AN ORDINANCE (1522) *OJ-51*

AMENDING AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PROCEDURE IN THE CORPORATION COURT OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, PASSED AND APPROVED ON THE 4TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, A.D. 1928.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Section 2 of an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING PROCEDURE IN THE CORPORATION COURT OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO", passed and approved on the 4th day of September, A. D. 1928, be and the same is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:-

2. "SECTION 2: The Judge of said Court shall be appointed as provided by the Charter and Ordinances of the City of San Antonio. The Board of Commissioners shall appoint one clerk and six or more deputy clerks of said Court, one of whom shall be on duty at the said Court at all hours and times, under such regulations and equality of hours of service as may be fixed by said judge and ~~as~~ provided by law. The Board of Commissioners shall appoint one chief bailiff and two deputy bailiffs of said Court who shall perform all such duties as required of them by law. The appointment of the clerk and deputy clerks and the appointment of the chief bailiff and deputy bailiffs shall be entered upon the Minutes of said Court. The Judge of said Court, the clerk and all deputy clerks and the chief bailiff and all deputy bailiffs shall take the oath of office prescribed by the Constitution and give such bond as is required by the Charter and Ordinances of said City."

3. WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of order, good government and public safety that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by a four-fifths vote of the Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

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AN ORDINANCE (1567) **OJ-53**

CREATING AND MANIFESTING CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO AND THE UNITED STATES, WAR DEPARTMENT, TO TREAT SEWAGE FROM FORT SAM HOUSTON.

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WHEREAS, the City of San Antonio has been receiving and treating sewage from Fort Sam Houston, such sewage flowing through the San Antonio sewers and into and through the San Antonio Sewage Disposal Plant; and,

WHEREAS, it has been agreed that the United States, War Department, should pay for said services, to the City of San Antonio, the sum of \$1800.00 per annum, beginning July 1st, 1940, said contract to run for a period of one year and to be renewable for succeeding periods of one year each from and after June 30th, 1941; and,

WHEREAS, said amount of compensation is based upon an average population of Fort Sam Houston of approximately 9,000 inhabitants, with a sewage flow of 50 gallons per capita per day, and a treatment cost of \$11.90 per million gallons; NOW, THEREFORE:-

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

That this ordinance creates and manifests a contract by and between the City of San Antonio and the United States, War Department, wherein it is agreed as follows:

That in consideration of the City of San Antonio taking and treating said sewage from Fort Sam Houston, the United States, War Department, shall pay said sum of \$1800.00 per annum to the City of San Antonio for said services to be rendered from and after July 1st, 1940 to June 30th, 1941.

That it is further agreed that the contract shall be renewable for succeeding periods of one year each, and that the sum stipulated, \$1800.00 per annum, is subject to agreed adjustment upon renewing of the agreement, if it is found that the estimated cost of treatment to the City of San Antonio has materially changed or if the present population of Fort Sam Houston shall have materially changed.

AN ORDINANCE (1580) *OJ-56*

ACCEPTING AND APPROVING THE SECURITIES PLEDGED BY THE NATIONAL BANK OF COMMERCE OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, TO SECURE THE CITY FUNDS DEPOSITED AND TO BE DEPOSITED IN SAID BANK BY THE CITY DURING THE FISCAL YEAR 1939, AND DIRECTING THE DEPOSITING OF SAID SECURITIES FOR SAFE KEEPING AND RELEASING THE SURETIES ON BONDS ON RECEIPTS NOS. 8, 11 AND 14 GIVEN BY SAID BANK AS CITY DEPOSITORY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That the securities pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio by the National Bank of Commerce of San Antonio, Texas, as City Depository, to secure the Funds of said City, deposited and to be deposited, in said Bank during the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1939 and ending May 31, 1940, be and the same are hereby accepted and approved, and that receipt signed by the Mayor, countersigned by the City Auditor, be given said Bank for securities pledged by it, which said securities are described as follows:

Securities pledged by the National Bank of Commerce are described in Receipt No. 1 attached to Ordinance dated August 2, 1939, Receipt No. 12 attached to Ordinance dated December 14, 1939, Receipt No. 15 attached to Ordinance dated February 1, 1940, and attached Receipt No. 16, which are made a part of this ordinance by reference as fully as if they were specified herein.

2. The receipts given to said Bank for securities pledged by it shall recite, in substance, that the said securities have been duly pledged with the Governing Body of the City of San Antonio, by the National Bank of Commerce, San Antonio, Texas, as a Depository of said City, for the purpose of securing the Funds of said City, deposited and to be deposited, in said Bank during the Fiscal Year beginning June 1, 1939, upon the terms and conditions prescribed and provided by law.

3. It is directed that said securities be deposited by the Mayor, for safe-keeping in safe deposit box in the vaults of the National Bank of Commerce rented by the City from the said Bank.

4. That all securities on all bonds on Receipts Nos. 8, 11 and 14, given to said City by said National Bank of Commerce, as City Depository, be and are hereby released from further liability as sureties on such bonds.

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AN ORDINANCE (1581) *OJ-57*

REGULATING THE OPERATION OF BICYCLES AND PLAY VEHICLES ON THE STREETS OF
THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, PROVIDING PENALTIES AND REPEALING CERTAIN ORDINANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. REGARD FOR SAFETY. - Every person operating a bicycle or riding upon any coaster, skates, sled or toy vehicle on the streets shall at all times operate such devices with due regard for his own safety and for the safety of other persons lawfully upon the street.

2. DEFINITIONS. - In construing this ordinance and the amendments thereto, the following terms shall be used in the sense indicated, unless inconsistent with the text:-

(1) VEHICLE - Every device in, upon, or which by any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except devices moved by human power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

(2) STREET OR HIGHWAY - The entire width between the boundary lines of every way publicly maintained when any part thereof is open to the use of the public for purposes of vehicular travel.

(3) ROADWAY - That portion of a street improved, designed or ordanarily used for vehicular travel.

(4) PEDESTRIAN - Any person afoot.

(5) BUSINESS DISTRICT - The territory contiguous to and including a highway when fifty per cent (50%) or more of the frontage thereon for a distance of 300 feet or more is occupied by buildings in use for business.

(6) SIDEWALK - That portion of a street between the curb lines, or the lateral lines of a roadway, and the adjacent property lines, intended for the use of pedestrians.

(7) CROSSWALK - (a) That part of a roadway at an intersection included within the connections of the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs, or in the absence of curbs from edges of the traversable roadway.

(b) Any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines or other markings on the surface.

(8) OFFICIAL TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES - All signs, signals, markings and devices not inconsistent with this ordinance placed or erected by authority of the City Commissioner for the purpose of regulating, warning, or guiding traffic.

3. TOY VEHICLE. - The phrase "toy vehicle" as used in this ordinance shall have its usual, customary and ordinary meaning, without regard to the definition of "vehicle" contained in Section 2 of this ordinance.

4. RIDING ON SIDEWALKS AND ROADWAYS.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a bicycle on any sidewalk within a business district.

(b) Every person operating a bicycle on a sidewalk outside of a business district shall do so on the right hand side of such sidewalk, insofar as practicable, and shall at all times yield the right-of-way to pedestrians.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person to ride upon any coaster, skates, sled or toy vehicle upon the roadway of any street, provided, however, that this provision shall not be construed to prohibit the necessary crossing of the roadway with such devices at cross walks.

9d) Every person riding any coaster, skates, sled or toy vehicle shall do so

upon the right hand side of such sidewalk insofar as practicable, and shall at all times yield the right-of-way to pedestrians.

5. TRAFFIC LAWS APPLY TO PERSONS RIDING BICYCLES. - Every person operating a bicycle upon the streets within the City of San Antonio shall be subject to the provisions of all the traffic ordinances of the City of San Antonio, applicable to the driver of a vehicle, provided, however, that specific provisions of this ordinance shall control in case of conflict with such traffic ordinance, and, provided further, that such traffic ordinances are not inapplicable by reason of their nature.

6. OFFICIAL TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES APPLICABLE. - Every person operating a bicycle upon the street within the City of San Antonio shall comply with all traffic control devices applicable to the driver of a vehicle, provided, however, they are not inapplicable by reason of their nature.

7. MANNER OF RIDING - NUMBER OF PERSONS CARRIED.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a bicycle except while upon the permanent and regular seat attached thereto.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person operating a bicycle to carry any other person upon the handle-bars or frame thereof or in any manner other than upon a permanent and regular seat thereon.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person to ride upon a bicycle otherwise than as authorized herein.

(d) It shall be unlawful for any person operating a bicycle on the sidewalks or streets of the City of San Antonio to engage in any trick or stunt riding or to ride without maintaining full control of such bicycles and without keeping both hands on the handle grips, except when necessary to give, with the left hand and arm, the required signals of intention to change course or to reduce speed or stop.

8. CARRYING ARTICLES. - It shall be unlawful for any person operating a bicycle to carry any package, bundle or articles which prevents him from keeping both hands upon the handle grips.

9. RIDE NEAR RIGHT-HAND CURB. - It shall be the duty of all persons operating a bicycle on the roadway of any street to ride as closely as practicable to the right hand curb or edge of the roadway.

10. CLINGING TO VEHICLES. - It shall be unlawful for any person operating a bicycle or riding upon a coaster, skates, sled, or toy vehicle to cling to or attach himself or such bicycle or such coaster, roller skates, sled, or toy vehicle to any vehicle, or to any other bicycle, coaster, skater, sled or toy vehicle.

11. RIDING IN PAIRS OR GROUPS. - It shall be unlawful for persons riding bicycles to ride in pairs or groups and to ride otherwise than in single file.

12. LAMPS ON BICYCLES. - It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a bicycle during the period between one half hour after sundown to one half hour before sunrise, or at any other time when there is not sufficient natural light to render clearly discernible persons and vehicles on the streets at a distance of 500 feet, unless such bicycle is equipped with a lighted electric head lamp and a lighted electric tail lamp or a rear reflector meeting the following requirements:

Head lamps shall be firmly attached to the front of such bicycle and shall cast a white light to the front clearly visible from a distance of 500 feet under normal atmospheric conditions. Tail lamps and rear reflectors shall be firmly attached to the rear of such bicycle.

Tail lamps shall emit a red light to the rear clearly visible from a distance of 500 feet under normal atmospheric conditions. Rear reflectors shall be red in color, not less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, and contain one lens or a group of smaller lenses, and shall be visible at a distance of 300 feet when illuminated by vehicular head lamps complying with the ordinances of the City of San Antonio.

13. AUDIBLE SIGNALS. - It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a bicycle unless it is equipped with a ball or ^{other} ~~toher~~ device capable of giving a signal audible to any person of normal hearing for a distance of at least 100 feet, provided, however, that no siren shall be a part of any bicycle equipment nor used upon a bicycle, by any person.

14. WARNING WITH AUDIBLE SIGNAL. - It shall be unlawful for any person operating a bicycle on a sidewalk to approach nearer than 25 feet to the rear of any pedestrian, for the purpose of overtaking and passing said pedestrian, unless he shall have first given an audible warning signal, as set out in Section 13 above.

15. PARENT OR GUARDIAN. - It shall be unlawful for the parent of any child or the guardian of any ward to authorize or knowingly permit any such child or ward to violate any of the provisions of this ordinance.

16. IMPOUNDING BICYCLES. - Whenever any bicycle shall be operated by any male person under the age of 17 years, or by any female person under the age of 18 years, in violation of any provision of this ordinance, such bicycle may be seized by any member of the Police Department of the City of San Antonio and impounded in any place designated by the Fire and Police Commissioner of the City of San Antonio for such purposes. Such bicycle so impounded, shall be surrendered to the parent or guardian of said person, without charge, after a full explanation to such parent or guardian of the reason for the impounding of such bicycle. A complete record of each such impounding shall be kept by the Police Department of the City of San Antonio.

17. PENALTY. - Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a fine in any sum not exceeding \$200.00.

18. Sections 14 and 15 of Chapter 22 of the Revised Criminal Ordinances of the City of San Antonio of 1899 be and the same are hereby in all things repealed; the last phrase of Section 5 of Chapter 22 of the Revised Criminal Ordinances of the City of San Antonio of 1899, reading as follows: "or to go upon roller skates, bicycles or velocipedes upon the sidewalks of the city", be and the same is hereby in all things repealed.

19. This ordinance is cumulative of all other ordinances pertaining to the subjects herein covered and not repealed by Section 18 hereof, and is particularly cumulative of and supplemental to all traffic ordinances passed and approved by the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, and this ordinance shall not be construed as repealing any provisions of said ordinances.

20. SAVING CLAUSE. - If any clause or section, sentence or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the courts, such decision shall not affect the validity or the constitutionality of the remaining portion of this ordinance; and the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, hereby declare that they would have passed this ordinance and approved it irrespective of the fact that anyone or more of the other sections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

21. EMERGENCY. - The fact that there exists an increasing necessity for adequate and increased regulation of bicycle traffic within the City of San Antonio, to preserve life, creates an urgency and imperative public necessity for the preservation of the public health,

safety and welfare of the residents of the City of San Antonio that this ordinance take immediate effect from and after its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, and it is so ordered.

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AN ORDINANCE (1582) OJ-58

PROVIDING FOR COMPULSORY TRAFFIC ACCIDENT REPORTING.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. DUTY TO REPORT ACCIDENTS TO POLICE. - The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury to or death of any person, or in total property damage to an apparent extent of not less than \$25.00, or in any damage to traffic control devices or other public property, shall immediately stop such vehicle at the scene of such accident, and shall immediately and by the quickest means of communication, notify the Police Department of the City of San Antonio of such accident or cause said Police Department to be notified, and shall thereafter remain at the scene of such accident until a police officer arrives.

2. DUTY UPON STRIKING UNATTENDED VEHICLE. - The driver of any vehicle which either (a) collides with any vehicle which is unattended, or (b) collides with any private property under circumstances not requiring a report to the Police Department, as provided for in Section 1 above, shall immediately stop and then and there either locate and notify the owner or person in control of such stricken vehicle, or private property, of the names and addresses of the driver and owner of the vehicle striking the unattended vehicle or private property, or shall leave in a conspicuous place in or on the stricken vehicle or private property, a written notice giving the names and addresses of the driver and owner of the striking vehicle and a statement of the circumstances under which the accident occurred.

3. WHEN DRIVER UNABLE TO NOTIFY POLICE OR GIVE INFORMATION.- Whenever the driver of a vehicle is physically incapable of immediately notifying the Police Department, in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 above, or to give the information required in Section 2 above, and there is another occupant in the vehicle at the time of the accident capable of fulfilling such requirements, such occupant shall fulfill, or cause to be fulfilled, such

requirements.

4. TELEPHONE REPORT OF DAMAGED VEHICLES. - The owner or person in control of any garage or repair shop to which any motor vehicle showing evidence of having been involved in any accident (regardless of amount of damage) or of having been struck by any bullet, is brought, shall immediately telephone such fact to the Police Department of the City of San Antonio, unless said motor vehicle will be in the possession of said garage or repair shop for a period longer than 24 hours after such motor vehicle is received.

5. GARAGES TO REPORT DAMAGED VEHICLES. - The owner or person in control of any garage or repair shop to which any motor vehicle, showing evidence of having been involved in an accident (regardless of amount of damage) or of having been struck by any bullet, is brought, shall furnish a written report to the Police Department of the City of San Antonio, within 24 hours after such motor vehicle is received, on report forms furnished by said Police Department which shall contain such information as may be required by said Police Department.

6. It shall be unlawful for any garage or repair shop to refuse to furnish the reports required under Sections 4 and 5 hereof.

7. PENALTY. - Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, shall be punished by fine in any sum not exceeding \$200.00.

8. SAVING CLAUSE. - If any clause or section, sentence or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the courts, such decision shall not affect the validity or the unconstitutionality of the remaining portion of this ordinance; and the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, hereby declare that they would have passed this ordinance and approved it irrespective of the fact that any one or more of the other sections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

9. EMERGENCY. - The fact that there exists an increasing necessity for adequate and comprehensive knowledge of the occurrence of accidents within the City of San Antonio, to preserve life and property, creates an urgency and imperative public necessity for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of San Antonio that this ordinance take immediate effect from and after its passage by a four-fifths vote of the Board of Commissioners of the City of San Antonio; and it is so ordered.

That to provide for the support and maintenance of the Carnegie Library in said City, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1939 and ending May 31, 1940, a special tax of \$0.035 on every One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) valuation on all property mentioned in Section 1 hereof.

EMERGENCY, WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, to-wit: to preserve the financial and borrowing credit of the City, to secure funds for maintaining the necessary functions of government, and pay the debts of the City, that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by a vote of four-fifths (4/5) of the Board of Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas; and it is so ordered.

LEVYING SPECIAL TAXES FOR THE PAYMENT OF INTEREST ON AND TO CREATE A SINKING FUND FOR THE ULTIMATE PAYMENT OF CERTAIN ISSUES OF BONDS, ISSUED ON THE CREDITS OF IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS NO. 4, 7, 8, 12, 14, 15, IN THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JUNE 1, 1939 AND ENDING MAY 31, 1940.

Section 4: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$5,000.00, issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 12, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 17th day of September, 1909, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1939 and ending May 31, 1940, a special tax of Four Cents (\$0.04) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 12, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the City Council

of said City.

Section 5: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$17,500.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 14, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 21st day of June 1919, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1939 and ending May 31, 1940, a special tax of Seven Cents (\$.07) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of the State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 14, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of said City.

Section 6: That to provide for the payment of the interest on a certain issue of bonds in the sum of \$75,000.00 issued on the credit of Improvement District No. 15, as authorized at a special election held in said Improvement District on the 25th day of October 1938, in accordance with Section 54 of the Charter of the City of San Antonio, and to create a Sinking Fund for the ultimate payment thereof, there is hereby levied for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 1939 and ending May 31, 1940, a special atx of Two Cents (\$.02) on the One Hundred Dollars valuation on all property, real, personal and mixed, not otherwise exempted by the Constitution and Laws of this State, and situated in what is known as Improvement District No. 15, in the City of San Antonio, as the same has been defined by ordinance of the Board of Commissioners of said City.

Section 7: EMERGENCY. WHEREAS, an emergency is apparent for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety, to-wit: to preserve the financial and borrowing credit of the City, to secure funds for maintaining the necessary functions of government, and pay the debts of the City, that requires this ordinance to become effective at once; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by a vote on four-fifths (4/5) of the Board of Commissioners, it shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio, Texas; and it is so ordered.

AN ORDINANCE (1595) OJ-67

REGULATING THE DISTRIBUTION OF SAMPLES, REQUIRING A PERMIT, AND PROVIDING
A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to distribute from house to house or to any residence or residences, within the corporate limits of the City of San Antonio, any samples of any medicine or remedy, whether the same is in liquid or solid form or whether same is to be used or taken internally or externally, without first having obtained a permit from the License and Dues Collector of the City of San Antonio as provided for herein.

2. Each applicant for such permit shall apply on a form furnished by the License and Dues Collector, stating the following:-

Name of applicant

Name of concern of which applicant is an employee or a proprietor.

If applicant is a firm, the names and addresses of the members of such firm.

If applicant is a corporation, the local address of such corporation, the names and addresses of the President and Secretary of such corporation, and if such president and secretary do not reside in the City of San Antonio, the names and addresses of the manager and agent in charge in the City of San Antonio, together with the phone number of such establishment.

If applicant is an individual, name, address and phone number of such applicant.

Name of the medicine or remedy to be distributed as samples, together with a brief description thereof.

Applicant shall also present to the License and Dues Collector, a certificate from ~~the~~ Director of Public Health of the City of San Antonio that he has made an examination of the remedy sought to be distributed as samples and is of the opinion that same would not be injurious to public health if distributed indiscriminately or promiscuously from house to house or to any residence or residences within the City of San Antonio.

3. The License and Dues Collector, upon payment of a fee of \$2.00, shall issue such permit to such applicant on receipt of such application and certificate of said Director of Public Health, which permit shall entitle applicant to distribute such medicine or remedy from house to house or to any residence or residences in the City of San Antonio for a period of one year from the date of issuance of said permit.

4. A separate permit shall be required for each separate medicine or remedy sought to be distributed as samples under this ordinance.

5. The term "house" as used herein is used synonymously with the term "residence", and the term "residence" as used herein is used in its ordinary, usual and customary meaning.

6. Any person violating any of the terms or provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not to exceed \$200.00, and in addition thereto the permit of such person may be revoked by the Judge of the Corporation Court.

7. If any part or section of this ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional, it shall not affect the remainder thereof.

8. The fact that there is a grave imperative public emergency and an urgency caused by the indiscriminate distribution of free samples of medicines and remedies from house to house in the City of San Antonio which is dangerous to the public health and to the occu-

pants of such houses, particularly to the children who reside in such houses, this ordinance shall take immediate effect upon its passage by a four-fifths majority vote of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio.

AN ORDINANCE (1645) OS - 75

AN ORDINANCE (1682) *OJ-76*
 AMENDING RULE 37 OF THE TRAFFIC CODE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That Rule 37 of the Traffic Code be and the same is hereby amended so as to hereafter read as follows:-

"Rule 37. In places herein set out, vehicles may park head-in on the right hand side of the street at an angle to the curb; where the angle is indicated by signs or markings on the pavement, or by parking stalls marked on the pavement, vehicles shall park at the angle so indicated and within the stall where a parking stall is indicated:

- a. On the east side of Alamo Plaza, except where otherwise prohibited by ordinance.
- b. On the west side of Alamo Plaza at an angle of 45 degrees.
- c. On the west side of Military Plaza.
- d. On the south and west sides of the park on Military Plaza on which the City Hall is located."

2. WHEREAS, it is necessary for the public safety in the City of San Antonio in the exercise of its police power for the proper regulation of traffic, the control of public streets and the prevention of the blocking and encumbering of the streets in congested business areas; an urgency is created that this ordinance take immediate effect upon its passage; therefore, upon the passage of this ordinance by a vote of four-fifths of the Commissioners, it shall be effective as made and provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.
