harding Blvd. and Roosevelt Avenue, having 1,856.37' on S. E. Military Dr., 1,248' on Harding Blvd. and 30.03' on Roosevelt Avenue.

Mr. Burt Lawrence, Assistant Planning Director briefed the Council on the proposed change which the Planning Commission recommended be approved by the City Council.

Mrs. Odis Yates, 321 E. Harding, opposed rezoning because of the increased traffic that would be generated on Harding Blvd. She also felt that there should be a non-access easement all along Harding Boulevard.

The Applicant was not present.

After lengthy discussion by the Council, Dr. Calderon made a motion to uphold the recommendation of the Planning Commission and rezone the property with an additional non-access easement along Harding Blvd. for a distance of 936' and a 6' stockade type fence along the west 312' of the property on Harding Blvd, thence north a distance of 274.2', then west 653.96' thence north a distance of 15' thence north a distance of 150'. Mr. Wolf stated that if the subject property were rezoned the two foot strip of land in dispute would also be rezoned as it was included in the plat under discussion.

Mr. Burt Lawrence, Assistant Planning Director, briefed the Council on the proposed change which the Planning Commission recommended be approved by the City Council.

Mrs. Wayne Lee, 3947 Randolph Blvd, opposed the rezoning because she felt "B-3" zoning would allow too many undesirable businesses to be established. She stated it was not clear as to what could be developed in "B-3" zoning.

Mr. Lawrence explained the various uses allowed in "B-3" zoning.

Mrs. Smedley, 123 Roundtree, also opposed the rezoning, stating that she felt that this was strictly a residential area and her property would depreciate in value if the zoning was approved.

Rev. James Long, Pastor, Weidner Road Baptist Church, 121 N. Weidner Road, opposed rezoning and explained that there were already too many beer joints along Randolph Boulevard and if the subject property was rezoned it would allow further operations of beer places.

Dr. Parker explained that the Staff had made a complete study of the entire area and felt that this was the best protection for the immediate surrounding areas.

Rev. Long again asked the Council not to rezone the property, in particular the southwest corner of Weidner and Randolph Blvd.

At this time Mayor McAllister was obliged to leave the meeting and Mayor Pro-Tem John Gatti presided.

After further discussion by the Council, Mrs. Cockrell made a motion to approve the recommendation of the Planning Commission with the exception that the 0.28 acres of Tract A, NCB 13809, being the triangular property located at the southwest corner of Weidner Road and Randolph Blvd and being 290' along the west line of Weidner Road and 145' along the south side of Randolph Blvd. and 170' on the southwest portion to be rezoned "B-2" Business District instead of "B-3" Business District as recommended. Seconded by Mr. Jones, the motion, carrying with it the passage of the following ordinance, prevailed by the following vote: AYES: Calderon, Jones James, Cockrell, Gatti, Trevino and Parker; NAYS: None; ABSENT: McAllister and Bremer.
