Commissioner Steffler, introduced the following resolution, which was on his motion adopted by unanimous vote.

RESOLUTION

ON PROTEST OF THE RE-LOCATION OF STATE HIGHWAY NO. 2.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That this Resolution manifests and expresses the official protest of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio to the re-location of State Highway No. 2, as shown by the proposed plan of the State Highway Department, wherein the Highway as re-located enters the City of San Antonio east of the town of South San Antonio and passes through New Penfield, Artesian Gardens and City View Addition, thence connecting with Nogalitos Street, thence into South Flores Street.

2. That the traffic conditions on South Flores Street are already over-crowded and the limit of traffic capacity has already been reached, and we are of the firm belief that additional traffic on South Flores Street coming from this Highway would create a traffic hazard. The Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, in the exercise of their best judgment, again recommend that this Highway be designated, coming through South San Antonio, at the Quintana Road, thence into the now Frio City Road and entering the City through South Brazos Street, or South Laredo Street on the west side of the Missouri Pacific Railroad. We believe that this will best serve the majority of citizens of San Antonio, this route being the natural entry to San Antonio from the southwest and because traffic conditions and grade crossings on this recommended route, present the safest and most favorable situation.

3. This Resolution is declared to be a permanent protest of the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio on behalf of its citizens as to the proposed re-location of Highway No. 2, by the Highway Department, and a certified copy is directed to be sent to the State Highway Commission and the County Commissioners of Bexar County.
