THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, CITY HALL, ON
THURSDAY, APRIL 26, 1956 AT 9:30 A.M.

Mayor J. Edwin Kuykendall presiding.

Invocation by Councilman Mike Passur.

On motion of Mr. Baines, seconded by Mr. Winton, the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

A committee from the Daughters of the Republic of Texas headed by Mrs. Ralph Gibbs appeared before the council and petitioned for removal of parking meters which have been placed in spaces formerly reserved for their use. They presented the following statement.

"We are here to make a request concerning our need for some open parking space in front of a building on the Alamo Grounds which fronts on Crockett Street and faces the side of the Menger Hotel.

The building is Alamo Hall. It is the meeting place of the women who have the custody of The Alamo. There are numerous committees which meet there to do necessary work and the regular meetings of the local chapter of DRT are held there.

With some recently installed parking meters you have taken away the space in front of Alamo Hall that had been set aside for our loading and parking needs. Indeed you have made the approach to the building inaccessible to the ones who need to get there.

We respectfully request that the meters be removed and that the space again be made available to the women who give their time, money, and best efforts to the support of this world famous shrine which means so much to the City of San Antonio."

After discussion with various council members and after Mayor Kuykendall had been obliged to leave the meeting temporarily, Mayor Pro-tem Crumrine thanked the ladies for the information furnished and agreed to study the matter from all angles.

The Mayor Pro-tem then asked Mr. J. H. Turner, representing the petitioners for a department of Public Welfare for the City, to come forward and he presented him with the following statement which was read aloud by the Clerk:-

The City Council has given careful consideration to the request that the City establish a public assistance program by adopting certain ordinances and appropriating additional funds during the current budget year for expanded welfare activities. The Council is aware of the need for a more comprehensive public assistance program and recognizes that public assistance is a legitimate municipal responsibility.

Since the departments of the City are now preparing budget requests for 1956-57, we have requested the City Manager to investigate the expansion of the City's welfare program to determine the administrative problems which will have to be met, and to present to this council a plan combining, as far as feasible, all welfare activities under a single department, together with estimates of necessary appropriations to be included in the budget for the fiscal year 1956-57, in order to put such program into effect.
