NOTICE TO BIDDERS

Sealed proposals for furnishing all material, equipment, apparatus, appliances, tools and labor necessary to the construction and completion of a Sewage Treatment Works for the City of San Antonio, Texas, will be received at the office of the undersigned, City Hall, San Antonio, Texas, up to 10 o'clock a. m. April 1st, 1929, and then and there publicly opened, read and referred to the City Council for their action.

The contemplated plant will be located on a tract of land about seven and one-half miles southerly from the City Hall, about one-half mile east of the old San Antonio-Corpus Christi highway.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a certified check, drawn on a solvent State or National Bank of San Antonio, Texas, made payable without recourse to the order of C. M. Chambers, Mayor, in the sum of twenty-five thousand (\$25,000) Dollars, as aguaranty that Bidder will enter into contract and execute bond and guaranty in the forms provided within ten (10) days after notice of award to him.

Proposals without certified checks will not be considered. The successful bidder must furnish bond in the amount of fifty (50) per cent of the sum bid, on form attached to "Form of Contract" included with specifications, from reliable Surety companies authorized to do business in Texas, approved by the Mayor and City Council. All requirements and rules issued by the City Attorney of San Antonio, Texas, covering surety bonds on contracts in excess of \$50,000 shall be complied with fully.

All "lump sum" and unit prices must be stated in both script and figures. In acse of ambiguity or lack of clearness in stating prices in the proposals, the City reserves the right to adopt the most advantageous construction thereof, or to reject the proposal. Unreasonable (or unbalancec") unit prices will authorize the City Council to reject any proposal. Bidders are expected to inspect the site of the work, and to inform themselves regarding all local conditions.

The City reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

Proposal and contract forms, specifications and plans are on file at the office of the Consulting Engineers, Hawley & Freese, 303 Frost National Bldg. San Antonio, Texas, and 411 Capps Bldg., Fort Worth, Texas.

The "Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Contractor," as adopted by the City of San Antonio, Texas, will be substantially followed as to Form of Ahreement and as to General Con-ditions of Agreement.

Copies of plans, specifications, etc., may be secured from the above-mentioned office upon deposit of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, Forty-five (\$45.00) Dollars of which will be returned upon

submission of a bona fide proposal on the work, accompanied by the plans and specifications, or upon the return, intact, of plans and specifications prio to date for receiving proposals; otherwise the deposit will be retained.

All bidders will be required to file with the bid an equipment and experience questionnaire properly filled out on the forms provided.

AN ORDINANCE *-559*

Amending the Finance Ordinance of the City of San Antonio, passed and approved December 3, 1915.

BE IT ORDAINED that Second Paragraph of Section Sixteen of the Finance Ordinance of the City of San Antonio, passed and approved on the 3rd day of December 1915, be and the same is hereby Amended so as to hereafter read as follows:-

Section 16: And as a provision for such minor expenditures of the City as it may be necessary or proper to pay in cash without delay, the Commissioners shall make appropriation for a "General Incidentals Account", and the Mayor shall be authorized to draw his requisitions once each month for a sum not exceeding Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars against any moneys appropriated from General Incidentals Account, for "Cash for City Expenditures to be made by City Clerk"; and City warrant shall thereupon issue payable to the City Clerk for the amount of such requisition; and said City Clerk shall keep and expend each such sum for the use and benefit of the City for such small expenditures as may be authorized and directed by the Mayor or any Commissioner or for any such expenditures of incidental nature of which the City Clerk may

consider the City to be liable by the usual course of business; and for each such expenditure the City Clerk shall require and take a receipt signed by the payee showing the date, amount and purpose of such expenditure, and the department for which the same was made; and on or about the first of each month the City Clerk shall file with the License and Dues Collector a written report of such receipts and expenditures for the preceeding month, together with the signed receipts and other vouchers, if any, evidencing such payments; and shall at the same time pay into said License and Dues Office any amount remaining unexpended out of the amount received for the preceeding month; and the License and Dues Collector shall issue to said City Clerk proper receipt for the sum so refunded and shall thereupon promptly transmit such report and receipts to the Auditor.
