64-207 The City Manager's Office made the following report on petitions:

- 1) Petition of Renken and Kuentz Automotive Service, requesting a permit to install one 8,000 gallon underground gasoline storage tank and pumps at 201 Burnet Street, Lot 11, Blk 24, NCB 534, which is zoned "J" Commercial and in the First Fire Zone.

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Fire Prevention Inspectors have made an inspection of the premises at 201 Burnet Street, and have found that the installation of an 8,000 gallon capacity underground gasoline storage tank and dispensing pump would not be in violation of existing Fire Code Regulations. The Fire Chief has contacted the representatives of this firm and has so informed them.

64-207 2) Petition of E. J. Wernette, Sr., 2511 Cincinnati, and others, requesting the City to lower the new curb on Stonegate along with lowering the alley a short distance to correct a bad drainage problem.

Our investigation reveals that with the installation of Storm Drainage Project 57, 58-A, Stonegate has been rebuilt except for curbs. The old curb is to remain. During excavation two sections of the old curb at the alley fell over and had to be replaced. They were replaced at the same grade and included a low curb for access to the alley as it had before. It would be impractical to lower the curb grade at this point due to the fact the grade of Stonegate would have to be lowered also.

Our investigation reveals that there is sufficient fall for water to drain from this alley properly. Now that the underground system has been installed and a proper outfall is available, it is our opinion that the drainage problem will be eliminated.

It is, therefore, our recommendation that no further action is necessary.
