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Commissioner Davis called attention of the Commissioners to the possibilities if the Public Service (Gas & Electric) assets were sold at a figure around sixty millions of dollars. The Revenue bonds on these assets could be retired the entire debt of the City bonded and other, could be retired, the operations of the City could be placed on a cash basis and the properties returned to the tax rolls. He made no specific recommendations.

Commissioner South called attention to an article in the papers connecting San Antonio in a nation wide narcotic ring. He stated that the Police Department here has lead the country in it's fight against narcotics and vice, that the record had been praised by national organizations and that if there was any evidence at Washington or elsewhere of a narcotic ring here both he and the local Federal enforcement agencies would be glad to know about it since there has been no notice to either of such information.

After bids were opened for two buildings to be sold from the right of way purchased for the Interregional Highway it was resolved by unanimous vote to accept the bid of Joseph Marshall for \$914.00 for the two and the City Attorney was instructed to draw an Ordinance making a bill of sale. The Mayor was authorized and instructed to sign the Bill of Sale. The \$914.0 to be paid into the A-49 Fund.

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No bids being received on the Motor, Compressor and Blower for the Sewage disposal plant, Commissioner Knight moved that the City Clerk be instructed to re-advertise, bids to be opened June 22nd. The motion was unanimously carried.

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Hearing on recommendations of re-zoning of Rigsby Avenue and Clark Street, Commissioner Hein testified he had seen the property and definitely thinks it a traffic hazard now and would be worse if zoned for less set back. Heard also was Mrs. H.O. Wahrmond, and Mrs. Nell M. Moody. The recommendation was denied by the following vote: Ayes, Davis, Not voting (nay) White; Nays, Hein, Knight and South;
