DIRECTING THE CONDEMNATION OF PROPERTY OUT OF PARTITION 6 OF THE DOMINGO BUSTILLO SURVEY NO. 31, NOW OWNED BY THE HEIRS OF MARIA YGNACIA HURON MARTINEZ, DESIGNATED AS TRACT NO. 1, ON THE PLAT OF THE PLANT SITE OF THE SEWAGE TREATMENT WORKS NO. 700-1, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING A SEWAGE DISPOSAL PLANT AND OUTFALL SEWER EXTENSION.

1. That for the purpose of the preservation of the public health and safety, in the judgment of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, a public necessity exists for the establishing and maintaining a Sewerage Disposal Plant and Outfall Sewer Extension, and to effectuate this improvement it is necessary to appropriate for the purpose above set out, and other purposes incidental thereto, a part of the property and real estate of the heirs of Maria Ignacia Huron Martinez, and particularly the interest of Rafael Delgado age 17, Miguel Delgado age 16, Vicente Delgado age 13, Lucia Delgado age 11, Adela Delgado age 9, Arturo Delgado age 7, and Manuel Delgado age 2; all being minors and each holding a 1/56 interest in the following described property situated in Bexar County, Texas, more particularly described as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the City of San Antonio does hereby accept the attached written proposal of Guy C. Holder, Incorporated, offering to repair, renovate and reconstruct the Spanish Governors' Palace on Military Plaza, in and for the City of San Antonio, in accordance with the written specifications and description and plans prepared by Harvey P. Smith, Architect.

2. The party making said proposal shall strictly comply with all requirements made under the provisions of this ordinance and all instruments herein referred to, which are made a part hereof.

3. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to require and to approve on behalf of the City the proper bonds for the performance and completion of said undertaking.

4. That the Mayor is hereby authorized to cause and require the execution and delivery of written contracts to be drawn in accordance with said proposals, and the terms and conditions under stood and required as applicable.

5. That \$30,000.00 or as much thereof as is necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the 1922 General Fund Public Welfare Department, to pay the contractor and the architect, for the reconstruction of said Spanish Governors' Palace, and the supervision thereof.

AN ORDINANCE

Declaring the public necessity for the opening of ELM STREET from the north line of East Commerce Street to the south line of East Houston Street; directing the City Engineer to prepare plans, profiled, plats, specifications and property owners' roll, and report with regard thereto; declaring the intention of the City to assess part of the cost of said Improvement against the abutting property and the owners thereof.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

1. That a public necessity exists for the improvement of ELM STREET, in the City of San Antonio, by opening the same between its intersection with the north line of East Commerce Street and the south line of East Houston Street; and that special assessment and taxes shall be made and levied, as provided by law and Ordinance, on account of the cost of such improvement.

2. That the improvement shall in general consist of the opening and extension of said street between the points aforementioned, by setting back the street and sidewalk lines; removing such buildings, structures and other improvements as may conflict with the new lines of the street; and the acquiring of such property as may be necessary so that said street, when completed, shall have a width of approximately sixty feet (60') between property line, with a roadway of approximately forty-four feet (44') and sidewalks approximately eight feet (8') in width on each side thereof.

3. That the City Engineer is hereby directed to prepare plans, profiles, plats and specifications covering the proposed improvement, in accordance with this Ordinance, and to report same to these Commissioners forthwith, together with a statement of the cost of such improvements, the names of the property owners abutting thereon, the description of the property which will abut upon said street, as opened, and the amount, if any, to be assessed against said owners and said property as their, or its, cost of making such improvements.

4. That the cost of said improvements shall be discharged as follows:

(a) An amount, not exceeding three-fourths ($\frac{3}{4}$) of the whole cost thereof, shall be paid by the owners of the property abutting on said street, as opened and extended, and shall be assessed against them and their property, as provided by law and Ordinance, provided, however, that no assessment shall be made against any property or owner thereof, until after legal hearing notice shall have been given to said property owners and legal hearing had; nor shall any assessment be made against any property or owner thereof in excess of the actual benefit to

such owner in the enhanced value of his property by means of such improvement as ascertained at such hearing.

(b) The remainder of the cost of said improvement shall be paid for by the City of San Antonio.
