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tive, felt they had a right to City business for the small difference of \$138.00 per apparatus. He said some cities have given local concerns from three to five per cent concession so that the money would be kept in the city and he felt that this would be to the advantage of San Antonio. This, of course, would constitute a change in the policy, and he asked the Council to consider his request.

While sympathetic with the request, the Mayor informed Mr. Nunn that there would be a question of where to draw the line either on three per cent or ten per cent, and as long as they are calling for bids based on bid specifications, they must follow the practice of accepting the low qualified bid.

W. S. Dickey Manufacturing Company drew Number 34, and Southern Company drew Number 19, and was determined the successful bidder on the four items of clay pipe and stoppers.

The Mission Concrete Pipe Company drew Number 32, and Southern Company drew Number 22, and was determined to be the successful bidder on the concrete drain tile. These items were incorporated in the ordinance making a contract with the Southern Company.

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Planning Director Steve Taylor explained the annexation which consists of 54 lots, and which action was being taken on the request of the owners of the land.

On motion of Mr. Bremer, seconded by Mr. de la Garza, the ordinance was passed and approved for publication only by the following vote: AYES: McAllister, de la Garza, Jones, Kaufman, Cockrell, Gatti, Padilla, Parker and Bremer; NAYS: None; ABSENT: None.

The above ordinance will be read for the second time and considered for adoption on August 13, 1964.

Mr. Jacob Jennings and Mrs. J. L. Wood complained that many restaurants were refusing to serve Negroes, and were compiling a list of such places.

Also speaking for a Civil Rights Ordinance were Mr. G. J. Sutton and Mr. Frank McMillan of 1718 Richland Drive.

Mayor McAllister asked them to file with the City Clerk the list of the places con-

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cerned, dates and circumstances surrounding the incidents of which they complained.

The Mayor again reminded them that the Council would not consider the request until it had been briefed on the Federal Bill.

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After a short recess the meeting reconvened.

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A public hearing was held on the application of Joe Ortiz Funeral Home for a permit to operate an embalming room in connection with a funeral home at 421 North Leona Street.

Mrs. Joe Ortiz proposed to move her business to this location and explained the anticipated expenditure of approximately \$30,000 for remodeling with the dead room to be new construction.

No one spoke in opposition.

It was found that this location, as well as 209 North Leona, where her present business is established, are in Urban Renewal Project No. 3, Tex R-78, Rosa Verde, which is a rehabilitation and spot clearance urban renewal area.

Mrs. Ortiz was informed that further consideration of her application will be held in abeyance until it has received notification in writing from the Urban Renewal Agency that the location is not designated for demolition and that the proposed use conforms to the plan for this urban renewal project.

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The City Manager asked the Council to consider the issuance of Sewer Revenue Bonds in the amount of \$7,000,000 to enable the City to expedite the construction of three major items in the overall ten year Capital Improvement Program. The three projects that he said must be gotten under way are the completion of Leon Creek Outfall Line at an estimated cost of \$2,000,000; the Olmos Interceptor Line from the west of the downtown business section to Olmos Basin, at an estimated cost of \$2,500,000; and an addition to the Rilling Road Sewage Plant to increase its capacity to 94,000,000 gallons. In addition to these projects the City, on a month to month basis, participates with developers in the extension of lines to new subdivisions.
