MONDAY, APRIL 17th, A. D. 1916. 4. P. M.

Present: Honorable Clinton G. Brown, Mayor, presiding, and Commissioners Garland, Lambert, Kearny and Uhr.

Minutes of previous meeting were read and approved.

AN ORDINANCE **MA-833**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Commissioners of the City of San Antonio, that, the City of San Antonio does hereby accept the proposal of W.S.Conness, attached hereto, and offering to pay one half of the cost of the paving to be constructed on South Presa Street in front of Lot 29 C.B.3063, and that the sum of \$195.13 be and is hereby appropriated out of the Street paving Fund, to pay to Contractors upon completion of said paving, and acceptance thereof by the City.

This ordinance is hereby declared to be of urgent importance for reasons of public welfare apparent herefrom, and the same shall take effect at once.

Commissioner Kearny, reporting on the petition of F. C. Suchy complaining of the condition of a sewer constructed across his property by the City, recommended that the River Commissioner be instructed to drive the necessary piling in front of the sewer outlet as soon as funds are available. Adopted.

Commissioner Kearny recommended that culverts be constructed across Howard Street at Mistletoe Avenue and Magnolia Avenue, in accordance with petition of citizens complaining of the condition of drainage on Woodlawn Avenue. Adopted.

Commissioner Kearny recommended that the City Asphalt Plant be sold, as the City had no use for it. No action was taken upon his recommendation.

Commissioner Kearny introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted.
