Invocation by Commissioner Sam Bell Steves.

On a motion by Commissioner Tucker seconded by Commissioner Schmidt and carried by a roll call vote to-wit: Ayes, White, Tucker, Schmidt, Steves, Roper; Nays, none, the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with.

The petition of Ella Littlejohn and others for a sewer line in the 1500 block of Gibbs Street was read and referred to Commissioner of Streets and Public Improvements.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Norfolk:

That the services of Charles Adair Harrell as City Manager of the City of Norfolk, Virginia, merit the expression of gratitude and commendation of this Council. During his tenure of office the City of Norfolk has enjoyed a period of progress unrivaled in its history. Mr. Harrell's honesty and character have lent stature to the office he has held. The manner in which he has performed his duties and the sound judgment with which he has faced the many problems which have confronted him have at all times justified his position as a leader in his profession. The numerous physical improvements to this City, as well as the lasting effect of his foresight and skillful planning, will long remain. The Council of the City of Norfolk, for itself, and on behalf of its people, does express its deep appreciation for his able and loyal service and trusts that he will enjoy continued success in all that he may undertake.

Recommendations of Zoning Commission (1) Jackson Street, (2) French & Ashby - Breeden & No. Flores were read and referred to City Attorney for the purpose of drafting a resolution calling for a hearing.

An Ordinance was recommended to the City Council making a contract with Mission Driverless Company for auto service at the Municipal Airport.

After discussion of the bids offered by Col. Walter Gunstream, the Airport director, and Attorneys for two of the bidders it was voted to pass up any action at this time and bring the Ordinance up after consideration by the new Council.
