

MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 11th, A.D.1922, 4 P.M.

PRESENT: Honorable O. B. Black, Mayor, presiding , and Commissioners Pfeiffer, Rieden, Wright. Absent, Lambert.

Minutes of previous meeting were ordered approved.

---MEMORIALS AND PETITIONS---

Petition of Evangelical Mexican Church for refund of taxes was read and referred to Commissioner of Taxation.

Petition of Smith and Walters for permit to install trash cans in Parks was read and referred to Commissioner of Parks, etc.

The following petitions were read and referred to Commissioner of Fire and Police:

Morgan Woodward Co. for permit to erect electric sign.

Robt. Morgan, to install gasoline tanks and pump, Ave. C and 7th St.

Do. to build drive in filling station Ave. C and 7th St.

W.W.Knight, for permit to install gasoline equipment and drive in filling station at Fredericksburg Road and Cincinnati Ave.

Petition of property owners to have McMullen street graded and gravelled was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets, etc.

Commissioner of Fire and Police recommended that the petition for street light at New Braunfels Ave and Nelson Avenue be granted. Adopted.

Commissioner Rieden introduced the following ordinance, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden, Wright.

AN ORDINANCE

Cancelling the contract for paving Ira Avenue from River Avenue to Alamo Ditch with the Uvalde Company, and releasing the contractor and surety on the construction and maintenance bonds, the Southern Surety Company, from further liability thereon.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

That whereas, the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, accepted the bid of the Uvalde Company on the 27th day of August, 1920, to pave Ira Avenue from River Avenue to Alamo Ditch, and afterward approved the bond of said Company with the Southern Surety Company as surety on its maintenance and construction bond to insure the proper completion of said work, and whereas, the Uvalde Company was unable to prosecute and complete said work because the abutting property owners would not cooperate with the proposed improvement, and had to abandon the same, Now therefore be it ordained that the said contract be and it is hereby cancelled, and that the surety on the aforesaid bonds be relieved from any and all liability assumed by said Company.

Commissioner Rieden introduced the following resolutions, which were read and adopted:

RESOLUTION

Calling for bids for construction of sidewalks, etc. on Dwyer Avenue, incident to widening.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City Clerk be and is hereby authorized to call for bids for the construction of 50 lineal feet of 7 foot concrete sidewalk and replacing gratings in front of French Building; also approximately 170 lineal feet of sidewalk 7 feet wide in front of the Yoakum property, both on Dwyer Avenue, between Main Plaza and Nueva Street. Bids to be received until 4 p.m. September 14, 1922. Certified check of 10% must accompany each bid, and the City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

RESOLUTION

Calling for bids for erection of steel awning on French Building on Dwyer Avenue.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City Clerk be and is hereby authorized to advertise for bids for the construction of a steel awning in front of the French Building on Dwyer Avenue, contractor to submit his own design, and bid to cover awning in place. Certified check of 5% must accompany each bid. Bids will be received until 4 P.M. September 18, 1922, and the City reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

Commissioner Rieden recommended that petition of citizens asking that the name of Clinton Avenue be changed to E.Magnolia Avenue be granted. Adopted.

Commissioner Pfeiffer introduced the following ordinance which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden, Wright. No. 246

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating sundry sums of money to pay various merchants bills.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the following sums of money or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and is hereby appropriated out of the following funds to pay various merchants bills as per itemized invoices on file:

River Improvement Fund	\$75.00
Park Improvement Fund	50.00
Street Com. Dep.	570.00
Health Dep.	635.00

Upon recommendation of the Purchasing Agent bids for supplying the City with fire hose were awarded as follows: Alamo Iron Works, 3000 ft.; Burke & Sims, 1000 ft.; S.A. Machine and Supply Co. 1000.ft.; Krueger Machinery Co. 1000 ft.

Only one bid being received for turret pipe, the City Purchasing Agent was instructed to readvertise for same.

Bids for coal from Sunset Wood Co. Blue Flags Industries, Allen Whitely, Mission Wood and Coal Co. were opened and referred to Purchasing Agent.

Bids for paving skips in Magnolia Ave. Mulberry Ave. Callaghan Ave and Waco Street, Rusk St. Villita Street, Crockett Street and Market Street for paving, were opened and referred to the City Engineer.

Commissioner Pfeiffer presented an ordinance designating Texas State Bank and Trust Company of San Antonio, Texas. as a special City Depository, and approving the bond of said depository, which was read and adopted by the following vote on roll call, to-wit: Ayes, Black, Pfeiffer, Rieden, Wright.

AN ORDINANCE

Appropriating \$1.00 to pay Collins Green.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the sum of \$1.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1922 General Fund to pay Collins Green fine ordered remitted by the Mayor.

On motion of His Honor, Mayor Black, the Commission now resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to canvass the returns of a special election held Sept. 9, 1922, for and against the issuance of \$300,000.00 additional Auditorium Bonds, and it appearing to the Commissioners that said election was held and conducted, and the returns and canvass thereof made, all as required by law, and as recorded on pages 84 and 85 of the Book of Consolidated Returns of Elections, (for the issuance of bonds 2294 votes. Against the issuance of bonds 2414 votes) and on motion, duly seconded and carried, the returns were adopted as recorded.
